FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 1490 – HB 1641

February 29, 2016

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Adds to the list of individuals exempt from firing range and classroom training requirements for the purpose of obtaining a handgun carry permit any honorably discharged and retired veteran of the United States armed forces who produces a DD 214 form indicating a discharge or retirement date within five years of application for the permit and that presents documentation of the successful completion of all handgun training of not less than four hours as required by any branch of the United States armed forces.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (012208): Deletes and rewrites Section 1 of the bill such that the only substantive change is to specify that an active duty member of the military is required to present a military identification card or such other document as the commissioner designates as sufficient proof that the applicant is an active duty member of the military in order to be exempt from firing range and classroom training requirements.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

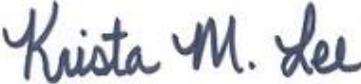
Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- According to the Department of Safety and Homeland Security (DOS), currently the department exempts anyone who within the last five years has completed four hours of training from any branch of the military.
- DOS will have to determine how to confirm the four-hour training requirement under the provisions of the amended bill; however, any impact to accomplish this provision or to verify a person is a member of the military is expected to be not significant.
