[HB 0944](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Baum, White (SB 0800 by *Johnson, Gresham, Crowe)

Education - As introduced, establishes the Governor's Civics Seal to recognize public schools and local education agencies implementing high-quality civic education programs. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 10.

[HB 0945](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, White , DeBerry (SB 0801 by *Johnson, Haile)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to submit an annual report to the education committees of both houses on school districts that offer a career and technical education program in agriculture, food, and natural resources, and on students enrolled in the program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 11.

[HB 1244](#) by *Byrd, Dunn (SB 0330 by *Hensley)

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, decreases, from "at least two" to "at least one", the number of physical education class meetings an LEA must require elementary school students to attend each full school week. - Amends TCA Section 49-6-1021.

[HB 0267](#) by *Staples (SB 0273 by *Massey)

Education - As introduced, encourages LEAs to provide an age-appropriate seizure education program to teach students about seizures and seizure disorders; encourages the state board of education to promulgate rules for the development and implementation of seizure education programs. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

[HB 0499](#) by *Eldridge (SB 0062 by *Robinson, Akbari)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to develop rules, to be adopted by the state board of education, that include procedures for providing instruction to students incarcerated in juvenile detention centers for a minimum of four hours each instructional day. - Amends TCA Title 37 and Title 49.

HB 0970 by *Littleton, Carter, Curcio, Farmer (SB 1195 by *White, Roberts)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, allows the department to post its annual report on its website in lieu of distributing the report to certain persons and entities. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1000 by *Beck (SB 0763 by *Yarbro, Crowe)

Education, Higher - As introduced, requires a degree-granting postsecondary educational institution to designate a staff member to serve as a homeless-student liaison to assist homeless students who are enrolled, or planning to enroll, in the institution, and to develop a plan to provide homeless students who are enrolled in the institution access to housing resources. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1058 by *Clemmons (SB 0936 by *Yarbro)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, enacts the "Teacher Residency Program Grant Act"; requires the department to establish and administer a program of grants for university teacher preparation programs and LEAs to create teacher residency programs. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 0215 by *Clemmons, Freeman, Hodges (SB 0259 by *Kyle)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires local education agencies to develop and implement a "Stop the Bleed" program that requires each school in the LEA to place a bleeding control kit within the school; requires the department of education to develop a bleeding control kit training program for LEA employees. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 0070 by *Powers, Sexton J, Byrd (SB 0020 by *Gresham)

Education - As introduced, extends the date of the repeal of the Virtual Public Schools Act from June 30, 2019, to June 30, 2023. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 16.

HB 0307 by *Powers (SB 1373 by *Yager)

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, requires the state board of education to approve a released time course offered by a local board of education for school credit as a special course that offers elective credits for each student who participates; requires instructors of a released time course offered for school credit to be licensed; prohibits the state board of education from requiring prior approval of the curriculum or textbooks of a released time course offered for school credit. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 0689 by *Lamar, Dunn (SB 0831 by *Akbari, Robinson)

Lottery, Scholarships and Programs - As introduced, extends for a student who becomes pregnant during the four-month period immediately preceding the date on which the student completes high school in a Tennessee home school program, obtains a GED® or HiSET®, or graduates from high school, the time within which the student must be admitted to, and enrolled in, an eligible postsecondary institution to be eligible for a Tennessee HOPE scholarship. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4, Part 9.

HB 0094 by *Halford (SB 0058 by *Gilmore)

Education - As introduced, creates the "Tennessee Outdoor Education and Recreation Grant Program." - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 11; Title 49 and Title 70.

HB 0399 by *Parkinson, White , Byrd, Thompson (SB 1261 by *Gresham)

Education - As introduced, requires each local board of education and charter school governing body to adopt a comprehensive code of conduct for each school under the authority of the board or governing body that describes the types of behavior expected from all persons entering on school grounds. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 1374 by *Sexton J (SB 1398 by *Bell)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, decreases the amount of time a change in the designated person to check a school bus utilized for transportation of children with disabilities must be reported to an LEA from 10 days to seven days. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 0767 by *Love (SB 0820 by *Akbari, Gilmore)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires in-service training in restorative justice discipline practices for all employees of an LEA; requires the course of instruction in all public schools to include content designed to educate children on restorative justice discipline practices. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 0808 by *Kumar, Clemmons (SB 1242 by *Gresham)

Education - As introduced, requires an LEA that designates its employees as classified, certified, or any other designation, to assign school nurses employed by the LEA the same designation as assigned to teachers. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1330 by *Haston, White (SB 1058 by *Dickerson, Yarbrow, Akbari, Gilmore)

Education - As introduced, deletes an obsolete provision requiring the office of research and education accountability to report on whether community schools have met their education and community goals to the education committees of the general assembly by November 1, 2018. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 24.

HB 0567 by *White (SB 0310 by *Massey, Yarbrow)

Education - As introduced, directs the Tennessee School for the Deaf, together with the West Tennessee School for the Deaf, to establish a two-year deaf mentor pilot project to assist families and agencies in implementing bilingual and bicultural home-based programming for young children who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deaf-blind. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 10, Part 9.

[HB 0941](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Curcio, Carter, Littleton, Mitchell, Sherrell, Doggett, Garrett, Sanderson, Parkinson, Towns, Ogles, Faison, Camper (SB 0797 by *Johnson, Dickerson, Akbari, Robinson, Gilmore)

Expunction - As introduced, removes \$180 fee for an individual petitioning the court for an expunction of certain criminal offenses; removes \$350 fee for a defendant applying for expunction of an offense following the completion of a diversion program. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 32 and Title 40, Chapter 35.

[HB 0943](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Curcio, Camper, Ogles, Doggett, Littleton, Towns, Parkinson (SB 0799 by *Johnson, Stevens, Crowe)

Salaries and Benefits - As introduced, reinstates service credits and salary increases that were suspended during 2009-2010 for assistant public defenders and assistant district attorneys. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 14, Part 1 and Title 8, Chapter 7, Part 2.

[HB 0642](#) by *Carter, Lamberth, Griffey, Camper, Beck, Littleton (SB 0578 by *Gardenhire)

Public Defenders - As introduced, creates the district public defender appellate division, including authorization for six appellate attorney positions. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 14.

[HB 0942](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Farmer, White, Love, Curcio, Camper, Ogles, Doggett, Cepicky, Terry, Littleton, Parkinson, Towns (SB 0798 by *Johnson, Yager)

Controlled Substances - As introduced, increases the penalty to a Class B felony for 15 grams or more or a Class A felony for 150 grams or more of fentanyl, carfentanil, remifentanil, alfentanil, thiafentanil, or any fentanyl derivative or analogue. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4.

HB 0320 by *Littleton (SB 1185 by *White)

Barbers and/or Cosmetologists - As introduced, redefines "natural hair styling" and removes licensure requirement for engaging in natural hair styling as an occupation. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 3 and Title 62, Chapter 4.

HB 0172 by *Marsh, Carter, Whitson (SB 0210 by *Haile, Bowling)

Cooperatives - As introduced, increases the amount of time members of a cooperative have to return ballots to elect directors of the cooperative by mail from three to five business days. - Amends TCA Title 65, Chapter 25.

HB 1083 by *White , Hardaway (SB 0836 by *Akbari)

Schools, Charter - As introduced, exempts a public charter school that has not been in operation for more than four years from having the school's charter agreement revoked or denied renewal by the school's chartering authority and from having to cease operations immediately following the close of the school year in which the school was identified as a priority school. - Amends TCA Section 49-13-122.

HB 0949 by *Lamberth, Gant, White , Powers, Griffey, Doggett, Cepicky, DeBerry (SB 0805 by *Johnson, Yager)

Scholarships and Financial Aid - As introduced, enacts the Governor's Investment in Vocational Education Act; specifies that financial assistance received for all dual enrollment courses attempted after the fourth dual enrollment course reduces any subsequent award of the Tennessee HOPE scholarship. - Amends TCA Section 49-4-930.

HB 0630 by *Bricken (SB 0567 by *Bowling)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As enacted, authorizes Coffee County to levy a privilege tax of up to 5 percent upon the privilege of occupancy by a two-thirds vote of its governing body. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

HB 0503 by *Eldridge (SB 0918 by *Southerland)

Regional Authorities and Special Districts - As introduced, allows the East Tennessee regional agribusiness marketing authority to develop, market, and promote facilities for warehousing, distribution, light manufacturing, and agribusiness purposes, and enter lease purchase agreements by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote by the board, and removes tax exempt status for any ETRAMA property sold under a lease purchase agreement. - Amends TCA Title 64, Chapter 10, Part 1.

HB 0425 by *Hakeem (SB 0366 by *Gardenhire)

Taxes, Exemption and Credits - As introduced, extends the deadline, from October 1 to December 1 each year, for a lessee or sublessee of a health, educational, and housing facility corporation to file a report listing leased properties and details of the lease and payment in lieu of tax (PILOT) agreements. - Amends TCA Title 13, Chapter 23 and Title 48, Chapter 101, Part 3.

HB 0204 by *Crawford (SB 0072 by *Swann)

Municipal Government - As introduced, requires municipalities to contract with a bank for the deposit of municipal funds; requires periodic evaluation of such contracts. - Amends TCA Title 6.

HB 0930 by *Lamberth, Gant, Hicks (SB 0786 by *Johnson, Bell)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, extends reporting requirement to department of revenue by wholesalers of food, candy, or nonalcoholic beverages regarding net sales of such products to retailers by deleting provision that repeals such requirement on July 1, 2019. - Amends TCA Section 67-6-410.

HB 1265 by *Holt, Littleton, Daniel, Hill T, Eldridge, Keisling, Hicks, Faison, Williams, Cepicky, Hardaway (SB 0513 by *Roberts)

Economic and Community Development - As introduced, enacts the "Fair Accountability and Clarity in Tax Subsidies Act." - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 67.

HB 1271 by *Holt, Shaw, Hill T (SB 0713 by *Stevens, Crowe, Haile)

Taxes, Exemption and Credits - As introduced, exempts from sales and use tax the sale of agricultural trailers and agricultural vehicles. - Amends TCA Title 55 and Title 67.

HB 0527 by *Reedy (SB 1349 by *Yager)

Health Care - As introduced, decreases from five to three business days the amount of time that an ambulance service provider has to furnish to a patient or a patient's authorized representative a copy of the patient's run record or records upon request in writing by the patient or representative. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 7; Title 55; Title 56; Title 68 and Title 71.

HB 0076 by *Sexton C, Hodges (SB 1489 by *Bailey)

Motor Vehicles, Titling and Registration - As introduced, authorizes military and memorial plates to be personalized; requires payment of a fee to defray the costs of designing and manufacturing the personalized plates. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 4.

HB 0860 by *Shaw (SB 1264 by *Gresham)

Election Laws - As introduced, prohibits a person convicted of voter fraud in any state from assisting a person with voting in this state, including early voting and by absentee ballot. - Amends TCA Title 2.

HB 1315 by *Windle (SB 1468 by *Bailey, Robinson, Bowling, White)

Health, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to seek a federal grant from the federal department of health and human services' health resources and services administration, or any other applicable entity, to develop a training program for certified nurse practitioners in treating and processing a minor who is a victim of certain sexual offenses; requires the training program to be free of charge for participants. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 38; Title 39; Title 63 and Title 68.

HB 0331 by *Lynn (SB 0450 by *Bell)

Finance and Administration, Dept. of - As introduced, deletes restriction on size of grant the department is authorized to make to the Tennessee sheriffs' association from statewide automated victim information and notification system fund for management of system; corrects language regarding deposits into such fund. - Amends TCA Section 40-38-505 and Section 67-4-602.

Licenses - As introduced, exempts members of the armed forces stationed within this state and their spouses from licensure requirements to practice professions and occupations regulated by the department of commerce and insurance and the department of health, subject to meeting certain requirements to practice. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 13; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 68, Chapter 1, Part 1.

[HB 0939](#) by *Lamberth, Dunn (SB 0795 by *Johnson, Gresham)

Education - As introduced, extends, from 10 days to 30 days, the period of time after a local board of education orders a student's school assignment within which a parent, guardian, or legal representative may apply to the board for a hearing to challenge the reasonableness of the student's assignment and to request the student's transfer to another school. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

[HB 0479](#) by *Daniel (SB 0147 by *Roberts, Kurita)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the Austin Peay State University, board of trustees to June 30, 2021; creates a separate sunset provision for the university. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 49, Chapter 8.

[HB 0480](#) by *Daniel (SB 0148 by *Roberts, Crowe)

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the East Tennessee State University, board of trustees to June 30, 2021; creates a separate sunset provision for the university. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 49, Chapter 8.

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, allows persons who receive certified occupational training as a prisoner or a student in a high school technical training class to receive equivalent credit toward an occupational license relating to the training received. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 6, Part 1; Title 37; Title 38; Title 41; Title 49; Title 62 and Title 63.

HB 0261 by *Daniel (SB 0196 by *Kelsey)

State Government - As introduced, makes various changes to the Right to Earn a Living Act, including requiring entry regulations, public service restrictions, and statutes to be demonstrably necessary and carefully tailored to fulfill a legitimate public health or safety objective, and allowing persons to petition applicable licensing authorities and bring civil actions when such standard is not met. - Amends TCA Title 1; Title 4; Title 7; Title 38; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 67.

HB 1327 by *Chism, White, Parkinson, Miller, Cooper, Camper, Vaughan (SB 0498 by *Akbari, Robinson)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, authorizes leases entered into between Memphis and business owners holding a restaurant license from the alcoholic beverage commission to include provisions where the rent is calculated on gross sales, including gross sales of alcohol, of the business; prohibits a county from denying the issuance or renewal of a beer permit on the basis of a similar lease. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 1; Title 57, Chapter 4 and Title 57, Chapter 5.

HJR 0151 by *Towns, Camper

Constitutional Amendments - Proposes an amendment to Article I, Section 33 of the Constitution of Tennessee to clarify that slavery and involuntary servitude are prohibited in this state, but that duly convicted inmates can work while incarcerated. -

HB 1416 by *Towns (SB 1219 by *Niceley)

Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA) - As introduced, authorizes persons housed in emergency management agency camps or shelters to possess personal items and portable electronic devices, including mobile telephones and laptop computers. - Amends TCA Title 58.

HB 1134 by *Sherrell (SB 1482 by *Bailey)

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, extends retirement and certain other benefits to state park rangers that are extended to wildlife officers of the Tennessee wildlife resources agency. - Amends TCA Title 7; Title 8; Title 11 and Title 58.

HB 0894 by *Smith (SB 0696 by *Roberts)

Finance and Administration, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to study the feasibility of adding direct primary care as a covered benefit under one or more of the basic health plans approved by the state insurance committee for eligible state employees and to report its findings and recommendations no later than December 31, 2019. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 56; Title 63 and Title 68.

HB 0252 by *Freeman, Beck (SB 0759 by *Yarbro)

State Government - As introduced, requires an agency that requires an examination to be administered to a person applying for a license to engage in an occupation, trade, or profession to provide reasonable accommodations to a person diagnosed with dyslexia. - Amends TCA Title 4.

HB 1120 by *Freeman (SB 1114 by *Yarbro)

State Government - As introduced, creates the state government advisory task force on community resilience. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 68.

HB 0495 by *Halford, Hurt (SB 0172 by *Swann)

Secretary of State - As introduced, clarifies only a natural person or individual may participate in fantasy sports contests offered by fantasy sports operators. - Amends TCA Section 47-18-1602.

HB 1087 by *Bricken (SB 0569 by *Bowling)

Public Employees - As introduced, revises causes of action and damages under the Public Employee Political Freedom Act of 1980; requires court to sanction an employee for a frivolous suit under the Act. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 21 and Title 8, Chapter 50, Part 6.

HB 0247 by *Tillis, Lamberth, Sherrell, Vaughan (SB 1100 by *Dickerson)

State Government - As introduced, establishes daylight saving time as the standard time in Tennessee, subject to authorization to do so from the United States Congress. - Amends TCA Section 4-1-401.

HB 0129 by *Love, Staples (SB 0075 by *Robinson)

State Inmates - As introduced, requires custodians of women prisoners to provide feminine hygiene products, moisturizing soap that is not lye-based, toothbrushes and toothpaste, and any other healthcare product a custodian deems appropriate to women prisoners at no charge and in an appropriate quantity. - Amends TCA Title 41.

HB 0102 by *Hulsey (SB 0350 by *Briggs)

Taxes, Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, extends by one year the manner in which liquor-by-the-drink tax proceeds are distributed to local political subdivisions. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 9; Title 49; Title 57 and Title 67.

HB 0621 by *Hulsey (SB 0585 by *Lundberg)

Public Contracts - As introduced, prescribes certain requirements for the procurement of professional surveying services by a governmental entity. - Amends TCA Title 7 and Title 12, Chapter 4.

HB 0623 by *Hulsey, Holt, Boyd, Smith, Van Huss, Holsclaw, Calfee, Weaver, Russell, Ramsey, Sparks, Carr, Keisling (SB 1237 by *Pody, Briggs, Crowe, Niceley, Rose, White)

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, enables a police officer who is a member of the state retirement system to be eligible for service retirement upon completion of 25 years of creditable service. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.

HB 0071 by *Staples (SB 0181 by *Massey)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, authorizes the sale of alcoholic beverages and beer for consumption on the premises of Zoo Knoxville during the zoo's regular operating hours. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

[HB 0001](#) by *Staples, Sanderson, Camper (SB 0016 by *Dickerson, Akbari, Kyle, Robinson)

Gambling - As introduced, authorizes sports betting in this state only in jurisdictions that approve sports betting by local option election; imposes a 10 percent tax on gaming revenue; distributes 40 percent of the tax to the general fund for general appropriations, 30 percent to Tennessee colleges of applied technologies and community colleges for equipment and capital projects, and 30 percent to local governments for education and infrastructure; establishes the Tennessee gaming commission to regulate sports betting; authorizes the commission to collaborate with the Tennessee bureau of investigation for purposes of enforcement. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 14; Title 38; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 5; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 49 and Title 67.

[HB 1070](#) by *Sanderson, Boyd (SB 1417 by *Dickerson, Pody)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, designates Weir Park in Clay County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-102.

[HB 1075](#) by *Sanderson (SB 0302 by *Yager)

Wine & Wineries - As introduced, creates the Tennessee wine and grape board; establishes the powers and duties of the board; creates the wine and grape fund; provides for the funding of the fund and the manner in which such funds may be used by the board. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 43; Title 57 and Title 67.

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, prohibits municipalities from assessing fees for impoundment of a motor vehicle when the owner was not responsible for the events that caused the impoundment; requires reasonable effort to notify owner of motor vehicles' impoundment and prohibits sale before attempting notice; requires that aggrieved motor vehicle owners be made whole. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Section 36-5-901; Title 40, Chapter 33; Section 54-16-113; Title 55 and Title 66.

[HB 1090](#) by *Keisling (SB 1498 by *Bailey)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, defines "trailer" for purposes of the length restriction on buses operating with trailers attached. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 7, Part 2.

[HB 1332](#) by *Haston (SB 0846 by *Hensley)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, authorizes off-highway vehicles to be operated on all segments of state highways in Perry County. - Amends TCA Section 55-8-185.

[HB 1361](#) by *Calfee (SB 0376 by *Swann)

Mobile Homes and Manufactured Buildings - As introduced, removes from the commissioner of commerce and insurance the authority to impose a monitoring inspection fee on each manufactured home produced in this state. - Amends TCA Title 13; Title 45; Title 47; Title 55; Title 62; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68.

[HB 1267](#) by *Holt (SB 0617 by *Hensley)

Traffic Safety - As introduced, enacts the "Buffering Undo Regulatory Non-Compliance (BURN) Act," which requires local authorities to file certified copies of notices of violation or citations based solely upon evidence obtained from an unmanned traffic enforcement camera with the municipal court or county court. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 8.

HB 1220 by *Potts, Lamar (SB 1107 by *Dickerson)

Traffic Safety - As introduced, establishes requirements for the operation of electric foot scooters. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 1; Title 55, Chapter 10; Title 55, Chapter 12 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

HB 0180 by *Howell, Smith, Weaver (SB 0043 by *Massey)

Transportation, Dept. of - As introduced, authorizes an electronic format of the report provided by the department to each member of the general assembly regarding the status of highway projects in the county or counties represented by the member. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 54; Title 55; Title 65 and Title 67.

HB 0832 by *Howell (SB 1045 by *Kyle)

Traffic Safety - As introduced, prohibits persons from standing or conducting activities in the median of state highways without prior approval from TDOT; creates a Class C misdemeanor offense that requires issuance of a warning citation for a first offense. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 8.
