SB 1153 - HB 1406

March 7, 2017

SUMMARY OF BILL: Repeals Tenn. Code Ann. § 68-3-306 relative to artificial insemination for the purpose of the Vital Records Act of 1977.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-3-306 states, “A child born to a married woman as a result of artificial insemination, with consent of the married woman's husband, is deemed to be the legitimate child of the husband and wife.”
- The proposed legislation repeals the statute.
- Title 68, chapter 3, part 3 governs various matters surrounding the issuance and content of birth certificates. Birth certificates must be filed with the Office of Vital Records within the Department of Health (DOH).
- The DOH reports that the proposed legislation will not significantly impact its operations.
- The Bureau of TennCare and the Department of Children’s Services report that the proposed legislation will not significantly impact their operations.
- The proposed legislation will not significantly impact state operations.
