[HB 1171](#) by *Weaver (SB 1416 by *Pody)

Tennessee Fish & Wildlife Commission - As introduced, removes authority of commission to promulgate rules regulating the commercial lease or rental of non-motorized vessels for non-commercial use by the public on waters of the state. - Amends TCA Title 69 and Title 70.

[HB 1178](#) by *Weaver (SB 0304 by *Niceley)

Livestock - As introduced, prohibits misrepresenting a product as meat or poultry that is not removed from the carcass of slaughtered livestock or poultry. - Amends TCA Title 44; Title 53 and Title 68.

[HB 0231](#) by *Crawford (SB 0223 by *Lundberg)

Municipal Government - As introduced, enacts "Ben's Law," which authorizes municipalities to regulate the use of baited traps within their territorial jurisdictions. - Amends TCA Title 6; Title 7 and Title 70.

[HB 0540](#) by *Crawford (SB 0857 by *Crowe)

Boats, Boating - As introduced, changes the date by which persons who sell certificates of number for boats must remit revenue to the Tennessee fish and wildlife commission from the 10th day after the first of the month to the 14th day after the first of the month. - Amends TCA Title 69, Chapter 9.

[HB 1129](#) by *Hazlewood (SB 1123 by *Briggs)

Public Health - As introduced, changes from December 31 to December 15 the annual date by which the departments of health and human services must jointly provide to the appropriate committees of the senate and the house of representatives a written list of available state and federal options under medicaid and temporary assistance for needy families. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 39; Title 43; Title 44; Title 53; Title 67 and Title 68.

HB 0954 by *Carr (SB 1454 by *Bailey)

Business and Commerce - As introduced, clarifies that maintenance of equine professional limitation of liability warning notice signs includes periodic removal of dirt, vegetation, and other debris that may reduce the legibility of the sign. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 9; Title 39; Title 43; Title 44; Title 62 and Title 67.

HB 0914 by *Keisling (SB 1367 by *Yager)

Solid Waste Disposal - As introduced, changes the due date for municipal solid waste regions to submit their annual progress reports to the commissioner of environment and conservation from March 31 to April 1. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7 and Title 68.

HB 1328 by *Keisling, Byrd, Tillis (SB 0665 by *Haile)

Boats, Boating - As introduced, limits operating permit fee for commercial non-motorized vessel outfitters to the amount of the fee imposed on commercial fishermen; authorizes implementation of parking pass system for outfitters; imposes limitation on fees assessed such outfitters. - Amends TCA Title 69, Chapter 9 and Title 70.

HB 1298 by *Holsclaw (SB 0372 by *Swann)

Recreational Areas - As introduced, establishes minimum attendance requirement for members of the Ocoee River recreation and economic development fund board and requires removal of members who do not meet the requirement. - Amends TCA Title 11, Chapter 13; Title 11, Chapter 8; Title 69, Chapter 9, Part 2 and Title 70, Chapter 7.

HB 1468 by *Hurt, Miller (SB 0888 by *Niceley)

Agriculture - As introduced, authorizes the department of agriculture to provide notice of registered landrace varieties of hemp to licensed growers and processors via the department's website. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4; Title 43; Title 44, Chapter 6; Title 47, Chapter 26; Title 53; Title 67 and Title 68.

HB 0815 by *Holt (SB 0618 by *Hensley)

Fairs - As introduced, increases, from two to three, the number of consecutive terms the chair of the state fair and exposition may serve. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 57.

HB 0219 by *Hulsey (SB 0923 by *Southerland)

Solid Waste Disposal - As introduced, excludes gasification and pyrolysis from the definition of "solid waste processing" for purposes of the Tennessee Solid Waste Disposal Act. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 211.

HB 0845 by *Todd (SB 0811 by *Jackson)

Water Pollution - As introduced, requires state to assume regulatory oversight relative to effluents during periods in which the federal government does not have adequate funds to exercise such responsibilities. - Amends TCA Title 68 and Title 69.

HB 1256 by *Halford (SB 1358 by *Yager)

Conservation - As introduced, requires the executive director of the wildlife resources agency to issue an annual report concerning acquisition priorities for wetland and bottomland hardwood forest acquisition. - Amends TCA Section 11-14-401.

[HB 0917](#) by *Keisling, Littleton (SB 1359 by *Yager, Bowling)

Child Abuse - As introduced, creates the Class A misdemeanor and Class E felony offenses of withdrawing, transferring, or altering a child's school enrollment with intent to hinder an active child abuse or child neglect investigation. - Amends TCA Title 37; Title 39 and Title 49.

[HB 0516](#) by *Hill T (SB 0862 by *Crowe)

Domestic Violence - As introduced, imposes a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$2,500 for a violation of an order of protection; directs that fine be distributed annually to the Isaiah House 117 or the Court Appointed Special Advocates Association (CASA). - Amends TCA Title 39.

[HB 0676](#) by *Garrett (SB 0699 by *Stevens)

Trusts - As introduced, enacts the "Tennessee Disclaimer of Property Interests Act." - Amends TCA Title 31; Title 34; Title 35 and Title 45.

[HB 0674](#) by *Garrett, Whitson (SB 0326 by *Johnson)

Children - As introduced, revises various provisions related to stepparent visitation. - Amends TCA Title 36.

[HB 0675](#) by *Garrett (SB 0542 by *Gardenhire)

Trusts - As introduced, allows a revocable living trust that becomes irrevocable upon the death of the settlor to refer to a written statement of personal property not otherwise disposed of by the revocable trust; gives a trustee who has resigned or been removed the right and authority to petition the court for a release and discharge from all liability related to the trust, makes various other revisions. - Amends TCA Title 30; Title 31; Title 32; Title 34; Title 35 and Title 67.

HB 1055 by *Hall (SB 1411 by *Bell)

District Attorneys - As introduced, limits the term of a contract a district attorney general may enter into to provide child support enforcement services, to no more than four years; requires the district attorney general to provide notice, by July 1, 2020, and every four years thereafter, of whether the district attorney general has contracted with another agency to provide such services. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 7; Title 36, Chapter 5 and Title 71, Chapter 3.

HB 0004 by *Staples (SB 0011 by *Briggs)

Children - As introduced, establishes a pilot program for three years to provide child care payments to eligible relative caregivers; requires the department of children's services to publish an annual report containing certain data about the pilot program. - Amends TCA Title 37 and Title 71.

HB 1035 by *Shaw (SB 0954 by *Yarbro)

Civil Procedure - As introduced, extends the statute of limitations for civil actions based on child sexual abuse from three years from the time of discovery of the abuse by the injured person to five years from discovery of the abuse. - Amends TCA Title 28, Chapter 3 and Title 40.

HB 1426 by *Shaw, Faison, Coley, White (SB 1404 by *Bell, Lundberg)

Child Custody and Support - As introduced, states that a parent not in possession of a child is entitled to video chat with the child as part of the right to unimpeded telephone conversations if the technology is available to both the parent and the child; states that a parent is not required to purchase any device in order to allow the other parent to video chat with the child. - Amends TCA Title 36, Chapter 6.

HB 1480 by *Hardaway (SB 1317 by *Kyle)

Child Custody and Support - As introduced, changes from five days to one business day, the timeframe by which the department of human services must send notice of an administrative order of seizure or sale of assets to the child support obligor. - Amends TCA Title 36, Chapter 5.

HB 0988 by *Lamar (SB 0949 by *Kyle)

Children's Services, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to provide weekly mental health counseling to each child in a detention or shelter care facility; requires mental health providers to be licensed and consider the findings and recommendations of any validated risk and needs assessment or individualized case plan relevant to the child. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 33; Title 37; Title 56; Title 63; Title 71 and Chapter 1052 of the Public Acts of 2018.

[HB 1423](#) by *Towns, Camper, Thompson, Chism, Cooper, Lamar, Sanderson, DeBerry, White, Vaughan, Wright, Smith (SB 0501 by *Akbari)

County Government - As introduced, prohibits interpreting or amending county charter in a manner inconsistent with state law with respect to the duties, qualifications, and privileges of the constitutional county offices of sheriff, register, county clerk, assessor of property, or trustee. - Amends TCA Title 5, Chapter 1, Part 2.

[HB 0518](#) by *Hill T, Calfee, Travis, Wright, Crawford (SB 1395 by *Bell)

Firefighters - As introduced, creates a program managed by the commissioner of commerce and insurance to annually award grants to volunteer fire departments for the purchase of firefighting equipment or to meet local match requirements for federal grants for the purchase of firefighting equipment and training. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 102.

[HB 0519](#) by *Hill T, Helton, Potts, Jernigan, Shaw, Carter, Parkinson, Johnson G, DeBerry, Love, Whitson, Ramsey, Carr, Doggett, Calfee, Tillis, Weaver, Sparks, Hurt, Russell, Byrd, Casada, Cepicky, Vaughan, Coley, Thompson, Leatherwood, Miller, White, Towns, Lamar, Smith, Crawford, Ragan, Hicks, Hall, Freeman, Eldridge (SB 0438 by *Bell, Crowe, Gardenhire, Kyle, Kelsey, Jackson, White, Briggs, Hensley, Massey)

Firefighters - As introduced, creates a rebuttable presumption that a firefighter's cancer that causes a disabling health condition is a result of the firefighter's duties as a firefighter. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 51; Title 50, Chapter 6 and Title 68, Chapter 102.

[HB 1347](#) by *Carter (SB 1331 by *Gardenhire)

Public Employees - As introduced, requires a county that provides insurance coverage for its employees and officials to make its policy or policies of group insurance for group life, hospitalization, disability, or medical expenses for such employees and officials readily available on the county's website. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 8 and Title 56.

HB 1335 by *Eldridge (SB 0932 by *Lundberg, Akbari, Briggs, Yarbros)

Local Government, General - As introduced, permits local authorities to regulate the use of tobacco products in public places, places of employment, and parks. - Amends TCA Section 39-17-1551.

HB 1041 by *Cochran (SB 1400 by *Bell)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, prohibits public funds being expended in support of any policy declining to provide services to licensed firearms businesses. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 7; Title 9 and Title 12.

HB 1357 by *Calfee (SB 1363 by *Yager)

Metropolitan Government - As introduced, defines the county seat, if the county seat is an incorporated municipality, as the principal city for purposes of county and city consolidation, if the largest city by population in the county fails to adopt a consolidation resolution within 90 days of the county's adoption of a consolidation resolution. - Amends TCA Title 7.

HB 0281 by *Marsh (SB 0436 by *Bell)

Pets - As introduced, requires retail pet stores to provide certain information to consumers in connection with purchases of dogs; prohibits retail pet stores from sourcing dogs from breeders that have committed certain violations; classifies certain violations as a Class C misdemeanor offense punishable by fine only. - Amends TCA Title 44, Chapter 17 and Title 47.

HB 0414 by *Lamar (SB 0607 by *Robinson)

Public Contracts - As introduced, requires counties and cities to compile data regarding the counties' and cities' purchases from and contracts with businesses owned by women and by minorities; requires such data to be available to the public upon request. - Amends TCA Title 12, Chapter 3 and Title 12, Chapter 4.

HB 0907 by *Freeman (SB 1094 by *Dickerson)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, extends the period, from six months to one year, that a county or city that held an election on a resolution or ordinance levying a local option sales and use tax that was rejected is prohibited from holding another election on such tax. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

[HB 0834](#) by *Lamberth (SB 0695 by *Lundberg)

Tort Liability and Reform - As introduced, allows the personal representative of the deceased to recover in a wrongful death action for the benefit of the decedent's survivors and estate; states that a defense that would bar or reduce a survivor's recovery may be asserted against that survivor but shall not affect the recovery of any other survivor. - Amends TCA Title 20.

[HB 1411](#) by *Farmer (SB 1424 by *Akbari)

Attorneys at Law - As introduced, establishes requirements for providers operating websites offering consumer access to interactive software that generates legal documents based on consumer answers. - Amends TCA Title 23.

[HB 0236](#) by *Zachary, Daniel, Halford (SB 0399 by *Stevens)

Homestead Exemptions - As introduced, increases the homestead exemption relative to garnishments; creates homestead exemption for agricultural land; requires the fiscal review committee to recommend to the general assembly every three years suggested increases in the homestead exemption. - Amends TCA Title 26 and Title 30.

[HB 1047](#) by *White , Littleton (SB 0649 by *Haile, Briggs, McNally, Johnson, Stevens, Swann, Jackson, Lundberg, Bowling, Massey, Yarbro, Gilmore, Southerland, Yager)

Courts - As introduced, makes various changes to zero to three courts, including adding five additional courts, extending such courts to January 1, 2025, and allowing such courts to reinstate a revoked or suspended driver license of a party to an action before the court and waive unpaid fines and fees based on the party's satisfactory progress toward meeting the goals of the court. - Amends TCA Title 16; Title 36; Title 37 and Chapter 366 of the Public Acts of 2017.

[HB 1104](#) by *Holsclaw (SB 0740 by *Kyle)

Courts, Administrative Office of the - As introduced, requires administrative director of the administrative office of the courts to develop and administer a text messaging program to remind criminal defendants to appear at their scheduled hearings in municipal and criminal courts. - Amends TCA Title 16.

[HB 1257](#) by *Curcio, Carter, Littleton, Van Huss, Farmer, Sexton C, Gant, Lamberth, Garrett, Tillis, Sherrell, Griffey (SB 1408 by *Bell)

Courts - As introduced, requires that appointments to the offices of senior judge, chancellor, circuit court judge, criminal court judge, or judge of any other trial court of record, district attorney general, and district public defender be confirmed by general assembly before appointees take office. - Amends TCA Title 2; Title 4; Title 8; Title 16; Title 17 and Title 38, Chapter 6.

[HB 0995](#) by *Beck (SB 0540 by *Lundberg)

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, defines mental health disorder; creates civil liability for an unlicensed person providing mental health psychotherapy services for treatment of a mental health disorder. - Amends TCA Title 29; Title 33; Title 63 and Title 68.

[HB 0340](#) by *Daniel, Todd, Lafferty, Staples, Faison, Terry, Holt, Hill T, Hill M, Rudder, Hall, Parkinson, Sexton J, DeBerry, Jernigan, Hulsey, Hardaway, Lamar, Hodges, Potts, Thompson, Hakeem, Calfee, Dixie, Bricken, Rudd, Dunn, Cepicky, Crawford, Eldridge, Byrd, Wright, Love, Kumar, Chism, Cooper, Miller, Towns, Moody (SB 0362 by *Niceley)

Forfeiture of Assets - As introduced, makes various changes to civil forfeiture procedure, including requiring the district attorney general to review the underlying circumstances of a seizure to determine if probable cause exists to justify forfeiture and, when appropriate, file a motion to dismiss the application for forfeiture warrant, upon which the court shall dismiss the application and return the seized property. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 33.

[HB 0926](#) by *Lamberth, Gant (SB 0782 by *Johnson)

Correction, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the clerk of the court to send a copy of each judgment document for all felony convictions to the department regardless of location of sentence service in order to avoid a delay of the release of some offenders. - Amends TCA Title 40.

[HB 0754](#) by *Smith, Casada (SB 1402 by *Bell)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, prohibits certain persons voluntarily admitted to a mental health treatment facility from possessing a firearm. - Amends TCA Title 16; Title 33 and Title 39, Chapter 17.

[HB 0801](#) by *White (SB 0813 by *Akbari, Kyle)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, creates a Class A misdemeanor of leaving a firearm or firearm ammunition unattended or with a person under 18 years of age in a motor vehicle or boat, if the firearm is not locked within a trunk, glove box, or interior of the person's motor vehicle or boat; punishable only by fine of at least \$500. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 13.

[HB 0193](#) by *Carter, Helton, Smith, Hazlewood, Hakeem, Lafferty (SB 0577 by *Gardenhire)

Expunction - As introduced, permits an eligible petitioner to have multiple, nonviolent convictions for offenses that resulted from the petitioner's status as a victim of human trafficking expunged if the expunction is in the best interest of justice and public safety. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40, Chapter 32.

[HB 0777](#) by *Ramsey, Kumar, Jernigan (SB 1097 by *Dickerson)

Civil Procedure - As introduced, creates a process by which a person may petition a court to dismiss a legal action that is based on the person's exercise of the right to free speech, right to petition, or right of association. - Amends TCA Title 20.

HB 0031 by *Reedy (SB 1413 by *Bell)

Criminal Procedure - As introduced, redefines "prisoner day" within the County Correctional Incentives Act to mean each day each state prisoner convicted by the trial court was held by a county after the first five days of incarceration following conviction, rather than the first five days following sentencing. - Amends TCA Title 41, Chapter 8.

HJR 0047 by *Griffey

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Commends the initiative of President Donald J. Trump to re-establish the original intent, purpose, and limits of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution as it pertains to the citizenship of persons born within the United States and subject to the jurisdiction thereof. -

HB 0134 by *Love (SB 0088 by *Akbari, Kyle)

Expunction - As introduced, decreases from five to three years the amount of time from the completion of a person's sentence that must have elapsed before the person may apply for expunction of records. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 32, Part 1.

HB 1099 by *Parkinson (SB 1020 by *Yarbro)

Forfeiture of Assets - As introduced, decreases from 30 to 25 the number of days in which an agency must establish a hearing date and set the case on the docket after a written claim is filed by a person asserting a claim to property seized under a forfeiture warrant. - Amends TCA Title 40.

HB 1348 by *Miller (SB 0827 by *Akbari)

Expunction - As introduced, clarifies that a person seeking expunction of multiple offenses must petition the court in which the most recent conviction occurred; requires the clerk to serve the petition on the district attorney general for that judicial district and any other judicial district in which the person was convicted of an offense sought to be expunged. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 32.

HB 1476 by *Hardaway (SB 1312 by *Kyle)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, creates a Class A misdemeanor of leaving a firearm or ammunition in a motor vehicle or boat without the firearm or ammunition being stored in a locked cabinet, safe, vault, case, or secured with a firearm locking device if the vehicle or boat is left unattended or with a person under 18 years of age; directs fines collected be deposited in the criminal injuries compensation fund and the domestic violence community education fund. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 13.

[HB 0873](#) by *Curcio, Farmer (SB 0405 by *Stevens)

Appeal and Review - As introduced, allows petitions for post-conviction relief based on new non-scientific evidence establishing that the petitioner is actually innocent of the offense for which the petitioner was convicted; establishes certain requirements for evidence on which such petitions are based. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 30, Part 1.

[HB 0547](#) by *Curcio, Love, Lamberth, Farmer, Faison (SB 0589 by *Dickerson, Gilmore, Akbari)

Criminal Procedure - As introduced, restores the voting rights of persons convicted of certain infamous crimes upon receipt of a pardon or completion of any sentence of incarceration, parole, or probation. - Amends TCA Section 2-2-102 and Title 40, Chapter 29.

[HB 0948](#) by *Lamberth, Gant (SB 0804 by *Johnson)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, transfers responsibilities concerning the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act of 1977 from the department of commerce and insurance to the attorney general and reporter; creates a division of consumer affairs within the office of the attorney general and reporter. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 47, Chapter 23 and Title 63.

[HB 1163](#) by *Ogles, Whitson (SB 0634 by *Johnson)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, requires travel promoters to post a \$10,000 bond for each location doing business in this state. - Amends TCA Title 47 and Title 62.

[HB 0121](#) by *Stewart (SB 0239 by *Gilmore, Niceley)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, prohibits a person who regularly engages in or solicits consumer transactions involving the installation of used tires from installing an unsafe used tire on a motor vehicle; specifies that installing an unsafe used tire is a violation of the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act of 1977. - Amends TCA Title 47 and Title 55.

HB 1034 by *Shaw (SB 0772 by *Yarbro)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, authorizes the City of Ashland City, by ordinance adopted by a two-thirds vote, to levy an occupancy tax of not more than 5 percent on the privilege of staying in any hotel or motel in Ashland City; the ordinance must set forth the manner of collection and administration of the privilege tax; requires that all proceeds received by the municipality from the tax be used for tourism development. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

HB 0418 by *Marsh (SB 0521 by *Niceley)

Zoning - As introduced, requires property owner consent to any amendments to a county or city zoning ordinance that affects the property owner's property; requires notice to be provided to each property owner when the owner's property is subject to an amendment to the county or city zoning ordinance. - Amends TCA Title 13, Chapter 7.

HB 1356 by *Calfee (SB 1365 by *Yager, Swann)

Taxes, Real Property - As introduced, specifies that delinquent taxes on property for which the owner filed an action or claim against the Tennessee Valley Authority arising out of a coal ash spill will not be subject to the penalty and interest provisions and would only accrue interest from the delinquency date of the respective tax year at the composite prime rate published by the federal reserve board as of the delinquency date, minus two points. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

HB 0817 by *Helton (SB 1184 by *White)

Taxes, Real Property - As introduced, removes reference to a repealed provision to clarify the time in which a county board of equalization must complete its assessment reviews. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

HB 1500 by *Williams (SB 1509 by *Bailey)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, authorizes the City of Cookeville, by ordinance adopted by a two-thirds vote, to levy an occupancy tax of not more than 3 percent on the privilege of staying in any hotel or motel in Cookeville; requires the ordinance to set forth the manner of collection and administration of the privilege tax; requires that all proceeds received by the municipality from the tax be used for tourism and economic development. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

HB 1493 by *Thompson (SB 1396 by *Bell)

Cemeteries - As introduced, requires owners of private property on which a gravesite or crypt containing human remains is located to allow access to such site by certain persons; prohibits the erection of a barrier to access of such site; creates right of action if access is denied. - Amends TCA Title 46.

HB 0890 by *Hakeem (SB 0720 by *Gardenhire)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, allocates revenue from occupancy tax imposed by Hamilton County on short-term vacation rental units in the City of Chattanooga to the City to be used solely for improvements to certain city-owned youth and community facilities. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 14; Chapter 444 of the Public Acts of 1983; Chapter 905 of the Public Acts of 1980 and Chapter 918 of the Public Acts of 1988.

Tobacco, Tobacco Products - As introduced, limits the places in which one may use vapor products. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 15 and Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 16.

Human Services, Dept. of - As introduced, enacts the "Child Support Cooperation Act," which directs the department to require each recipient of SNAP (food stamp) benefits to cooperate with the Title IV-D child support enforcement program as a condition of eligibility for SNAP benefits. - Amends TCA Title 71, Chapter 5.

[HB 0369](#) by *Hodges (SB 0694 by *Lundberg)

Tattoos and Piercings - As introduced, authorizes a tattoo artist to perform tattoo removal if the tattoo artist complies with the applicable rules promulgated by the commissioner of health. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 38, Part 2.

Public Records - As introduced, prohibits government payments, fees, and other forms of financial benefits paid or bestowed, or agreed to be paid or bestowed, to a private entity from being deemed confidential under the open records provisions of state law unless the transaction or proposed transaction falls under a specific state or federal law. - Amends TCA Section 10-7-504.

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, enables a police officer who is a member of the state retirement system to be eligible for service retirement upon completion of 25 years of creditable service. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.

[HB 1176](#) by *Weaver (SB 1301 by *Pody)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, removes requirement that an off-duty law enforcement officer notify principal or other administrative staff person if the off-duty officer will be present on school grounds or inside school building during regular school hours and in possession of a firearm. - Amends TCA Section 39-17-1309 and Section 39-17-1350.

HB 1174 by *Weaver (SB 0891 by *Niceley)

State Government - As introduced, requires state agencies to produce an economic impact statement prior to entering a contract with a private party if either the contract is in excess of \$2.5 million or the contract will result in the furlough or layoff of any state employees, instead of both; authorizes the chair of the appropriate standing committee to schedule a hearing to review the economic impact statement. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 9 and Title 12.

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, exempts certain motor vehicle dismantlers and recyclers from the requirement to keep certain records of transactions of buying or selling automobile parts. - Amends TCA Section 55-17-109; Title 55, Chapter 3, Part 2 and Title 55, Chapter 5, Part 1.

[HB 0790](#) by *Coley (SB 0899 by *Niceley)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, prohibits municipalities from assessing fees for impoundment of a motor vehicle when the owner was not responsible for the events that caused the impoundment; requires reasonable effort to notify owner of motor vehicles' impoundment and prohibits sale before attempting notice; requires that aggrieved motor vehicle owners be made whole. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Section 36-5-901; Title 40, Chapter 33; Section 54-16-113; Title 55 and Title 66.

HB 1161 by *Ogles, Potts (SB 0635 by *Johnson)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, clarifies that, for purposes of the offense of unlawfully passing a youth bus, the term "youth bus" includes tour buses and other vehicles carrying not less than 15 passengers. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 49 and Title 55.

HB 0268 by *Hodges, Jernigan, Whitson (SB 0205 by *Briggs)

School Transportation - As introduced, permits LEAs to install cameras on school buses to record vehicles that unlawfully pass a stopped school bus; allows evidence to be reviewed by law enforcement officers only after evidence is submitted to an LEA by a school bus driver; establishes citations for first and subsequent offenses. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 21 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

HB 0583 by *Potts (SB 0768 by *Yarbro)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, requires the driver of any vehicle involved in an accident with a pedestrian or bicyclist to stop at scene of accident and to report accident. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 1.

HB 1220 by *Potts, Lamar (SB 1107 by *Dickerson)

Traffic Safety - As introduced, establishes requirements for the operation of electric foot scooters. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 1; Title 55, Chapter 10; Title 55, Chapter 12 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

HB 0182 by *Howell (SB 0045 by *Massey)
