FISCAL NOTE

HB 2412 - SB 2371

February 12, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes a parent of a newborn to object to the treatment of the infant's eyes with a prophylaxis to prevent ophthalmia neonatorum or infections leading to blindness. Deletes the current Class C misdemeanor offense for any physician, nurse, or midwife who fails to perform this treatment.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- According to the Department of Health, this legislation would align this newborn treatment to be consistent with other newborn treatments which have opt-out provisions.
- There will not be a sufficient decrease in the number of prosecutions for state or local government to experience any significant decrease in revenue or expenditures.
