SUMMARY OF BILL: Creates a special joint committee to study issues related to permitting casino gambling in Tennessee. Requires the special joint committee to report findings and recommendations to the 110th General Assembly no later than January 1, 2018, at which time the committee will cease to exist.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures - \$4,100/One-Time

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to the second resolving clause of the resolution, the special joint committee shall consist of three members from the House of Representatives and three members from the Senate appointed by the respective Speakers.
- Based on information provided by the Office of Legislative Administration, each member of the special joint committee will receive a daily \$220 per diem and travel reimbursement of \$0.47 per mile travelled for an estimated average of 262 miles roundtrip.
- It is estimated that the special joint committee will require two separate one-day meetings after the conclusion of the 2017 legislative session and before the beginning of the 2018 legislative session.
- The total one-time increase in state expenditures occurring in FY17-18 is estimated to be \$4,118 [(\$220 x 6 members x 2 meetings) + (\$0.47 x 262 miles x 6 members x 2 roundtrips)].
- Any cost associated with reporting findings and recommendations to the 110th General Assembly is estimated to be not significant.
