

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 542

A RESOLUTION to confirm the appointment of Karen King of Cannon County to the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201, provides for the creation of the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(a)(1)(C), provides that the Governor shall appoint one member from each grand division of the State to the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(b)(1)(C), provides that one member from each grand division of the State be a school principal; and

WHEREAS, Governor Bill Haslam acting pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(a)(1)(C), has appointed Karen King of Cannon County as a member representing the Middle Tennessee Division on the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission for a term that commenced January 18, 2018, and expires December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Karen King is serving in her tenth year as a principal in the Cannon County school system; she has assisted the Department of Education by coaching leadership classes for several years, and she served as the statewide chair for the Tennessee Principal Study Council from 2015 to 2017; and

WHEREAS, in the 2011-2012 school year, Mrs. King led her school to Reward status in both achievement and growth, and she was one of nine regional finalists for the 2013 Tennessee Principal of the Year award; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 49-6-2201(d)(1), provides that each member, prior to beginning a term of office, shall be confirmed by joint resolution of the General Assembly; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED TENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we hereby confirm the appointment of Karen King to the State Textbook and Instructional Materials Quality Commission for a term that commenced January 18, 2018, and expires December 31, 2020.
