FISCAL NOTE

SB 832 - HB 1160

March 20, 2015

SUMMARY OF BILL: Establishes that the defense to prosecution for criminal trespass that the person believed entry was permitted, the person's conduct did not substantially interfere with the owner's use of the property, and the person promptly left when asked, is not available to a person charged with trespass in a licensed retail package store.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Criminal trespass is a Class C misdemeanor.
- There will not be a sufficient number of Class C misdemeanor prosecutions for state or local government to experience any significant increase in revenue or expenditures.
