FISCAL NOTE

HB 1485 - SB 1899

February 20, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires each pre-kindergarten program to meet the criteria for a “highly qualified pre-kindergarten program” as identified by the Department of Education. Requires local education agencies (LEAs) to include plans for coordination between voluntary pre-kindergarten classrooms and elementary schools within the LEA; a plan for engaging parents and families; a plan for delivering relevant and meaningful professional development to voluntary pre-kindergarten teachers; and for LEAs to utilize the pre-kindergarten growth portfolio approved by the State Board of Education.

Requires the Department of Education to approve a kindergarten entry screener that LEAs shall administer to all students entering kindergarten beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - \$1,000,000

Funding for this bill in the amount of \$1,000,000 is included in the Governor’s Recommended Budget for FY16-17 (page B-85).

Assumptions:

- Based on information from the Department of Education, the cost to develop and implement the early pre-kindergarten screening test is estimated to be \$1,000,000. This includes the cost for teacher training, facilitation, and administering the actual test.
- A recurring appropriation in the amount of \$1,000,000 is included in the Governor’s FY16-17 budget on page B-85.
