**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 2199 - SB 2577**

February 20, 2016

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Requires the arresting law enforcement agency to send fingerprints of offenders for vehicular impairment offense arrests to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) within seven days of arrest for submission to NCIC; and requires court clerks to send vehicular impairment convictions to TBI within five days of conviction.

Defines "vehicular impairment offense" to mean a person charged with: vehicular assault (Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-13-106); aggravated vehicular assault (Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-13-115); vehicular homicide (Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-13-213); aggravated vehicular homicide (Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-13-218); or driving under the influence (Tenn. Code Ann. § 55-10-401).

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- It is reasonably assumed that all arresting law enforcement agencies and court clerks can execute the provisions of the bill within existing resources.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Safety and the TBI, the bill's fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
