FISCAL NOTE

SB 1096 - HB 1131

March 17, 2015

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes counties to ban the application of biosolids and bulk biosolids generated during the treatment of domestic sewage in a waste water treatment works on all land located within county boundaries. Requires approval by a majority of qualified county voters by referendum.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Based on all information provided by the Department of Environment and Conservation, the impact of this bill to state government is estimated to be not significant.
- Given county voters would be required to pass by referendum any ban, any impact to local government is considered permissive.
- County referendums will be held to coincide with general elections.
- Based on information provided by the County Technical Assistance Service, the fiscal impact on local government is estimated to be not significant given the majority of any referendums will be conducted during a general election.
