FISCAL NOTE

HB 2282 - SB 2476

March 10, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Prohibits a person from hunting on private lands within 100 yards of a dwelling without an owner's permission.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- It is anticipated the proposed legislation will reduce the total acreage where hunting is permitted in Tennessee under current law.
- The amount of reduction in available hunting land is unknown, but it is reasonably assumed the reduction will not result in a significant impact to the total number of hunting permits purchased annually.
- Any impact to the Wildlife Resources Fund is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code. Ann. § 70-4-108(c), a violation of this prohibition is considered a Class C misdemeanor offense.
- There will not be a sufficient number of prosecutions for state or local government to experience any significant increase in revenue or expenditures.
