HB 429 - SB 1296

February 22, 2017

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes voters to utilize a mobile electronic device for recording, taking photographs, or videos of the voter's marked ballot. Authorizes election officials to prohibit disruptive activity that threatens the orderly process of voting or privacy of another voter's ballot.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures – \$800/One-Time

Assumptions:

- Under current law, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-7-142, voters are prohibited from using mobile communication devices at a polling place for telephone conversations, recording, or taking photographs or videos while inside the polling place.
- The proposed language would authorize an election official to prohibit the use of mobile electronic devices during instances where a voter was being disruptive or photographing another voter's ballot.
- According to the Department of State, posters detailing the permissible use of mobile devices at the polling places are distributed to each county for display. Passage of this bill will require printing of new posters to identify the new permissible uses of mobile devices and distribution of such new posters to the counties. The one-time increase in state expenditures for reprinting posters and distribution is estimated to be \$750.
