FISCAL NOTE

SB 1432 - HB 1409

March 12, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Prohibits a handgun carry permit holder from carrying a firearm when entering a public park, if a ticket or pass is required for entry to an event and the park is owned or operated by a county or municipality, an instrumentality, or a company contracting with the government to conduct the event. Mandates that the restriction shall remain in effect for as long as a ticket or pass is required to enter or remain in the park, or until the end of the event occurring within the park. Prohibits firearms in arenas, stadiums, and structures where a professional sports team plays, practices, or trains. Defines professional sports team for such purpose.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The Department of Environment and Conservation confirms the bill will only affect local government owned parks and private businesses, thus not impacting the state fiscally.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Safety, the bill's fiscal impact is considered to be not significant.
- Local government technical assistance services confirm the bill will have no impact on local government revenue and expenditures.
- Based on information provided by the Tennessee Municipal League (TML), the provisions of the bill will not affect insurance rates or policies owned by local governments.
