FISCAL NOTE

HB 926 - SB 1126

March 15, 2015

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes the use of a photo identification card issued by the state of Tennessee, the United States, or an accredited postsecondary institution of education located in Tennessee for the purpose of verifying the identity of an eligible voter.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase Federal Expenditures - \$2,000/One-Time

Assumption:

- The Department of State (SOS) reports voter education will be required as a direct result of this bill.
- The department will need to reprint and redistribute voter education flyers to update voters on the changes that would be prompted by passage of this legislation.
- Based on the information provided by SOS, the one-time increase in expenditures necessary to effectuate this update is estimated to be \$2,000.
- SOS confirms that federal funding pursuant to the Help America Vote Act, section 261, can be obtained for this purpose. As a result, the one-time increase in federal expenditures is estimated to be \$2,000.
