FISCAL NOTE

SB 1811 - HB 2030

February 22, 2014

SUMMARY OF BILL: Prohibits a non-employee of a property owner from conducting labor union activities on private property.

Requires the Secretary of State to establish and maintain a no trespass public notice list to be published on the department's website, in a paper of general circulation twice a year for four weeks, and to all law enforcement agencies in the State.

Private employers must pay a recording fee to be included on the list.

Authorizes the Secretary of State to promulgate rules to effectuate the purposes of the proposed legislation.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Revenue – \$1,300/Recurring

Increase State Expenditures – \$1,300/Recurring

Assumptions:

- According to the Secretary of State, the proposed legislation will generate approximately \$1,320 in new revenue.
- According to the Secretary of State, the proposed legislation will increase expenditures by approximately \$1,320.
- According to the Department of Correction, the proposed legislation will not significantly increase the State's incarceration costs.
- The proposed legislation will not likely result in any new convictions. It is assumed that the courts, district attorneys, and public defenders can accommodate any impact within existing resources.
