FISCAL NOTE

SB 1607 - HB 2042

February 4, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Excludes individuals using personal funds to pay for communication, who are not a candidate for public office, employees or volunteers for any candidate for public office, employees or volunteers for any political campaign committee, or employees or volunteers of any political party, from disclosure requirements on political communications, advertising, and solicitations, when the communication was made or within six months prior to the communication being made.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Excluding individuals from disclosure requirements pursuant to the provisions of the bill will not have any significant impact on current citations issued for violations of improper disclosures for political communications, advertising, and solicitations.
- Any impact to state or local government is estimated to be not significant.
- The Secretary of State confirms any fiscal impact to the Department of State is considered not significant.
