Boats, Boating - As introduced, limits operating permit fee for commercial non-motorized vessel outfitters to the amount of the fee imposed on commercial fishermen; authorizes implementation of parking pass system for outfitters; imposes limitation on fees assessed such outfitters. - Amends TCA Title 69, Chapter 9 and Title 70.

General Assembly, Directed Studies - Encourages the Department of Agriculture and representatives of vineyard owners and the retail wine industry in Tennessee to discuss the formation of a statewide wine trail. -

Insurance Companies, Agents, Brokers, Policies - As introduced, corrects a reference to the insurance and banking committee of the house of representatives by replacing it with a reference to the insurance committee of the house of representatives. - Amends TCA Title 56.

[HB 0261](#) by *Daniel (SB 0196 by *Kelsey)

State Government - As introduced, makes various changes to the Right to Earn a Living Act, including requiring entry regulations, public service restrictions, and statutes to be demonstrably necessary and carefully tailored to fulfill a legitimate public health or safety objective, and allowing persons to petition applicable licensing authorities and bring civil actions when such standard is not met. - Amends TCA Title 1; Title 4; Title 7; Title 38; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 67.

Highway Signs - "Mike and Sara Sellers Memorial Bridge," S.R. 91 in Carter County -

[HB 0557](#) by *Johnson C, Gant (SB 1201 by *Crowe)

TennCare - As introduced, requires the bureau of TennCare to provide notice to the chair of the health and welfare committee of the senate and the chair of the health committee of the house of representatives prior to reducing payments on a pro rata basis. - Amends TCA Title 68 and Title 71.

[HB 0118](#) by *Littleton (SB 0007 by *Roberts, Kurita)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, authorizes the City of Ashland City, by ordinance adopted by a two-thirds vote, to levy an occupancy tax of not more than 5 percent on the privilege of staying in any hotel or motel in Ashland City; the ordinance must set forth the manner of collection and administration of the privilege tax; requires that all proceeds received by the municipality from the tax be used for tourism development. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

HB 0070 by *Powers, Sexton J, Byrd (SB 0020 by *Gresham)

Education - As introduced, extends the date of the repeal of the Virtual Public Schools Act from June 30, 2019, to June 30, 2023. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 16.

HB 1244 by *Dunn, Byrd (SB 0330 by *Hensley)

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, decreases, from "at least two" to "at least one", the number of physical education class meetings an LEA must require elementary school students to attend each full school week. - Amends TCA Section 49-6-1021.

HB 0939 by *Lamberth, Dunn (SB 0795 by *Johnson, Gresham)

Education - As introduced, extends, from 10 days to 30 days, the period of time after a local board of education orders a student's school assignment within which a parent, guardian, or legal representative may apply to the board for a hearing to challenge the reasonableness of the student's assignment and to request the student's transfer to another school. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 0945 by *Lamberth, Gant, White, DeBerry (SB 0801 by *Johnson, Haile, Stevens, Yager)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to submit an annual report to the education committees of both houses on school districts that offer a career and technical education program in agriculture, food, and natural resources, and on students enrolled in the program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 11.

HB 1357 by *Calfee (SB 1363 by *Yager)

Metropolitan Government - As introduced, defines the county seat, if the county seat is an incorporated municipality, as the principal city for purposes of county and city consolidation, if the largest city by population in the county fails to adopt a consolidation resolution within 90 days of the county's adoption of a consolidation resolution. - Amends TCA Title 7.

HB 1284 by *Reedy, Ramsey, Todd, Helton, Moon, White, Chism, Hardaway, Powell (SB 0360 by *Southerland, Niceley)

Tobacco, Tobacco Products - As introduced, expands the Prevention of Youth Access to Tobacco and Vapor Products Act and other laws concerning juveniles' access to tobacco and vaping products to apply to hemp for smoking. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Section 68-1-132.

[HB 0247](#) by *Tillis, Lamberth, Sherrell, Vaughan, Littleton (SB 1100 by *Dickerson)

State Government - As introduced, establishes daylight saving time as the standard time in Tennessee, subject to authorization to do so from the United States Congress. - Amends TCA Section 4-1-401.

[HB 1028](#) by *Lynn (SB 0558 by *Johnson)

Taxes - As introduced, requires that "net earnings" or "net loss" be defined as federal taxable income or loss according to the federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 20.

[HB 1085](#) by *Daniel (SB 1291 by *Pody)

Hospitals and Health Care Facilities - As introduced, eliminates the requirement of a certificate of need for healthcare facilities; removes references to the certificate of need; terminates the Tennessee health services and development agency. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 34; Title 42; Title 56; Title 63; Title 68 and Title 71.

[HB 1047](#) by *White, Littleton (SB 0649 by *Haile, Briggs, McNally, Johnson, Stevens, Swann, Jackson, Lundberg, Bowling, Massey, Yarbrow, Gilmore, Southerland, Yager, White)

Courts - As introduced, makes various changes to zero to three courts, including adding five additional courts, extending such courts to January 1, 2025, and allowing such courts to reinstate a revoked or suspended driver license of a party to an action before the court and waive unpaid fines and fees based on the party's satisfactory progress toward meeting the goals of the court. - Amends TCA Title 16; Title 36; Title 37 and Chapter 366 of the Public Acts of 2017.

[HB 1075](#) by *Sanderson, Faison (SB 0302 by *Yager)

Wine & Wineries - As introduced, creates the Tennessee wine and grape board; establishes the powers and duties of the board; creates the wine and grape fund; provides for the funding of the fund and the manner in which such funds may be used by the board. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 43; Title 57 and Title 67.

[HB 1070](#) by *Sanderson, Boyd (SB 1417 by *Dickerson, Pody)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, designates Weir Park in Clay County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-102.

[HB 0797](#) by *Vaughan, Carr (SB 1361 by *Yager)

Licenses - As introduced, requires the Tennessee auctioneer commission to post the names of persons whose licenses have been suspended, revoked, or not renewed as a result of fraud and other violations. - Amends TCA Title 35, Chapter 5; Title 55, Chapter 17, Part 1 and Title 62, Chapter 19.

HB 0031 by *Reedy, Curcio, Lamberth (SB 1413 by *Bell)

Criminal Procedure - As introduced, redefines "prisoner day" within the County Correctional Incentives Act to mean each day each state prisoner convicted by the trial court was held by a county after the first five days of incarceration following conviction, rather than the first five days following sentencing. - Amends TCA Title 41, Chapter 8.

HB 0623 by *Hulsey, Holt, Boyd, Smith, Van Huss, Holsclaw, Calfee, Weaver, Russell, Ramsey, Sparks, Carr, Keisling (SB 1237 by *Pody, Briggs, Crowe, Niceley, Rose, White, Haile, Hensley, Jackson, Stevens, Yager)

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, enables a police officer who is a member of the state retirement system to be eligible for service retirement upon completion of 25 years of creditable service. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.

HB 0794 by *Ramsey, Hazlewood, Jernigan, White (SB 1082 by *Dickerson)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, allows premises authorized to serve wine to also serve high alcohol content beer. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 3, Part 7 and Title 57, Chapter 4.

HB 0397 by *Moody, Littleton, Coley, Byrd (SB 0447 by *Bell, Crowe, Akbari, Kelsey, Massey, Stevens)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, establishes a victims of human trafficking fund in the state treasury to provide comprehensive treatment and support services to victims of human trafficking. - Amends TCA Title 9, Chapter 4, Part 2; Section 39-13-314 and Title 39, Chapter 11, Part 7.

HB 0714 by *Moody, Hill T (SB 0517 by *Niceley, Bowling)

Driver Licenses - As introduced, authorizes the commissioner of safety to issue farm-related service industry employee restricted commercial driver licenses to persons who meet certain qualifications. - Amends TCA Title 43 and Title 55.

HB 0518 by *Hill T, Calfee, Travis, Wright, Crawford, Lamar (SB 1395 by *Bell, Yager)

Firefighters - As introduced, creates a program managed by the commissioner of commerce and insurance to annually award grants to volunteer fire departments for the purchase of firefighting equipment or to meet local match requirements for federal grants for the purchase of firefighting equipment and training. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 102.

HB 1077 by *Rudd, Lynn, Boyd, Cochran, Russell, Whitson, Casada (SB 0727 by *Reeves, Johnson, Pody, Bell)

Election Laws - As introduced, requires the coordinator of elections to continue to study convenience voting in other states and periodically update the general assembly by January 31 every odd-numbered year. - Amends TCA Title 2, Chapter 3, Part 3.

HB 0620 by *Hulseby (SB 0537 by *Lundberg)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, requires that costs incurred in connection with a border region retail tourism development district are deemed approved if the commissioner of revenue has not made an apportionment of sales tax revenue within 90 days of the end of the fiscal year for payment of the costs; makes other related revisions to the Border Region Retail Tourism Development District Act. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 40.

HB 0983 by *Todd (SB 0185 by *Jackson)

Education - As introduced, allows the department of education to post its annual report on its website in lieu of distributing the report to certain persons and entities. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 0506 by *Camper (SB 0459 by *Akbari, Gilmore)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, adds a minor league soccer franchise in the United Soccer League to the list of professional sports franchises for which a sports authority may be allocated sales tax revenue. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

HB 0238 by *Cepicky, Van Huss, Whitson, Hill T, Hill M, Ragan, Moody, Smith, Zachary, Rudder, Griffey, Doggett, Hall, Lamberth, Cochran, Todd, Ogles (SB 0328 by *Hensley, Gilmore)

Controlled Substances - As introduced, enacts the "Student Protection and Zone Equity Act." - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4 and Section 49-2-116.

HB 1317 by *Wright, Dunn, Daniel (SB 0664 by *Massey)

Hospitals and Health Care Facilities - As introduced, authorizes an existing licensed nursing home to relocate beds in certain circumstances. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 11, Part 16.

HB 0071 by *Staples, Powell (SB 0181 by *Massey)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, authorizes the sale of alcoholic beverages and beer for consumption on the premises of Zoo Knoxville during the zoo's regular operating hours. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

HJR 0151 by *Towns, Camper

Constitutional Amendments - Proposes an amendment to Article I, Section 33 of the Constitution of Tennessee to clarify that slavery and involuntary servitude are prohibited in this state, but that duly convicted inmates can work while incarcerated. -

HB 0676 by *Garrett, Lamberth (SB 0699 by *Stevens)

Trusts - As introduced, enacts the "Tennessee Disclaimer of Property Interests Act." - Amends TCA Title 31; Title 34; Title 35 and Title 45.

HB 1515 by *Faison (SB 1523 by *Niceley)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, authorizes the City of White Pine to levy a privilege tax of up to 5 percent upon the privilege of occupancy by a two-thirds vote of its governing body. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

HB 0715 by *Faison (SB 0587 by *Lundberg, Akbari, Gilmore, Jackson)

Bail, Bail Bonds - As introduced, removes certain circumstances in which a citation in lieu of arrest shall not be issued; makes various other changes and corrections. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 11 and Title 40, Chapter 7.

HB 0135 by *Love (SB 0035 by *Gilmore, Robinson)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, creates the Class C felony offense of reckless endangerment by discharging a firearm into a parade, religious service, concert, athletic event, political event, educational event, or into any other group of 25 or more people who are lawfully assembled. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 1.

HB 1500 by *Williams (SB 1509 by *Bailey)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, authorizes the City of Cookeville, by ordinance adopted by a two-thirds vote, to levy an occupancy tax of not more than 3 percent on the privilege of staying in any hotel or motel in Cookeville; requires the ordinance to set forth the manner of collection and administration of the privilege tax; requires that all proceeds received by the municipality from the tax be used for tourism and economic development. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

HB 0864 by *DeBerry, Lamberth (SB 1324 by *Bowling)

Remedies and Special Proceedings - As introduced, defines a guardian for purposes of criminal injuries compensation. - Amends TCA Title 29, Chapter 13.

HB 0119 by *Hill M, Van Huss (SB 0021 by *Crowe, Briggs)

Naming and Designating - As introduced, names the visitor center at the Tipton-Haynes Historic Site in Johnson City in honor of Penny McLaughlin. -

HB 0268 by *Hill M, Hodges, Jernigan, Whitson, Hardaway, Towns, Potts, Weaver, Daniel (SB 0205 by *Briggs, Crowe)

School Transportation - As introduced, permits LEAs to install cameras on school buses to record vehicles that unlawfully pass a stopped school bus; allows evidence to be reviewed by law enforcement officers only after evidence is submitted to an LEA by a school bus driver; establishes citations for first and subsequent offenses. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 21 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

HB 0296 by *Hill M (SB 0467 by *Roberts)

Licenses - As introduced, exempts certain medical professionals from massage licensure requirements where massages for compensation are provided in the offices of such medical professionals by licensed massage therapists. - Amends TCA Title 63, Chapter 18.

HB 1262 by *Holt (SB 0398 by *Kelsey)

Taxes - As introduced, clarifies that the commissioner of revenue's annual report on tax laws of other states is to be transmitted to the chief clerks of the senate and house of representatives and to the legislative librarian; authorizes the report to be transmitted electronically. - Amends TCA Title 67; Chapter 72 of the Public Acts of 2011; Chapter 193 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 273 of the Public Acts of 2015; Chapter 452 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 480 of the Public Acts of 2013; Chapter 530 of the Public Acts of 2009 and Chapter 602 of the Public Acts of 2007.

HB 1274 by *Holt, Griffey (SB 1499 by *Hensley)

Attorney General and Reporter - As introduced, expands the attorney general and reporter's duties to include representation of an LEA or certain LEA employees in a court or administrative tribunal arising out of the adoption of a policy requiring students, faculty, and staff to utilize the restroom, locker room, or other facility that corresponds to that individual's biological sex. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 6.

HB 0339 by *Smith (SB 1211 by *Crowe)

Health Care - As introduced, increases, from \$500 to \$1,000, the maximum amount of civil penalty that may be imposed on a person who performs, offers to perform, or holds such person out as performing any activity for which a certificate of need is required without first obtaining a valid certificate of need. - Amends TCA Title 63 and Title 68.

HB 0001 by *Staples, Sanderson, Camper, Ramsey, Tillis, Hodges (SB 0016 by *Dickerson, Akbari, Kyle, Robinson)

Gambling - As introduced, authorizes sports betting in this state only in jurisdictions that approve sports betting by local option election; imposes a 10 percent tax on gaming revenue; distributes 40 percent of the tax to the general fund for general appropriations, 30 percent to Tennessee colleges of applied technologies and community colleges for equipment and capital projects, and 30 percent to local governments for education and infrastructure; establishes the Tennessee gaming commission to regulate sports betting; authorizes the commission to collaborate with the Tennessee bureau of investigation for purposes of enforcement. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 14; Title 38; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 5; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 49 and Title 67.

HB 0774 by *Ramsey (SB 0281 by *Kurita, Massey)

Health Care - As introduced, enacts the "Chronic Disease Prevention Act." - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 39; Title 67; Title 68 and Title 71.

HB 0322 by *Hakeem (SB 0272 by *Gardenhire, Crowe)

Boards and Commissions - As introduced, adds the speaker of the house of representatives and the speaker of the senate as permanent ex officio voting members of the Tennessee medical examiner advisory council. - Amends TCA Title 38, Chapter 7, Part 2.

HB 1359 by *Calfee, Ragan (SB 1351 by *Yager, McNally, Massey)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, allocates state sales and use tax revenues from the construction of a uranium processing facility to an eligible industrial development corporation that submits a completed application to the commissioner of finance and administration together with an application fee in an amount established by the department; establishes requirements for such allocation. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

HB 1124 by *Daniel (SB 1000 by *Roberts)

Contractors - As introduced, clarifies that the board for licensing contractors must promulgate rules in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 62 and Title 63.

HB 0451 by *Daniel (SB 0119 by *Roberts)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the department of labor and workforce development to June 30, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 4, Chapter 3.

HB 0464 by *Daniel (SB 0133 by *Roberts, Crowe)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the state TennCare pharmacy advisory committee from June 30, 2020 to June 30, 2022. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 71, Chapter 5, Part 24.

HB 0465 by *Daniel (SB 0134 by *Roberts)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the department of environment and conservation to June 30, 2023. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 4, Chapter 3.

HB 0471 by *Daniel, Hill M (SB 0132 by *Roberts, Crowe)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the bureau of TennCare within the department of finance and administration to June 30, 2022. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29; Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 10 and Title 71.

HB 0473 by *Daniel (SB 0141 by *Roberts)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the private probation services council to June 30, 2021. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 16, Chapter 3, Part 9.

HB 0474 by *Daniel (SB 0142 by *Roberts, Crowe)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the department of education to June 30, 2022; requires the department to appear before sunset review committee in 2019 to discuss progress made in addressing findings in its 2018 audit. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 4, Chapter 3.

HB 0667 by *Daniel (SB 0165 by *Roberts)

Administrative Procedure (UAPA) - As introduced, continues permanent rules filed with the secretary of state after January 1, 2018. - Title 4, Chapter 5.

Abortion - As introduced, enacts the "Human Life Protection Act," which bans abortion in this state effective upon the U.S. Supreme Court overturning Roe v. Wade or amending the U.S. Constitution to allow states to prohibit abortion; creates exception for situations where the abortion is necessary to prevent the death of pregnant woman or prevent serious risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of major bodily function; prohibits prosecution of a woman upon whom an abortion is performed or attempted. - Amends TCA Section 9-4-5116; Title 37, Chapter 10, Part 3; Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 2; Title 39, Chapter 15, Part 2; Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 1; Title 63, Chapter 9; Title 63, Chapter 6; Title 68 and Title 71, Chapter 5.

HB 0643 by *Carter, Littleton, Russell, Sherrell (SB 0579 by *Gardenhire)

Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services, Dept. of - As introduced, removes law enforcement as a transportation option provided by the department of mental health and substance abuse services for people with developmental disabilities, mental illness, or serious emotional disturbance. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 21; Title 8, Chapter 42; Title 9, Chapter 8; Title 13, Chapter 26; Title 29, Chapter 20; Title 33, Chapter 2; Title 33, Chapter 6; Title 33, Chapter 7; Title 37, Chapter 1; Title 56; Title 63; Title 68 and Title 71.

HB 1360 by *Calfee, Jernigan (SB 1384 by *Yager, Crowe)

Opioids - As introduced, requires a prescriber to also prescribe naloxone when prescribing opioids or benzodiazepines to a patient. - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 53; Title 63 and Title 68.

HB 1399 by *Windle (SB 1447 by *Bailey)

Human Services, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to submit a state anti-poverty plan by January 15 every odd-numbered year beginning in 2021. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 56 and Title 71.

HB 0969 by *Rudd (SB 1344 by *Massey)

Mental Illness - As introduced, allows courts to order a person into a program of assisted outpatient mental health treatment upon finding certain conditions are met; provides a process for certain persons to petition a court on behalf of a proposed patient; establishes criteria for the evaluation of proposed patients and reporting to the court by physicians and certain mental health professionals. - Amends TCA Title 33.

HB 1459 by *Gant, Sexton C, Kumar, Zachary, Dunn, White, Marsh, Littleton, Tillis, Smith, Moody, Miller, Dixie, Whitson, Leatherwood (SB 0849 by *Hensley, Kyle)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, increases the age to access or use tobacco and vapor products from 18 to 21 years of age. - Amends TCA Title 39.

SJR 0181 by *Briggs, Massey (SJR 0181 Hill M)

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Declares that prior authorization requirements from insurance providers should be removed when a healthcare professional provides or seeks to provide medication assisted treatment to a patient with a substance use disorder and declares substance use disorder and opioid use disorder should be insured in the same manner as other diseases such as diabetes and heart disease. -

HB 0741 by *Hill M (SB 1467 by *Bailey)

Health Care - As introduced, corrects a reference to the insurance and banking committee of the house of representatives by replacing it with a reference to the insurance committee of the house of representatives. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8 and Title 71.

HB 1005 by *Van Huss, Sexton J (SB 0620 by *Hensley)

Death - As introduced, provides for alternative system of manner of death determination review in counties where the chief medical examiner of the regional forensic center acts as the county medical examiner; allows next of kin to hire independent forensic pathologist for review; clarifies that next of kin do not need to complete mediation prior to seeking judicial relief. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 38, Chapter 7 and Title 68.

HB 0710 by *Terry (SB 0613 by *Reeves)

Hospitals and Health Care Facilities - As introduced, clarifies that a written request to a hospital for a detailed statement of services received and expenses incurred by a patient may be delivered by electronic means. - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 56; Title 63; Title 68 and Title 71.

HB 0078 by *Terry, Van Huss, Todd, Cepicky, Smith (SB 1306 by *Pody)

Abortion - As introduced, increases by \$500 the minimum fine imposed for a first or second violation of the requirement that a physician who reports suspected sexual abuse due to being requested to perform an abortion on a minor include in that report information regarding the sampling and preservation of embryonic or fetal tissue; increased fine amounts will be \$1,000 and \$1,500 respectively. - Amends TCA Section 9-4-5116; Title 37, Chapter 10, Part 3; Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 2; Title 39, Chapter 15, Part 2; Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 1; Title 63, Chapter 9; Title 63, Chapter 6; Title 68 and Section 71-5-157.

HB 0075 by *Sexton C, Smith, Gant (SB 0168 by *Gardenhire)

Hospitals and Health Care Facilities - As introduced, increases the period in which notice must be given to the health services and development agency that a health care institution has changed ownership from 30 to 60 days. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 33; Title 56 and Title 68.

Dickson County - Subject to local approval, changes the county highway engineer position from elected to appointed and changes the county highway engineer's duties to only be the duties as provided in Tennessee County Uniform Highway Law. - Amends amend Chapter 38 of the Private Acts of 2018.

[HB 1519](#) by *Holt (SB 1527 by *Stevens)

McKenzie - Subject to local approval, reduces the maximum penalty levied by the municipal court from \$500 to \$50; removes the certification requirement for newly elected councilmen; removes city council authority to impeach; allows council to appoint a city administrator; removes the city clerk bond requirement; revises various other provisions. - Amends Chapter 128 of the Private Acts of 1990; as amended.

McLemoresville - Subject to local approval, deletes antiquated provisions related to poll taxes; codifies current practice of city regarding election timing and terms; adds grounds for removal from office for board of mayor and aldermen; authorizes the hiring of a city recorder; removes cap on fines that may be imposed for a violation of ordinances, on property tax, and business tax. - Amends Chapter 507 of the Private Acts of 1949; as amended.

Pickett County - Subject to local approval, establishes that chancery court has jurisdiction relating to the probate of wills and administration of estates, pursuant to general law, and that general sessions court has concurrent jurisdiction with the circuit and chancery courts over domestic relations cases. -

HB 1525 by *Boyd (SB 1535 by *Pody)

School Districts, Special - Pursuant to the request of the Tenth special school district of Wilson County, permits the district to issue bonds or notes in an amount of \$28 million or less and to issue bond anticipation notes in an amount of \$28 million or less. - Amends Chapter 330 of the Acts of 1901.

Public Records - As introduced, prohibits governmental entities from entering into confidentiality agreements with regard to public records. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7.

HB 1482 by *Hardaway (SB 1294 by *Pody)

Comptroller, State - As introduced, requires the department of audit, as part of its performance review of state entities under the governmental entity review law, to conduct a comprehensive analysis of the extent to which the entity is in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 21 and Title 4, Chapter 3.

HB 0174 by *Russell, Eldridge, Helton, Cochran (SB 0251 by *Hensley)

Tennessee Bureau of Investigation - As introduced, transfers the fire investigations section from the department of commerce and insurance to the bureau. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 38, Chapter 6 and Title 68, Chapter 102.

HB 1440 by *Todd, Russell (SB 1268 by *Pody)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, requires that a law enforcement officer receive compensation for death in the line of duty when the officer dies while commuting to and from the officer's place of residence. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8 and Title 38.

HB 1034 by *Shaw (SB 0772 by *Yarbro)

Labor and Workforce Development, Dept. of - As introduced, requires commissioner, in collaboration with the commissioner of correction, to study the use of a shared data system to monitor individuals from their release from a correctional facility to employment and report their findings jointly to the state and local government committee of the senate and the state government committee of the house of representatives. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 41; Title 49; Title 50 and Title 71.

HB 1066 by *Sanderson (SB 0206 by *Yager)

Alcoholic Beverage Commission - As introduced, requires the commission to publish its annual report concerning statistical information provided by beer boards on its website instead of making copies of the report available to persons who submit a written request for the report. - Amends TCA Title 57.

HB 1068 by *Sanderson (SB 0536 by *Stevens)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, requires a manufacturer of alcoholic beverages to update the alcoholic beverages commission as soon as practicable of any change in location on the premises of the manufacturer where the manufacturer serves samples of its product. - Amends TCA Title 57.

HB 1324 by *Sanderson, Eldridge (SB 0904 by *Southerland)

Vocational Training and Rehabilitation - As introduced, removes the limit on the number of parents of an individual with a disability that may serve on the advisory board of a rehabilitation center. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 41; Title 49; Title 50; Title 68 and Title 71.
