**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 2366 - HB 2120**

March 17, 2014

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Creates a mandatory minimum sentence for observation without consent, a Class A misdemeanor, if the victim is a minor and the defendant is at least four years older than the victim. Creates a mandatory minimum sentence for unlawful photographing in violation of privacy, a Class A misdemeanor, if the victim is a minor and the defendant is at least four years older than the victim.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- The Administrative Office of the Courts has no record of any misdemeanor convictions for unlawful photographing in violation of privacy or observation without consent. It is assumed that the proposed legislation will not significantly impact local incarceration costs.
- The Department of Correction has no record of any admissions for felony unlawful photographing in violation of privacy. It is assumed that the proposed legislation will not significantly impact state incarceration costs.
