FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 1707 – SB 1745

March 29, 2016

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Designates the day after Thanksgiving Day each year as Native American Heritage Day to encourage the people of Tennessee and interested groups and organizations to observe the day with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities relating to the historical status of Native American tribal governments, the present day status of Native Americans, the cultures, traditions, and languages of Native Americans, and the rich Native American cultural legacy.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (015171): Deletes the rewrites the directory language of the bill without making any substantive changes to the legislation.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- This day shall not be a legal holiday as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 15-1-101. Therefore, the fiscal impact to state or local government is estimated to be not significant.
