FISCAL NOTE

SB 2121 - HB 2020

February 27, 2014

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases the fine for knowingly manufacturing, delivering, selling, or possessing with the intent to sell, deliver, or manufacture an imitation controlled substance from \$2,000-\$5,000 to \$3,000-\$6,000.

Increases the fine for intentionally smelling, inhaling, injecting, ingesting, or consuming an imitation controlled substance from \$250-\$2,500 to \$500-\$3,000.

Increases the fine for using or possessing an imitation controlled substance for the purpose of smelling, inhaling, injecting, ingesting, or consuming from \$250-\$2,500 to \$500-\$3,000.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

- Based on the Fiscal Review Committee's 2008 study of incarceration costs and fines, collection of fines for felony offenses is negligible. There will not be a significant increase in revenue as a result of the increased fines for these offenses.
