**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 448 - HB 1090**

February 14, 2017

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Establishes that any member of the Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners who misses more than 50 percent of all scheduled meetings in a calendar year shall be removed as a board member.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Based on information provided by the Department of Health, it is estimated that the Board can enforce the requirements of the proposed legislation within existing resources without an increased appropriation or reduced reversion.
- This bill will not change the number of Board members or significantly impact attendance of such members. As a result, any impact on the Board's expenditures is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all health related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners had an annual surplus of \$45,010 in FY14-15, an annual surplus of \$50,474 in FY15-16, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$292,363 on June 30, 2016.
