FISCAL NOTE

HB 584 - SB 761

April 1, 2015

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires local education agencies (LEAs) to develop a short day program for high school seniors who have completed all requirements for graduation except for three or fewer classes. Short day programs shall authorize eligible seniors to attend only those classes necessary for graduation. Seniors who are determined to be in need of remediation upon entering college will not be eligible to participate. Participating students shall continue to be counted as full-time students for the purposes of calculating each LEA's average daily membership (ADM). Before implementation of a short day program, LEAs shall submit their proposed program to the Department of Education for approval. Upon approval by the Department, the program shall be instituted in the 2016-2017 academic year and thereafter.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Participating seniors shall continue to be counted for the purposes of receiving BEP funding.
- Short-day programs will be set up by existing staff of LEAs and reviewed by existing staff of the Department of Education, respectively. No increase in state or local expenditures for additional personnel.
