FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 1760 - HB 1929

February 24, 2016

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Grants immunity from civil liability for any member of the Tennessee National Guard who exercises self-defense as permitted in Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-11-611, including the discharge of a personally-owned firearm. Requires the Attorney General and Reporter's Office to represent and defend any guard member if all of the following apply: the member at the time of use of force is on duty or in uniform; the use of force includes the discharge of a personally-owned firearm for which a valid handgun carry permit is issued; the member is authorized by the Military Department to carry a personally-owned handgun while on-duty or in uniform.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (012819): Deletes and rewrites the bill such that the only substantive change is to establish that the member of the National Guard shall be immune from civil liability for any injury or damages caused to any person or any person's property while such member of the National Guard is using authorized force pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-11-611 or § 39-11-612.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

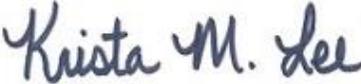
Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- This legislation will have no effect on the Tennessee Department of Military.
- The number of additional cases accepted by the Attorney General is assumed to be few, if any.
- According to the Attorney General and Reporter's Office, any increase in the workload of the Office can be completed utilizing existing staff during normal work hours.
