FISCAL NOTE

SB 2146 - HB 2190

February 3, 2014

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases the duration of the suspension of a license to serve alcoholic beverage for any firm found guilty of allowing the use or keeping on the premises an alcohol vaporizing device. Under current law, a first violation will result in a maximum 60-day suspension; and for second and subsequent violations the suspension will range between 30 and 90 days. Under the provisions of the bill, a first violation will result in a maximum 90-day suspension; and for second and subsequent violations the suspension will range between 120 and 180 days.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

- Based on responses by the Alcoholic Beverage Commission and the Department of Revenue, any decrease in state or local government revenue resulting from a longer period of license suspension is estimated to be not significant.
