

SENATE BILL 2026

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 3;
Title 4; Title 8; Title 39; Title 47; Title 56 and Title
67, relative to online coupons.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1.

(a)

(1) By no later than July 1, 2016, the speaker of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the attorney general and reporter shall establish an advisory task force to review the sale of online coupons and recommend any necessary statutory revisions to the consumer protection and criminal laws that should be made to protect consumers when paying to obtain an online coupon.

(2) The task force shall consist of nine (9) members. The speaker of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the attorney general shall each appoint three (3) members.

(3) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the governor, the speaker of the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives by no later than January 1, 2017.

(b)

(1) The attorney general and reporter's office shall provide administrative support services to the task force created pursuant to this act.

(2) The members of the task force shall serve without compensation, but shall be eligible for reimbursement for travel expenses in accordance with the

provisions of the comprehensive travel regulations as promulgated by the department of finance and administration and approved by the attorney general and reporter.

(3) The task force shall cease to exist upon submission of the task force's report.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
