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**[HB 0540](#) by \*Crawford (SB 0857 by \*Crowe)**

Boats, Boating - As introduced, changes the date by which persons who sell certificates of number for boats must remit revenue to the Tennessee fish and wildlife commission from the 10th day after the first of the month to the 14th day after the first of the month. - Amends TCA Title 69, Chapter 9.

**[HB 1468](#) by \*Hurt, Miller (SB 0888 by \*Niceley)**

Agriculture - As introduced, authorizes the department of agriculture to provide notice of registered landrace varieties of hemp to licensed growers and processors via the department's website. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4; Title 43; Title 44, Chapter 6; Title 47, Chapter 26; Title 53; Title 67 and Title 68.

**[HB 0250](#) by \*Freeman (SB 0342 by \*Lundberg)**

Tennessee Fish & Wildlife Commission - As introduced, enables wildlife resource officers to authorize payroll deductions for the payment of membership dues for organizations that meet certain criteria. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 23 and Title 70.

**[HB 0219](#) by \*Hulsey (SB 0923 by \*Southerland)**

Solid Waste Disposal - As introduced, excludes gasification and pyrolysis from the definition of "solid waste processing" for purposes of the Tennessee Solid Waste Disposal Act. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 211.

**[HB 0815](#) by \*Holt (SB 0618 by \*Hensley)**

Fairs - As introduced, increases, from two to three, the number of consecutive terms the chair of the state fair and exposition may serve. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 57.

**HB 1256 by \*Halford (SB 1358 by \*Yager)**

Conservation - As introduced, requires the executive director of the wildlife resources agency to issue an annual report concerning acquisition priorities for wetland and bottomland hardwood forest acquisition. - Amends TCA Section 11-14-401.

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**HB 1190 by \*Terry, Jernigan, White (SB 1393 by \*Bell)**

Landlord and Tenant - As introduced, establishes process for landlords to verify need of tenants and prospective tenants to have pet policies waived to accommodate the need for a service or support animal; creates penalties for misrepresentation. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 21; Title 13, Chapter 20; Title 33; Title 39; Title 44, Chapter 17; Title 44, Chapter 8, Part 4; Title 63; Title 66 and Title 68.

**HB 1113 by \*Curcio, Hill T, Howell, Holt (SB 0709 by \*Stevens)**

Trade Regulation - As introduced, increases the period in which a transportation network company must maintain records relevant to a rider complaint regarding a driver being under the influence of drugs or alcohol during a trip from two years to 30 months. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 13; Title 42; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 62; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68.

**HB 0261 by \*Daniel (SB 0196 by \*Kelsey)**

State Government - As introduced, makes various changes to the Right to Earn a Living Act, including requiring entry regulations, public service restrictions, and statutes to be demonstrably necessary and carefully tailored to fulfill a legitimate public health or safety objective, and allowing persons to petition applicable licensing authorities and bring civil actions when such standard is not met. - Amends TCA Title 1; Title 4; Title 7; Title 38; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 67.

**HB 0353 by \*Daniel (SB 0571 by \*Bowling, Niceley)**

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, allows persons who receive certified occupational training as a prisoner or a student in a high school technical training class to receive equivalent credit toward an occupational license relating to the training received. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 6, Part 1; Title 37; Title 38; Title 41; Title 49; Title 62 and Title 63.

**HB 1338 by \*Sparks, Holt (SB 0850 by \*Hensley)**

Business Organizations - As introduced, reduces the amount in fees charged to a foreign LLC transacting business in the state without a certificate of authority; exempts from the application of such fees certain foreign LLCs that the state has already granted a certificate of sales and use tax exemption or certificate of registration, or otherwise has formally and in writing acknowledged the company's authority to conduct business in this state. - Amends TCA Title 48, Chapter 249, Part 9.

**HB 1073 by \*Sanderson (SB 0543 by \*Gardenhire)**

Personal Property - As introduced, revises provisions governing notice for lien enforcement under the Tennessee Self-Service Storage Facility Act. - Amends TCA Title 66, Chapter 31.

**HB 0614 by \*Griffey, Weaver (SB 1167 by \*Hensley)**

Landlord and Tenant - As introduced, requires a landlord to provide local governmental agencies responsible for enforcing building codes the landlord's email address in addition to the landlord's name, telephone number, and physical address. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 62 and Title 66.

**HB 0605 by \*Tillis, Carter, Whitson (SB 1458 by \*Bailey, Bowling)**

Taxes - As introduced, requires the commissioner of revenue to make a thorough study and investigation of the tax laws of other states. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 65 and Title 67.

**HB 0381 by \*Marsh (SB 0391 by \*Briggs)**

Public Contracts - As introduced, authorizes utility districts and utility authorities to contract for construction management services during local construction projects. - Amends TCA Section 12-4-107.

**HB 0602 by \*Marsh (SB 1443 by \*Bailey)**

Local Government, General - As introduced, prohibits a local government from requiring an alarm systems contractor or business to acquire permits for the operation of alarm systems; prohibits local governments from imposing fines or fees on an alarm systems contractor or business for false alarms. - Amends TCA Title 7 and Title 62, Chapter 32.

**HB 0604 by \*Marsh (SB 0532 by \*Briggs)**

Public Utilities - As introduced, allows an acquiring public utility that acquires a selling utility to request that the Tennessee public utility commission use certain procedures to establish the ratemaking rate base of that selling utility at the time when it is acquired by the acquiring utility. - Amends TCA Title 65.

**HB 0525 by \*Hill T, Doggett (SB 0518 by \*Niceley)**

Public Utility Commission - As introduced, requires the commerce committee of the house of representatives and the commerce and labor committee of the senate to jointly study the purpose, size, scope, pay structure, and other pertinent information concerning the operation of the Tennessee public utility commission and to submit a report to the speakers no later than January 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7 and Title 65.

**HB 1281 by \*Hill T (SB 1414 by \*Bell)**

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, permits the utility management review board to authorize the voluntary sale of all or part of the assets of a utility district to a public utility if certain conditions are met. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 7 and Section 65-4-101.

**HB 1299 by \*Hill T (SB 1052 by \*Watson)**

Banks and Financial Institutions - As introduced, enacts the "Sweepstakes Savings Account Act of Tennessee." - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 5; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 6 and Title 45.

**HB 0271 by \*Gant, Hill T, Cepicky, Coley, Ramsey, Hill M, Doggett, Lamberth, Powers, Powell (SB 0324 by \*Johnson)**

Contractors - As introduced, prohibits the inclusion of a condition precedent for payment clause in construction contracts that precludes a prime contractor from having to pay a remote contractor for services rendered until the prime contractor is paid by the construction owner client. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 6; Title 66, Chapter 11 and Title 66, Chapter 34.

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**[HB 0948](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, Powers, Boyd (SB 0804 by \*Johnson)**

Consumer Protection - As introduced, transfers responsibilities concerning the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act of 1977 from the department of commerce and insurance to the attorney general and reporter; creates a division of consumer affairs within the office of the attorney general and reporter. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 47, Chapter 23 and Title 63.

**[HB 1163](#) by \*Ogles, Whitson (SB 0634 by \*Johnson)**

Consumer Protection - As introduced, requires travel promoters to post a \$10,000 bond for each location doing business in this state. - Amends TCA Title 47 and Title 62.

**[HB 0389](#) by \*Helton, Bricken, Thompson, Coley, Boyd (SB 0312 by \*Watson)**

Employees, Employers - As introduced, prohibits a medical review officer from considering prescriptions issued more than six months prior to a positive confirmed drug result for purposes of determining a valid prescription and immunity from actions authorized for employers to take against employees and job applicants following such a result under drug-free workplace program. - Amends TCA Title 8 and Title 50.

**[HB 1239](#) by \*Griffey, Weaver (SB 1165 by \*Hensley)**

Employees, Employers - As introduced, prohibits governmental entities from contracting with a person who does not provide evidence of work authorization status for each individual to whom public money will be received under a public contract; requires private employers with at least six employees and governmental entities to verify the work authorization status of employees hired on or after January 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 12 and Title 50.

**[HB 0986](#) by \*Shaw, Hill M (SB 0758 by \*Yarbro)**

Employees, Employers - As introduced, enacts the "Tennessee Pregnant Workers Fairness Act." - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 50.

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**[HB 0939](#) by \*Lamberth, Dunn (SB 0795 by \*Johnson, Gresham)**

Education - As introduced, extends, from 10 days to 30 days, the period of time after a local board of education orders a student's school assignment within which a parent, guardian, or legal representative may apply to the board for a hearing to challenge the reasonableness of the student's assignment and to request the student's transfer to another school. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

**[HB 0952](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, Hurt (SB 0808 by \*Johnson, Haile, Bowling)**

Education - As introduced, transfers, from the state board of education to the department of education, the authority to accept and administer federal funds for the purpose of promoting public education; designates the department of education as the state board for career and technical education; grants the department of education the authority to administer annual appropriations made for career and technical education; removes provision for grants to public four-year institutions of higher education for research in career and technical education. - Amends TCA Section 49-1-202; Title 49, Chapter 11; Section 49-3-201; Section 49-3-302 and Section 49-3-318.

**[HB 0945](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, White , DeBerry (SB 0801 by \*Johnson, Haile)**

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to submit an annual report to the education committees of both houses on school districts that offer a career and technical education program in agriculture, food, and natural resources, and on students enrolled in the program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 11.

**[HB 0953](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, Ragan, White (SB 0809 by \*Johnson)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires an LEA to make certain interest inventories available to students in grades five through nine; requires an LEA to administer a career aptitude assessment to students in grades seven or eight. - Amends TCA Section 49-6-412.

**[HB 0946](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, Boyd, White , Littleton (SB 0802 by \*Johnson, Bowling)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires an LEA to report to the department of education, for each year that the LEA receives an increase in state funding for instructional wages and salaries, how the increase was utilized by the LEA; requires the department of education to report the information to the BEP review committee; requires the BEP review committee to include the information in its annual report on the BEP. - Amends TCA Section 49-3-306.

**[HB 0681](#) by \*Helton, Rudder, Littleton, Cepicky, White , Hurt, Tillis, Sexton J, Freeman, Haston, DeBerry, Dixie, Dunn (SB 0625 by \*Watson, Dickerson, Gardenhire, Gresham, Jackson, Massey, Pody, Rose, Stevens)**

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, revises the Volunteer Public Education Trust Fund Act of 1985; designates the commissioner of education and state treasurer as trustees of the fund. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 3, Part 4.

**[HB 0177](#) by \*Love (SB 0295 by \*Akbari)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, directs that any interest accruing on the balance of an LEA's dedicated education fund that remains unexpended at the end of a fiscal year must be returned to the fund balance and become part of the fund balance. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 3.

**[HB 0689](#) by \*Lamar, Dunn (SB 0831 by \*Akbari, Robinson)**

Lottery, Scholarships and Programs - As introduced, extends for a student who becomes pregnant during the four-month period immediately preceding the date on which the student completes high school in a Tennessee home school program, obtains a GED® or HiSET®, or graduates from high school, the time within which the student must be admitted to, and enrolled in, an eligible postsecondary institution to be eligible for a Tennessee HOPE scholarship. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4, Part 9.

**[HB 0737](#) by \*Moody (SB 1241 by \*Gresham)**

Education, State Board of - As introduced, authorizes the state board to extend the six-year period required for the standards review and development committees and advisory teams to review the standards for English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies for a period not to exceed three years. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1, Part 3.

**HB 0196 by \*Lafferty, Dunn (SB 0180 by \*Massey)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, reduces, from no less than four to no more than four, the number of high school students who may serve on a local board of education as advisory, nonvoting members; deletes the requirement that half of the high school students selected to serve on the board must be enrolled in the college preparatory track and half must be enrolled in the technology track. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 2.

**HB 0736 by \*Lafferty (SB 1260 by \*Gresham)**

Education - As introduced, requires the office of research and education accountability (OREA) to study whether community schools are providing effective on-the-job training opportunities to students and file a report containing the findings, conclusions, and recommendations from the study with the education committees of the general assembly no later than January 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 1000 by \*Beck (SB 0763 by \*Yarbro, Crowe)**

Education, Higher - As introduced, requires a degree-granting postsecondary educational institution to designate a staff member to serve as a homeless-student liaison to assist homeless students who are enrolled, or planning to enroll, in the institution, and to develop a plan to provide homeless students who are enrolled in the institution access to housing resources. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 1058 by \*Clemmons (SB 0936 by \*Yarbro)**

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, enacts the "Teacher Residency Program Grant Act"; requires the department to establish and administer a program of grants for university teacher preparation programs and LEAs to create teacher residency programs. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 0215 by \*Clemmons, Freeman, Hodges (SB 0259 by \*Kyle)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires local education agencies to develop and implement a "Stop the Bleed" program that requires each school in the LEA to place a bleeding control kit within the school; requires the department of education to develop a bleeding control kit training program for LEA employees. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 0115 by \*Sparks (SB 1239 by \*Gresham)**

Comptroller, State - As introduced, requires the office of research and education accountability in the office of the comptroller to conduct a study on the average cost of attendance for an undergraduate program at a public institution of higher education, including the cost of textbooks, and to report its findings to the education committees of the general assembly by February 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HJR 0054 by \*Sparks**

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Encourages schools, nonprofit organizations, and faith-based organizations to increase opportunities for mentorships and apprenticeships for students. -

**HJR 0055 by \*Sparks**

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Urges local education agencies to raise awareness of importance of positive male role models in schools. -

**HJR 0056 by \*Sparks**

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Urges review of adjunct faculty compensation at public institutions of higher education. -

**HB 1244 by \*Byrd, Dunn (SB 0330 by \*Hensley)**

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, decreases, from "at least two" to "at least one", the number of physical education class meetings an LEA must require elementary school students to attend each full school week. - Amends TCA Section 49-6-1021.

**HB 0564 by \*Dunn, Ragan (SB 0482 by \*Gardenhire)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, authorizes a local board of education to make payroll deduction for dues of professional employees' organizations available to its professional employees. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 5.

**HB 0070 by \*Powers, Sexton J (SB 0020 by \*Gresham)**

Education - As introduced, extends the date of the repeal of the Virtual Public Schools Act from June 30, 2019, to June 30, 2023. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 16.

**HB 0307 by \*Powers (SB 1373 by \*Yager)**

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, requires the state board of education to approve a released time course offered by a local board of education for school credit as a special course that offers elective credits for each student who participates; requires instructors of a released time course offered for school credit to be licensed; prohibits the state board of education from requiring prior approval of the curriculum or textbooks of a released time course offered for school credit. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 0776 by \*Ramsey (SB 1135 by \*Swann, Watson)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires, rather than encourages, all public middle and elementary schools to place one or more automated external defibrillator (AED) devices within the school. - Amends TCA Title 49 and Title 68, Chapter 140, Part 4.

**HB 0399 by \*Parkinson, White , Byrd, Thompson (SB 1261 by \*Gresham)**

Education - As introduced, requires each local board of education and charter school governing body to adopt a comprehensive code of conduct for each school under the authority of the board or governing body that describes the types of behavior expected from all persons entering on school grounds. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 0653 by \*Hawk, White (SB 0909 by \*Southerland)**

Education - As introduced, increases the number of BEP funded full-time public school nurse positions from one for every 3,000 students to one for every 700 students; increases the number of full-time public school nurses considered sufficient for the public school nurse program to adequately provide services from one nurse for every 3,000 students to one nurse for every 700 students. - Amends TCA Title 49 and Title 68, Chapter 1, Part 12.

**HB 1330 by \*Haston, White (SB 1058 by \*Dickerson, Yarbro, Akbari, Gilmore)**

Education - As introduced, deletes an obsolete provision requiring the office of research and education accountability to report on whether community schools have met their education and community goals to the education committees of the general assembly by November 1, 2018. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 24.

**HB 0567 by \*White (SB 0310 by \*Massey, Yarbro)**

Education - As introduced, directs the Tennessee School for the Deaf, together with the West Tennessee School for the Deaf, to establish a two-year deaf mentor pilot project to assist families and agencies in implementing bilingual and bicultural home-based programming for young children who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deaf-blind. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 10, Part 9.

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**[HB 0167](#) by \*Lamberth, Curcio, Farmer, Gant, White , Casada, Dixie, Griffey, Littleton (SB 0403 by \*Stevens)**

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, requires a mandatory 30-day sentence for theft of a firearm; creates the Class D felony offense of bringing a telecommunication device into a penal institution; revises other various provisions of criminal law. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55.

**[HB 0377](#) by \*Boyd, Marsh, Moon, Hill T, Leatherwood (SB 0308 by \*Lundberg)**

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, requires utilities participating in utility bill round-up programs to provide notice to customers of program and customer rights no later than November 1, 2019; permits utilities to enroll new customers after January 1, 2020, only upon receipt of customer consent; requires utilities to remove customer from program upon receiving opt out notice. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 45; Title 47, Chapter 18 and Title 65.

Highways, Roads and Bridges - As introduced, deletes requirement that certain funds from the 1986 gasoline tax increases be used only for specific highway projects during the 1986-1987 and 1993-1994 fiscal years. - Amends TCA Title 54; Title 55; Title 64; Title 65 and Title 67.

**HB 0426 by \*Crawford (SB 1387 by \*Bell)**

Motor Vehicles, Titling and Registration - As introduced, authorizes certain off-highway vehicles that are capable of holding no more than four passengers to be registered as Class I vehicles for operation on county roads. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 3; Title 55, Chapter 4 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

**HB 0732 by \*Crawford (SB 0595 by \*Lundberg)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, expands the authorization to authorize, regulate, and control the commercial use of pedal carriages and rickshaws to any municipality or metropolitan government in the state and not just home rule municipalities and metropolitan governments. - Amends TCA Section 55-26-102.

**HB 0221 by \*Windle (SB 1375 by \*Yager)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, authorizes off-highway vehicles to be operated on certain segments of state highways in Morgan County. - Amends TCA Section 55-8-185.

**HB 1252 by \*Byrd (SB 0747 by \*Hensley)**

Highways, Roads and Bridges - As introduced, increases the safety light requirement for horse-drawn vehicles used on highways from either a battery-powered strobe light or two lanterns to both a battery-powered strobe light and two lanterns. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 9, Part 4.

**HB 1090 by \*Keisling (SB 1498 by \*Bailey)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, defines "trailer" for purposes of the length restriction on buses operating with trailers attached. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 7, Part 2.

**HB 1107 by \*Powell, Jernigan (SB 1346 by \*Massey)**

Public Records - As introduced, requires that personally identifying information contained in motor vehicle accident reports be treated as confidential information and restricted from public disclosure. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 5; Title 38; Title 40 and Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 1.

**HB 0536 by \*Whitson, Howell (SB 1492 by \*Bailey)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, requests department of safety to conduct a study on the number of motor vehicle accidents reported to the department during the previous four calendar years that resulted in serious bodily injury or property damage exceeding \$1,000 and involved a malfunctioning airbag or other restraint system component; requires department to submit a report to the transportation and safety committee of the senate and the transportation committee of the house of representatives on or before February 1, 2020, if a study is conducted. - Amends TCA Title 55.

**HB 0923 by \*Lamberth, Gant, Carr (SB 0779 by \*Johnson, Stevens, Bowling)**

Transportation, Dept. of - As introduced, converts the department's construction manager/general contractor services (CM/GC) pilot program into a fully authorized project delivery method; establishes limitations for CM/GC contracts. - Amends TCA Title 54, Chapter 1.

**HB 1220 by \*Potts, Lamar (SB 1107 by \*Dickerson)**

Traffic Safety - As introduced, establishes requirements for the operation of electric foot scooters. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 1; Title 55, Chapter 10; Title 55, Chapter 12 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

**HB 1169 by \*Weaver (SB 1335 by \*Southerland)**

Motor Vehicles, Titling and Registration - As introduced, makes the requirement that any applicant for motor vehicle registration who failed to pay wheel tax be responsible for paying for all prior years' wheel taxes, applicable on a statewide basis instead of only applicable in Rutherford County. - Amends TCA Section 55-4-105.

**HB 0178 by \*Howell (SB 0041 by \*Massey)**

Highways, Roads and Bridges - As introduced, increases, from 10 to 30, the number of days a utility facility owner located in a state right-of-way has to respond to a second relocation notice and the number of days an owner has to file a reservation of rights notice with the department of transportation. - Amends TCA Title 54.

**HB 0179 by \*Howell (SB 0042 by \*Massey)**

Motor Vehicles, Titling and Registration - As introduced, changes the date from March 1 to March 15 by which the commissioner of revenue must annually report the status of the computerized titling and registration system. - Amends TCA Title 55.

**HB 0180 by \*Howell, Smith (SB 0043 by \*Massey)**

Transportation, Dept. of - As introduced, authorizes an electronic format of the report provided by the department to each member of the general assembly regarding the status of highway projects in the county or counties represented by the member. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 54; Title 55; Title 65 and Title 67.

**HB 0181 by \*Howell (SB 0044 by \*Massey)**

Highways, Roads and Bridges - As introduced, requires a county or municipality to publish its certified highway map on the county or municipality's website, which must be accessible to the public, no less than 30 days prior to the date of the public hearing on the map. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 54; Title 55 and Title 67.

**HB 0182 by \*Howell (SB 0045 by \*Massey)**

Highways, Roads and Bridges - As introduced, requires locally appointed commissioners to report to the county legislative body within 60 days of the completion of any repair work on bridges, levees, or causeways. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 54; Title 55 and Title 67.

**HB 0538 by \*Howell (SB 1493 by \*Bailey)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, removes requirement that a towing firm wait 30 days to proceed to sell a vehicle taken into custody; makes other related revisions. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 16 and Title 55, Chapter 23.

**HB 0790 by \*Coley (SB 0899 by \*Niceley)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, prohibits municipalities from assessing fees for impoundment of a motor vehicle when the owner was not responsible for the events that caused the impoundment; requires reasonable effort to notify owner of motor vehicles' impoundment and prohibits sale before attempting notice; requires that aggrieved motor vehicle owners be made whole. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Section 36-5-901; Title 40, Chapter 33; Section 54-16-113; Title 55 and Title 66.
