FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 2089 – SB 2277

March 30, 2016

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Creates a domestic violence registry within the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI). Those required to register are anyone convicted of: (1) domestic assault; (2) a violation of an order of protection or restraining order resulting from domestic assault; (3) aggravated assault, first degree murder, second degree murder, voluntary manslaughter, aggravated rape, rape, aggravated sexual battery, or sexual battery if committed against a domestic abuse victim; or (4) any conspiracy to, attempt to, or solicitation to commit any of the above offenses.

Requires court clerks to provide the necessary information to the TBI to maintain the registry.

Requires the TBI to remove someone from the registry if (1) ten years have elapsed since the most recent conviction, or (2) the person's records have been expunged.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

Increase State Expenditures – \$629,900/One-Time
\$132,900/Recurring

Increase Local Expenditures – Exceeds \$2,375,000/Recurring*

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (014930): Deletes all language after the enacting clause and rewrites the bill.

Authorizes the County Clerk of Shelby County to establish on its website a registry on which information about domestic violence offenders shall be posted.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- The bill as amended authorizes the County Clerk of Shelby County to establish a domestic violence registry on its website.

HB 2089 – SB 2277

- The County Clerk of Shelby County provided no information on the cost to update its website to house the registry. It is assumed that the bill as amended will not significantly increase local expenditures. However, if the bill as amended did increase local expenditures, any increase in expenditures would be permissive.
