FISCAL NOTE

SB 2015 - HB 2583

March 3, 2016

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases, from 30 to 60, the number of days a person has to petition for review of a civil penalty assessed under the Prevention of Youth Access to Tobacco and Vapor Products Act.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed bill would delay enforcement actions due to the allowance of an extended time of 30 days for an alleged offender to file a petition requesting a review of the penalty assessment.
- However, any impact on civil penalty collections is estimated to be not significant.

IMPACT TO COMMERCE:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

- Providing an additional 30 days for an alleged offender to file a petition requesting a review of the penalty assessment will not have a significant impact on commerce or jobs in Tennessee.
