FISCAL NOTE

HB 956 - SB 958

January 4, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases, from five to seven, the number of days that a minor, or a minor's parent or guardian, can request a written response identifying the reasons the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development refused to grant an exemption from child labor laws.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Based on information provided by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, any fiscal impact to the department is estimated to be not significant.
- The Commissioner will have 10 days to furnish the written statement; therefore, the provisions of the bill will not significantly alter departmental operations.
- Any fiscal impact to state government is estimated to be not significant.

IMPACT TO COMMERCE:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

- Increasing the number of days that a minor, or a minor's parents, have to request the specified information from the Commissioner is not anticipated to have a significant impact to commerce.
