FISCAL NOTE

HB 1747 - SB 1729

January 30, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Enacts "Landon's Law" that prohibits law enforcement personnel from knowingly disclosing to the public information or law enforcement records concerning the use, or suspected use, of drugs or alcohol by a driver as a contributing factor in a motor vehicle accident unless: a test confirms the presence of drugs or alcohol and the law otherwise allows for such disclosure; disclosure is made to medical personnel for treatment or evidentiary purposes; or disclosure is made as part of any civil or criminal legal proceeding.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Prohibiting disclosure of certain information except in limited circumstances will not have a significant fiscal impact on state or local law enforcement.
- The Department of Safety confirms the provisions of the bill will not result in a significant fiscal impact.
