- 1. [SB 0598](#) \*Massey, Johnson (HB 0850 by \*Sexton C, Staples, Daniel, Coley, Farmer)**  
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates any facility on the campus of a public institution of higher education that is designed and used for school-sanctioned sporting events as a sports authority facility for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Title 57.
  
- 2. [SB 0029](#) \*Haile, Bowling, Bailey (HB 0384 by \*Weaver)**  
Insurance, Health, Accident- As introduced, extends compensation for death of emergency responders to emergency medical technicians and paramedics; authorizes local governments to continue to provide health insurance to the surviving spouse and children of an emergency medical technician or paramedic killed in the line of duty. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 51, Part 2 and Title 8, Chapter 27.
  
- 3. [SB 0633](#) \*Watson (HB 1022 by \*Lynn)**  
Pensions and Retirement Benefits- As introduced, prohibits a current early service retiree from changing to disability retirement; makes other revisions to provisions governing the Tennessee consolidated retirement system. - Amends TCA Section 8-25-204; Section 8-25-205; Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.

1. [SB 0787](#) \***Johnson** (HB 0931 by \*Lamberth, Gant)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, delays effective date of certain streamlined sales tax provisions until July 1, 2021. - Amends TCA Title 67; Chapter 72 of the Public Acts of 2011; Chapter 193 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 273 of the Public Acts of 2015; Chapter 480 of the Public Acts of 2013; Chapter 530 of the Public Acts of 2009 and Chapter 602 of the Public Acts of 2007.
2. [SB 1460](#) \***Bailey** (HB 0634 by \*Halford, Hill T)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts water furnished by a utility district and used exclusively in a farming operation from sales and use tax. - Amends TCA Title 67.
3. [SB 0040](#) \***Massey** (HB 0049 by \*Zachary)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts from the sales and use tax all tangible personal property or services sold to a K-12 school or school support group during the first five temporary sales periods of a calendar year. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
4. [SB 1158](#) \***Jackson** (HB 1007 by \*Carr)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, reduces, from 29.0141 percent to 28.5262 percent, the share of state sales and use tax revenue deposited to the state general fund; increases, from 4.6030 percent to 5.0909 percent, the share appropriated to municipalities. - Amends TCA Section 67-6-103.

5. [SB 1137](#) \*Swann (HB 0779 by \*Ramsey)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, increases, from \$100,000 to \$200,000, the maximum amount of annual sales that charitable entities whose primary purpose is fundraising in support of a city, county, or metropolitan library system may make to be excluded from the definition of "business" for sales tax purposes; authorizes such entities to make sales during temporary sales periods that occur no more than four times per calendar year. - Amends TCA Section 67-6-102.
  
6. [SB 0648](#) \*Kurita (HB 0690 by \*Hodges, Johnson C)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, allocates a portion of sales and use tax revenue to certain counties in which a new event center is to be constructed. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
  
7. [SB 0276](#) \*Kurita (HB 0237 by \*Kumar)  
Revenue, Dept. of- As introduced, requires department to conduct a study by January 1, 2020, on how much sales tax is estimated to be collected if remote sellers are required to collect sales tax in this state. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4 and Title 67, Chapter 6.
  
8. [SB 0082](#) \*Kurita (HB 0733 by \*Johnson C)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, requires certain out-of-state sellers to collect and remit state and local sales tax to the department of revenue; allocates portion of local sales tax from such sales to the county or city or town in which the purchaser resides. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 32 and Title 67, Chapter 6.
  
9. [SB 0253](#) \*Kyle, Crowe (HB 0246 by \*Clemmons)  
Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, phases out the professional privilege tax over a four-year period for tax years that begin on and after June 1, 2019. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 17.
  
10. [SB 0457](#) \*Stevens, Niceley, Southerland (HB 0992 by \*Gant, Holt, Hulsey, Eldridge, Leatherwood, Sexton C, Lamberth, Travis, Lafferty, Zachary, Carter)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts certain sales of gold, silver, platinum, and palladium coins and bullion from the sales and use tax. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
  
11. [SB 0713](#) \*Stevens, Crowe (HB 1271 by \*Holt, Shaw, Hill T)  
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, exempts from sales and use tax the sale of agricultural trailers and agricultural vehicles. - Amends TCA Title 55 and Title 67.

- 12. [SB 0925](#) \*Watson** (HB 0899 by \*Sparks, DeBerry, Tillis, Hurt, Terry, Chism, Weaver, Moon, Crawford)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, expands the exemption from sales tax on periodicals distributed twice monthly or on a biweekly or more frequent basis to periodicals distributed no less frequently than monthly. - Amends TCA Title 67.
- 13. [SB 0315](#) \*Watson, Kelsey** (HB 0338 by \*Reedy, Todd)  
Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, decreases the professional privilege tax from \$400 annually to \$300 annually for tax years that end on or after May 31, 2022; repeals tax for tax years ending on or after May 31, 2025. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 17.
- 14. [SB 0485](#) \*Gardenhire** (HB 0805 by \*Haston)  
Taxes- As introduced, clarifies that the definition of "sport and recreational equipment" for purposes of sales and use tax includes equipment used for electronic sports or esports. - Amends TCA Title 67.
- 15. [SB 1330](#) \*Gardenhire** (HB 1452 by \*Smith)  
Taxes, Amusement- As introduced, removes amusement tax on dues or fees to membership sports and recreation clubs. - Amends TCA Section 67-6-212 and Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 3.
- 16. [SB 0423](#) \*Hensley** (HB 0494 by \*Doggett, Griffey, Holt, Hill M, Hall, Gant, Hill T, Sexton C)  
Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, eliminates the special privilege tax on ammunition. - Amends TCA Section 8-8-201 and Title 70, Chapter 3.
- 17. [SB 0421](#) \*Hensley, Crowe** (HB 0417 by \*Zachary)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts, over a period of three fiscal years, the sales price of tickets for admission to an intercollegiate athletic event hosted by a college or university from the amusement sales tax. - Amends TCA Title 67.
- 18. [SB 1505](#) \*Hensley** (HB 1379 by \*Zachary)  
Taxes, Amusement- As introduced, allocates all amusement tax revenue generated from an event hosted by a college or university to the college or university to be used exclusively for repairs, maintenance, renovation, enhancements, or debt service on facilities funded with approval of the state school bond authority. - Amends TCA Title 67.

- 1. [SB 0642](#) \*Johnson** (HB 0684 by \*Lamberth)  
Tourist Development, Dept. of- As introduced, increases the size of the Tennessee sports hall of fame board of directors from 25 members to 26 members by increasing from eight to nine the number of gubernatorial appointees; increases from eight to nine the maximum number of members from one grand division; administratively attaches the board to the department. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29, Part 2; Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 22 and Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 54.
- 2. [SB 0557](#) \*Johnson** (HB 1089 by \*Whitson)  
Annexation- As introduced, specifies that all property owners, rather than just residents, of a territory proposed for annexation may vote in the referendum on the question of annexation. - Amends TCA Title 6, Chapter 51, Part 1.

**3. [SB 0624](#) \*Watson, Dickerson, Reeves, White, Yager** (HB 0551 by \*Hazlewood, Hill T, Marsh, Lynn, Holt, Wright, Carr, DeBerry, Camper, Powell, Shaw, Beck, Ramsey, Love, Staples, Littleton, Tillis)

Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA)- As introduced, enacts the "Facilitating Business Rapid Response to State Declared Disaster Act." - Amends TCA Title 58; Title 62; Title 67 and Title 68.

**4. [SB 0431](#) \*Bell** (HB 1021 by \*Lynn)

County Government- As introduced, extends from 90 to 120 days the period by which a county legislative body must file a revised county district boundary map with the county clerk, secretary of state, and comptroller of the treasury. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 13; Title 53; Title 62; Title 67 and Title 68.

**5. [SB 1414](#) \*Bell** (HB 1281 by \*Hill T)

Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, permits the utility management review board to authorize the voluntary sale of all or part of the assets of a utility district to a public utility if certain conditions are met. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 7 and Section 65-4-101.

**6. [SB 1346](#) \*Massey** (HB 1107 by \*Powell, Jernigan)

Public Records- As introduced, requires that personally identifying information contained in motor vehicle accident reports be treated as confidential information and restricted from public disclosure. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 5; Title 38; Title 40 and Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 1.

**7. [SB 1481](#) \*Bailey** (HB 0713 by \*Holt, Whitson)

Holidays and Days of Special Observance- As introduced, designates the fourth Saturday of July each year as the "Day of the Cowboy and Cowgirl in Tennessee." - Amends TCA Title 15, Chapter 2.

**8. [SB 0407](#) \*Stevens** (HB 0404 by \*Hurt)

Taxes, Real Property- As introduced, specifies that the comptroller of the treasury is the assessing authority for telecommunications tower properties that are owned by a public utility company. - Amends TCA Section 67-5-514.

**9. [SB 0408](#) \*Stevens** (HB 0280 by \*Cepicky)

Taxes, Ad Valorem- As introduced, authorizes property tax exemption for certain nonprofit entities that occupy and use real property owned by another tax-exempt institution; makes other related revisions. - Amends TCA Section 67-5-207 and Section 67-5-212.

- 10. [SB 0238](#) \*Lundberg** (HB 0099 by \*Tillis, Ogles)  
Comptroller, State- As introduced, authorizes the comptroller to investigate Class A and B felonies related to private funds if there is a request by the attorney general and reporter or the district attorney general, the investigation is in conjunction with an open investigation by the Tennessee bureau of investigation, and an investigation would be in the public interest. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 4.
- 11. [SB 0308](#) \*Lundberg** (HB 0377 by \*Boyd, Marsh, Moon, Hill T)  
Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, requires utilities participating in utility bill round-up programs to provide notice to customers of program and customer rights no later than November 1, 2019; permits utilities to enroll new customers after January 1, 2020, only upon receipt of customer consent; requires utilities to remove customer from program upon receiving opt out notice. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 45; Title 47, Chapter 18 and Title 65.
- 12. [SB 1122](#) \*Lundberg** (HB 1312 by \*Crawford)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, allows municipality with a border region retail tourism development district that elects to remove property from the district to include adjacent property with an equal or lesser amount of acreage by resolution of the municipality. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 40.
- 13. [SJR 0113](#) \*Lundberg**  
General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position- Requests State Capitol Commission to initiate creation and placement in State Capitol of bust to honor Admiral William Porter Lawrence. -
- 14. [SB 0582](#) \*Lundberg** (HB 1006 by \*Hawk)  
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, lowers the amount of revenue required from the sale of artwork from 90 percent to 80 percent in order for an art gallery that does not sell food or beverages to serve wine to patrons. - Amends TCA Title 57.
- 15. [SB 0933](#) \*Lundberg** (HB 1279 by \*Staples)  
Alcoholic Beverage Commission- As introduced, prohibits commission from selling at a public auction contraband alcoholic beverages that appear to be in damaged or unsealed containers. - Amends TCA Title 57.
- 16. [SB 0567](#) \*Bowling** (HB 0630 by \*Bricken)  
Taxes, Hotel Motel- As enacted, authorizes Coffee County to levy a privilege tax of up to 5 percent upon the privilege of occupancy by a two-thirds vote of its governing body. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

- 17. [SB 0984](#) \*Gilmore** (HB 1436 by \*Stewart, Clemmons)  
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates the Third Coast Comedy Club in Nashville as a community theater for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-102.
- 18. [SJR 0213](#) \*Yager**  
General Assembly, Directed Studies- Encourages the Department of Agriculture and representatives of vineyard owners and the retail wine industry in Tennessee to discuss the formation of a statewide wine trail. -
- 19. [SB 1360](#) \*Yager** (HB 1292 by \*Farmer)  
Correctional Programs- As introduced, removes administrative attachment of the Tennessee corrections institute to the department of commerce and insurance; replaces the commissioner of commerce and insurance as the appointing authority for the executive director of the board of control of the institute, making the board of control the new appointing authority. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 41, Chapter 7.
- 20. [SB 1363](#) \*Yager** (HB 1357 by \*Calfee)  
Metropolitan Government- As introduced, defines the county seat, if the county seat is an incorporated municipality, as the principal city for purposes of county and city consolidation, if the largest city by population in the county fails to adopt a consolidation resolution within 90 days of the county's adoption of a consolidation resolution. - Amends TCA Title 7.
- 21. [SB 1366](#) \*Yager** (HB 0603 by \*Marsh, White )  
Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, allows certain utilities to enter into agreements to provide certain coverage, insurance, or service agreements to customers; allows certain utilities to assist customers in installing or maintaining certain equipment; authorizes the costs for the coverage, insurance, service agreements, and equipment installation and maintenance to be added to customer bills or statements. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 34; Title 7, Chapter 36; Title 7, Chapter 52, Part 1 and Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 3.
- 22. [SB 1190](#) \*White** (HB 0295 by \*Carr, Farmer)  
Codes- As introduced, beginning January 1, 2020, requires electrical inspectors employed by a municipality, a county, or this state to be certified by the state fire marshal; establishes a recertification process for such electrical inspectors every three years; requires certain electrical inspectors under contract with the commissioner of commerce and insurance to be certified on and after January 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 68.

- 23. [SB 0394](#) \*Jackson** (HB 0391 by \*Garrett)  
County Government- As introduced, exempts the sheriff of a county from certain bond requirements if the county carries an insurance policy that provides government crime coverage, employee dishonesty coverage, or equivalent coverage. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 1; Title 8, Chapter 19 and Title 8, Chapter 8.
- 24. [SB 0249](#) \*Jackson** (HB 0229 by \*Bricken, Crawford, Tillis, Whitson, Todd, Gant)  
Registers of Deeds- As introduced, over a three-year period, deletes requirement that 52 percent of the 5 percent commission retained by county registers for collecting and reporting recordation tax must be remitted to state treasurer and credited to state general fund. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-409.
- 25. [SB 0196](#) \*Kelsey** (HB 0261 by \*Daniel)  
State Government- As introduced, makes various changes to the Right to Earn a Living Act, including requiring entry regulations, public service restrictions, and statutes to be demonstrably necessary and carefully tailored to fulfill a legitimate public health or safety objective, and allowing persons to petition applicable licensing authorities and bring civil actions when such standard is not met. - Amends TCA Title 1; Title 4; Title 7; Title 38; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 67.
- 26. [SB 0397](#) \*Kelsey** (HB 1289 by \*Farmer)  
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, decreases the time period a manufacturer may have license revoked from not less than one year to not greater than one year for violating the Tennessee Whiskey labeling and advertising requirements. - Amends TCA Title 57.
- 27. [SB 1009](#) \*Kelsey** (HB 1278 by \*Holt)  
General Assembly- As introduced, clarifies that members of the general assembly are not subject to the requirement that a dual service agreement be entered into when being paid a salary for serving as a member of the general assembly pursuant to Article II, Section 23 of the Tennessee Constitution. - Amends TCA Title 1; Title 2; Title 3; Title 4; Title 8 and Title 10.
- 28. [SB 0379](#) \*Yarbro** (HB 0108 by \*Jernigan)  
Employees, Employers- As introduced, authorizes an attorney for a county, municipal, or metropolitan government to seek an injunction against a person who harasses an employee of the county, municipal, or metropolitan government, or any agency thereof. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 49 and Title 50.

- 29. [SB 0759](#) \*Yarbro** (HB 0252 by \*Freeman)  
State Government- As introduced, requires an agency that requires an examination to be administered to a person applying for a license to engage in an occupation, trade, or profession to provide reasonable accommodations to a person diagnosed with dyslexia. - Amends TCA Title 4.
- 30. [SB 0769](#) \*Yarbro** (HB 1313 by \*Windle)  
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, authorizes state treasurer to make deposits to facilitate the bank local community deposit program. - Amends TCA Title 9 and Title 45.
- 31. [SB 0355](#) \*Gardenhire** (HB 0327 by \*Howell)  
Industrial Development- As introduced, requires brownfield redevelopment projects to be sites located in mid-size and small counties; clarifies square footage qualifications for a project to include all facilities taken together; prohibits allocations to the corporation engaged in the project continuing past maturity of the original bond or obligation, which can be no longer than 30 years. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 53.
- 32. [SB 0366](#) \*Gardenhire** (HB 0425 by \*Hakeem)  
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, extends the deadline, from October 1 to December 1 each year, for a lessee or sublessee of a health, educational, and housing facility corporation to file a report listing leased properties and details of the lease and payment in lieu of tax (PILOT) agreements. - Amends TCA Title 13, Chapter 23 and Title 48, Chapter 101, Part 3.
- 33. [SB 1235](#) \*Gardenhire** (HB 1233 by \*Casada)  
Fiscal Review Committee- As introduced, clarifies the appropriate house committee bills for which fiscal review is required to do an impact to commerce statement. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 12.
- 34. [SB 0350](#) \*Briggs** (HB 0102 by \*Hulsey)  
Taxes, Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, extends by one year the manner in which liquor-by-the-drink tax proceeds are distributed to local political subdivisions. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 9; Title 49; Title 57 and Title 67.
- 35. [SB 0531](#) \*Briggs** (HB 0609 by \*Littleton)  
Registers of Deeds- As introduced, allows a register of deeds to store local government records, in addition to storage in the register's office, in a suitable facility; defines suitable facility as one that will secure records against theft and natural disasters. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 13, Part 1.

- 36. [SB 0393](#) \*Dickerson, Johnson** (HB 0051 by \*Whitson)  
Taxes, Real Property- As introduced, decreases the frequency that banks that collect property taxes must provide evidence of such payments to the trustee, from daily to at least every three business days; deletes an obsolete code section; deletes outdated references to penalties that are no longer applied. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.
- 37. [SB 1094](#) \*Dickerson** (HB 0907 by \*Freeman)  
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, extends the period, from six months to one year, that a county or city that held an election on a resolution or ordinance levying a local option sales and use tax that was rejected is prohibited from holding another election on such tax. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
