1. [SB 0237](#) *Southerland, Niceley, Crowe, Lundberg (HB 0084 by *Hicks, Eldridge, Sexton J, Moon, Van Huss, Crawford, Faison, Hill T, Dunn, Carr, Daniel, Hill M, Lafferty, Lamberth, Sexton C, Hazlewood, Zachary)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts from sales and use tax services by car wash facilities, coin-operated or otherwise, where the customer remains in substantial control, care, and custody of the vehicle and the preponderance of the vehicle's wash is completed by the customer or automated equipment. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 2.

2. [SB 0276](#) *Kurita (HB 0237 by *Kumar)

Revenue, Dept. of- As introduced, requires department to conduct a study by January 1, 2020, on how much sales tax is estimated to be collected if remote sellers are required to collect sales tax in this state. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4 and Title 67, Chapter 6.

3. [SB 0259](#) ***Kyle** (HB 0215 by *Clemmons, Freeman, Hodges)
Local Education Agencies- As introduced, requires local education agencies to develop and implement a "Stop the Bleed" program that requires each school in the LEA to place a bleeding control kit within the school; requires the department of education to develop a bleeding control kit training program for LEA employees. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

4. [SB 1351](#) ***Yager, McNally** (HB 1359 by *Calfee, Ragan)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, allocates state sales and use tax revenues from the construction of a uranium processing facility to an eligible industrial development corporation that submits a completed application to the commissioner of finance and administration together with an application fee in an amount established by the department; establishes requirements for such allocation. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

5. [SB 0558](#) ***Johnson** (HB 1028 by *Lynn)
Taxes- As introduced, requires that "net earnings" or "net loss" be defined as federal taxable income or loss according to the federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 20.

6. [SB 0803](#) ***Johnson, Hensley** (HB 0947 by *Lamberth, Gant, Ogles, White , Freeman, Byrd)
Education- As introduced, requires, instead of authorizes, the Tennessee school safety center to establish school safety grants to assist LEAs in funding programs that address school safety; establishes requirements for school safety grant applications and eligibility; requires the Tennessee school safety center to reserve funds for, and give priority in awarding school safety grants to, LEAs with schools that did not have a full-time school resource officer during the 2018-2019 school year. - Amends TCA Section 49-1-1004 and Section 49-6-4302.

7. [SB 0808](#) ***Johnson, Haile, Bowling** (HB 0952 by *Lamberth, Gant, Hurt)
Education- As introduced, transfers, from the state board of education to the department of education, the authority to accept and administer federal funds for the purpose of promoting public education; designates the department of education as the state board for career and technical education; grants the department of education the authority to administer annual appropriations made for career and technical education; removes provision for grants to public four-year institutions of higher education for research in career and technical education. - Amends TCA Section 49-1-202; Title 49, Chapter 11; Section 49-3-201; Section 49-3-302 and Section 49-3-318.

8. [SB 0205](#) *Briggs (HB 0268 by *Hill M, Hodges, Jernigan, Whitson)

School Transportation- As introduced, permits LEAs to install cameras on school buses to record vehicles that unlawfully pass a stopped school bus; allows evidence to be reviewed by law enforcement officers only after evidence is submitted to an LEA by a school bus driver; establishes citations for first and subsequent offenses. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 21 and Title 55, Chapter 8.

9. [SB 0403](#) *Stevens (HB 0167 by *Lamberth, Curcio, Farmer, Gant, White , Casada, Dixie, Griffey, Littleton)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, requires a mandatory 30-day sentence for theft of a firearm; creates the Class D felony offense of bringing a telecommunication device into a penal institution; revises other various provisions of criminal law. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55.

10. [SB 0662](#) *Watson (HB 1270 by *Holt, Lafferty, Dunn, Faison, Daniel, Zachary, Cepicky, Ogles, Hill T, Moody, Crawford)

Federal Aid- As introduced, requires certain state agencies and political subdivisions to prepare and submit reports to the department of finance and administration regarding the effects of and plans for reductions in federal funding. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7 and Title 9.

1. [SB 0459](#) *Akbari, Gilmore (HB 0506 by *Camper)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, adds a minor league soccer franchise in the United Soccer League to the list of professional sports franchises for which a sports authority may be allocated sales tax revenue. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
2. [SB 1213](#) *Crowe (HB 0818 by *Rudder)
Taxes, Business- As introduced, extends the business tax exemption under present law for providing mental or behavioral health services to providers of foster care, therapeutic and rehabilitative care, residential treatment, and other social assistance programs. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 7.
3. [SB 1461](#) *Bailey (HB 1382 by *Williams)
Budget Procedures- As enacted, requires the state funding board to report a single estimate of state revenue for the upcoming fiscal year as opposed to a range or multiple estimates; the board is to present the single estimate to the governor and the chairs of the finance, ways and means committees of the house of representatives and the senate. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 9 and Title 67.
4. [SB 1458](#) *Bailey, Bowling (HB 0605 by *Tillis, Carter, Whitson)
Taxes- As introduced, requires the commissioner of revenue to make a thorough study and investigation of the tax laws of other states. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 65 and Title 67.

5. [SB 1462](#) *Bailey (HB 1410 by *Sherrell, Sexton C)

Taxes- As introduced, clarifies the "Taxpayer Bill of Rights" to require that any tax applications and notices be written in plain language. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 6; Title 7; Title 9; Title 13; Title 45 and Title 67.

6. [SB 1455](#) *Bailey (HB 0695 by *Russell)

Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, creates sales and use tax exemption for sale of public safety and public works-related goods to certain nonprofit property owners associations. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 3.

7. [SB 1460](#) *Bailey, Bowling (HB 0634 by *Halford, Hill T, Sherrell, Lamberth, Byrd, Haston, Russell, Rudder, Tillis, Marsh, Leatherwood, Hurt, Bricken, Carr, Terry, Wright, Hazlewood, Powers, Doggett, Windle, Keisling, Shaw, Holt, Sanderson, Ogles, Williams, Crawford, Helton, Lafferty, Daniel, Kumar, Cochran, Smith, Hicks, Todd, Gant, Littleton, Eldridge, Moon, Moody)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts water furnished by a utility district and used exclusively in a farming operation from sales and use tax. - Amends TCA Title 67.

8. [SB 1161](#) *Kelsey, Kyle, Robinson (HB 1461 by *Casada, White)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, for sales tax purposes, requires a lessee or renter to notify the commissioner of revenue if the lease or rental price of tangible personal property and computer software is calculated on a semi-monthly or quarterly basis. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

9. [SB 1044](#) *Yarbro (HB 1397 by *Kumar)

Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, exempts from real estate transfer tax, the transfer of any real estate where the transferor is a member, stock holder, or partner, the transferee is a limited liability company, corporation, or partnership, and the real estate so conveyed serves as a capital contribution to the business entity; also exempts transfers where the transferor is an LLC, corporation, or partnership, the transferee is an existing member, stock holder, or partner, and the property conveyed services as a distribution from the business entity. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-409.

10. [SB 0382](#) *Yarbro (HB 0382 by *Thompson)

Taxes- As introduced, deletes exemption from sales and use tax for industrial machinery; deletes credit against franchise and excise tax liability for industrial machinery purchases. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4 and Title 67, Chapter 6.

- 11. [SB 0929](#) *Yarbro** (HB 1093 by *Thompson)
Economic and Community Development- As introduced, changes the date by which TACIR must report its findings concerning its study of a franchise and excise tax credit for certain shippers from February 1, 2020, to January 15, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 7 and Title 67.
- 12. [SB 1032](#) *Yarbro** (HB 1345 by *Mitchell)
Taxes, Gasoline, Petroleum Products- As introduced, allows persons operating a terminal in this state to file their report with the department of revenue in electronic format. - Amends TCA Title 67.
- 13. [SB 0988](#) *Stevens** (HB 1024 by *Lynn)
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, requires each board to notify the commissioner of finance and administration when the estimate of board fees for a fiscal year is more than the certified amount of board fees required by the board for that fiscal year. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 9; Title 54; Title 55 and Title 67.
- 14. [SB 0716](#) *Watson** (HB 0641 by *Carter)
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, increases, from 15 to 20, the number of days after the end of each calendar month, within which a qualified public depository must submit to the state treasurer a report of the average daily balance of all secured public deposits held by the depository. - Amends TCA Title 9 and Title 67.
- 15. [SB 0060](#) *Gilmore** (HB 0095 by *Shaw)
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, eliminates the sales tax on feminine hygiene products. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
- 16. [SB 0485](#) *Gardenhire** (HB 0805 by *Haston)
Taxes- As introduced, clarifies that the definition of "sport and recreational equipment" for purposes of sales and use tax includes equipment used for electronic sports or esports. - Amends TCA Title 67.
- 17. [SB 0325](#) *Gardenhire, Kurita** (HB 0326 by *Hicks)
Taxes- As introduced, authorizes electronic transmission of the angel investor tax credit report by the Tennessee technology development corporation. - Amends TCA Title 67; Chapter 72 of the Public Acts of 2011; Chapter 193 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 273 of the Public Acts of 2015; Chapter 452 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 480 of the Public Acts of 2013; Chapter 530 of the Public Acts of 2009 and Chapter 602 of the Public Acts of 2007.

18. [SB 0423](#) *Hensley (HB 0494 by *Doggett, Griffey, Holt, Hill M, Hall, Gant, Hill T, Sexton C, Lamberth, Eldridge, Van Huss, Crawford)

Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, eliminates the special privilege tax on ammunition. - Amends TCA Section 8-8-201 and Title 70, Chapter 3.

19. [SB 0421](#) *Hensley, Crowe (HB 0417 by *Zachary)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts, over a period of three fiscal years, the sales price of tickets for admission to an intercollegiate athletic event hosted by a college or university from the amusement sales tax. - Amends TCA Title 67.

20. [SB 1505](#) *Hensley (HB 1379 by *Zachary)

Taxes, Amusement- As introduced, allocates all amusement tax revenue generated from an event hosted by a college or university to the college or university to be used exclusively for repairs, maintenance, renovation, enhancements, or debt service on facilities funded with approval of the state school bond authority. - Amends TCA Title 67.

1. [SB 0731](#) *Briggs (HB 0891 by *Staples)

Criminal Procedure- As introduced, prohibits a court from accepting any plea agreement that allows an elected public official who is charged with an infamous crime involving an offense committed in the person's official capacity or involving the duties of the person's office from qualifying for, seeking, or holding public office at some point in the future. - Amends TCA Title 2; Title 8, Chapter 18; Title 39 and Title 40.

2. [SB 0473](#) *Haile (HB 0912 by *Keisling, White)

State Symbols- As introduced, designates the poem "My Tennessee," written by Michael McDonald in 1984, as an official state poem of Tennessee. - Amends TCA Section 4-1-303.

3. [SB 0920](#) *Southerland (HB 0290 by *Hawk)

Taxes, Amusement- As introduced, authorizes collection of state amusement tax regardless of whether sale of ticket to the amusement takes place outside Tennessee or is made by a person with no physical presence in Tennessee; authorizes counties to levy local amusement tax for amusements conducted within the county, regardless of whether sale of ticket takes place outside the county; removes exemption from state amusement tax for whitewater rafting. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 2; Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 3 and Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 7.

4. [SB 0434](#) *Bell (HB 0223 by *Faison)

Public Records- As introduced, increases from 10 to 15 days the period by which a state agency releasing public records originating in a county assessor's office must notify the county assessor of property of the recipient of the records. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8 and Title 10, Chapter 7.

5. [SB 0698](#) *Stevens (HB 1272 by *Holt)

Wine & Wineries- As introduced, requires winery with self-distribution permit to surrender permit within 60 days once the winery no longer qualifies to self distribute. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 47; Title 57 and Title 67.

6. [SB 0363](#) *Lundberg (HB 0975 by *Littleton)

Wine & Wineries- As introduced, increases from 18 percent by volume to 24 percent by volume the alcohol content of wine that can be sold in grocery stores; changes the definition of wine for purposes of sales in grocery stores so that wine includes alcohol derived from wine that has added flavorings and additives. - Amends TCA Title 57.

7. [SB 0308](#) *Lundberg (HB 0377 by *Boyd, Marsh, Moon, Hill T, Leatherwood)

Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, requires utilities participating in utility bill round-up programs to provide notice to customers of program and customer rights no later than November 1, 2019; permits utilities to enroll new customers after January 1, 2020, only upon receipt of customer consent; requires utilities to remove customer from program upon receiving opt out notice. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 45; Title 47, Chapter 18 and Title 65.

8. [SB 0621](#) *Hensley, Yager (HB 0644 by *Hill T)

State Employees- As introduced, requires a state agency in any proceeding to suspend, terminate, or discipline an employee in state service to prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the employee violated state law or a rule or policy of the agency prior to taking such action. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8, Chapter 30; Title 9; Title 10 and Title 12.

9. [SJR 0097](#) *Niceley

Constitutional Amendments- Proposes an amendment to Article XI, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Tennessee concerning charitable lotteries to authorize the general assembly to authorize the operation of Bingo games to benefit public and private schools. -

10. [SB 0886](#) *Niceley (HB 0809 by *Kumar, Hill T)

Taxes, Real Property- As introduced, expands definition of agricultural land for purposes of greenbelt property tax program to include two noncontiguous tracts of land within same county totaling at least 15 acres and split only by public or private road. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5, Part 10.

11. [SB 0607](#) *Robinson (HB 0414 by *Lamar)

Public Contracts- As introduced, requires counties and cities to compile data regarding the counties' and cities' purchases from and contracts with businesses owned by women and by minorities; requires such data to be available to the public upon request. - Amends TCA Title 12, Chapter 3 and Title 12, Chapter 4.

12. [SB 0675](#) *Gilmore (HB 1450 by *Camper)

Purchasing and Procurement- As introduced, authorizes the chief procurement officer to submit the annual report on the awarding of purchases to a minority-owned business, woman-owned business, service-disabled veteran-owned business, business owned by persons with disabilities, or small business to the general assembly in electronic format. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 7, Chapter 4; Title 8, Chapter 37, Part 1; Title 12; Title 13, Chapter 29; Section 39-14-137; Title 49; Section 62-43-105 and Title 65, Chapter 5.

13. [SB 0844](#) *Gilmore (HB 1187 by *Chism, Dixie, Littleton, Powell, Van Huss, Halford, Moon, Sparks, Staples)

Veterans- As enacted, eliminates the fee for interment of an eligible veteran's spouse in a state veterans' cemetery. - Amends TCA Title 46, Chapter 6.

14. [SB 0177](#) *Gilmore (HB 0251 by *Freeman)

State Symbols- As introduced, requires the secretary of state to conduct an online poll to determine a nominee to designate as the official state recording artist. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 1, Part 3.

15. [SB 0741](#) *Kyle (HB 1207 by *Mitchell)

Human Services, Dept. of- As introduced, authorizes state agencies to provide child care services for state employees, with the department tasked to approve, administer, and coordinate such services. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 49 and Title 71.

- 16. [SB 0087](#) *Akbari** (HB 0877 by *Dixie, Jernigan, Chism, Potts, Love, Johnson G)
Election Laws- As introduced, extends the time by which a candidate may withdraw, from seven days after the qualifying deadline to 60 days before the election. - Amends TCA Title 2, Chapter 5.
- 17. [SB 0503](#) *Akbari, Robinson** (HB 0768 by *Love)
Election Laws- As introduced, requires county election commissions to conduct a supplemental registration at public and private high schools once each fall and spring semester; authorizes high schools to provide opportunities for students to register to vote online at times other than the supplemental registrations. - Amends TCA Title 2 and Title 49.
- 18. [SB 0829](#) *Akbari, Robinson** (HB 1057 by *Clemmons)
Election Laws- As introduced, extends the time before an election, from 45 days prior to 50 days prior, that a county election commission must publish in a newspaper of general circulation a notice advising elderly voters and voters with a disability that if such voters' polling places are inaccessible, such voters have the right to vote early by absentee ballot or at the election commission office on election day. - Amends TCA Title 2.
- 19. [SB 0501](#) *Akbari, Kyle, Robinson** (HB 1423 by *Towns, Camper, Thompson, Chism, Cooper, Lamar, Sanderson, DeBerry, White , Vaughan, Wright, Smith)
County Government- As introduced, prohibits interpreting or amending county charter in a manner inconsistent with state law with respect to the duties, qualifications, and privileges of the constitutional county offices of sheriff, register, county clerk, assessor of property, or trustee. - Amends TCA Title 5, Chapter 1, Part 2.
- 20. [SB 1150](#) *Akbari, Gilmore** (HB 1240 by *Camper, Dixie, Clemmons)
Prisons and Reformatory Institutions- As introduced, restricts the use of physical restraints on pregnant inmates; requires regular prenatal and postpartum medical care for pregnant inmates; prohibits the use of solitary confinement for pregnant inmates and inmates who have given birth within the past eight weeks. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40; Title 41 and Title 68.
- 21. [SB 0212](#) *Akbari** (HB 0396 by *White)
Fees- As introduced, clarifies that the sales prices for accounting, legal, or other professional services provided within a central business improvement district located within a tourism development zone are not subject to an additional fee. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 88, Part 1.

22. [SB 1354](#) *Yager (HB 0911 by *Keisling)

Election Laws- As introduced, provides notice and a reasonable time period in which a candidate who has been determined by the executive committee of a political party to be unqualified may respond to such determination before removal of the candidate's name from the ballot. - Amends TCA Section 2-5-204.

23. [SB 1363](#) *Yager (HB 1357 by *Calfee)

Metropolitan Government- As introduced, defines the county seat, if the county seat is an incorporated municipality, as the principal city for purposes of county and city consolidation, if the largest city by population in the county fails to adopt a consolidation resolution within 90 days of the county's adoption of a consolidation resolution. - Amends TCA Title 7.

24. [SB 1366](#) *Yager (HB 0603 by *Marsh, White)

Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, allows certain utilities to enter into agreements to provide certain coverage, insurance, or service agreements to customers; allows certain utilities to assist customers in installing or maintaining certain equipment; authorizes the costs for the coverage, insurance, service agreements, and equipment installation and maintenance to be added to customer bills or statements. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 34; Title 7, Chapter 36; Title 7, Chapter 52, Part 1 and Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 3.

25. [SB 1190](#) *White (HB 0295 by *Carr, Farmer)

Codes- As introduced, beginning January 1, 2020, requires electrical inspectors employed by a municipality, a county, or this state to be certified by the state fire marshal; establishes a recertification process for such electrical inspectors every three years; requires certain electrical inspectors under contract with the commissioner of commerce and insurance to be certified on and after January 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 68.

26. [SB 1184](#) *White (HB 0817 by *Helton, Crawford, Carr, Freeman, Ramsey, Carter, Rudd, Calfee, Travis, Johnson G)

Taxes, Real Property- As introduced, removes reference to a repealed provision to clarify the time in which a county board of equalization must complete its assessment reviews. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

27. [SB 0394](#) *Jackson (HB 0391 by *Garrett)

County Government- As introduced, exempts the sheriff of a county from certain bond requirements if the county carries an insurance policy that provides government crime coverage, employee dishonesty coverage, or equivalent coverage. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 1; Title 8, Chapter 19 and Title 8, Chapter 8.

Hearing and Hearing Aids- As introduced, allows the Tennessee council for the deaf, deaf-blind, and hard of hearing to submit its annual report and needs assessment to the governor and general assembly electronically. - Amends TCA Title 7; Title 9; Title 13; Title 24; Title 37; Title 40; Title 49; Title 50; Title 55; Title 60; Title 65 and Title 71.

4. [SB 1084](#) *Dickerson (HB 0868 by *DeBerry, Crawford)
Professions and Occupations- As introduced, removes certain qualifications for the supervision of prospective clinical pastoral therapists; authorizes the board of clinical pastoral therapists to establish its own qualifications for supervisors. - Amends TCA Title 63, Chapter 22, Part 2.

5. [SB 1062](#) *Dickerson, Bowling, Haile, Niceley (HB 0919 by *Terry, Travis, Jernigan, Staples)
Health, Dept. of- As introduced, authorizes electronic transmission of the summary of the data concerning high-volume prescribers and any disciplinary action by the department to the health committees of the senate and house of representatives. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29; Title 4, Chapter 3; Title 38, Chapter 3; Title 39, Chapter 17; Title 43; Title 50; Title 53; Title 63; Title 67 and Title 68.

6. [SB 0266](#) *Reeves (HB 0104 by *Todd, Wright, Leatherwood, Helton, Smith, Gant, Griffey, Cepicky, Daniel)
Boards and Commissions- As introduced, expands the number of legislative committees to which health-related boards must submit reports on board vacancies. - Amends TCA Title 63.

7. [SB 0743](#) *Hensley, Robinson (HB 0422 by *Smith, Helton, White , Reedy, Hardaway)
Professions and Occupations- As introduced, clarifies references to "patient" to mean "human patient" as applied to the practice of nursing; specifies that only persons licensed by the board of nursing may be licensed in the practice of nursing. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 8; Title 55, Chapter 9, Part 4 and Title 63.

Education, Curriculum- As introduced, requires the state board of education to approve a released time course offered by a local board of education for school credit as a special course that offers elective credits for each student who participates; requires instructors of a released time course offered for school credit to be licensed; prohibits the state board of education from requiring prior approval of the curriculum or textbooks of a released time course offered for school credit. - Amends TCA Title 49.

2. [SB 0185](#) *Jackson (HB 0983 by *Todd)

Education- As introduced, allows the department of education to post its annual report on its website in lieu of distributing the report to certain persons and entities. - Amends TCA Title 49.

3. [SB 1035](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1276 by *Holt)

Local Education Agencies- As introduced, requires a local board of education that maintains an internet website and that establishes a program of school-based decision making that authorizes school personnel, including classroom teachers, to decide the school budget to post the adopted school budget on the board's website before the beginning of each school year. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7 and Title 49.

4. [SB 1267](#) *Pody (HB 1394 by *Cepicky)

Education- As introduced, requires the department of education to provide LEAs with access to their students' TCAP and end-of-course assessment items and the students' answers within 60 days following the administration of the assessments; requires an LEA to provide each teacher with access to the teacher's students' assessment information within 90 days following the administration of the assessments; requires that the provided information include all questions posed to students. - Amends TCA Title 49.

5. [SB 0953](#) *Yarbro (HB 1261 by *Dixie, DeBerry)

Education, Dept. of- As introduced, directs the department to establish a process by which the department will reimburse the parent of an economically disadvantaged student for fees and costs associated with taking one advanced placement examination that are not otherwise reimbursed, paid, or subsidized by any entity or program. - Amends TCA Title 49.

6. [SB 0063](#) *Robinson, Crowe (HB 0866 by *DeBerry)

Education, Curriculum- As introduced, expands career and technical education programs to middle school grades; requires the board of career and technical education to plan facilities for comprehensive career and technical training for middle school students. - Amends TCA Title 49.

7. [SB 0170](#) *Robinson, Gilmore (HB 0405 by *Love)

Local Education Agencies- As introduced, requires each local board of education to adopt a policy requiring schools within the LEA to perform an adverse childhood experiences assessment before suspending or expelling a student or requiring a student to attend in-school suspension or alternative school. - Amends TCA Title 49.

Education- As introduced, requires students expelled in grades seven through 12 to attend alternative school; requires a governing body of a public charter school to establish an alternative educational setting for students suspended from the regular school program; prohibits a charter school from expelling a student from school attendance until after the student has been placed in an alternative educational setting. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 13 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

10. [SB 0442](#) *Bell (HB 0091 by *Hicks, Carr, Cochran)

Education- As introduced, authorizes LEAs that receive pre-kindergarten program approval to utilize an alternative academic growth indicator approved by the state board of education and adopted by the LEA, rather than the pre-k/kindergarten growth portfolio model approved by the state board of education in the evaluation of pre-kindergarten and kindergarten teachers. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 1.

11. [SB 1187](#) *Kelsey, White (HB 0769 by *Moody, White)

Education- As introduced, changes from October 31 to October 1 the date by which the departments of education and health are required to jointly compile an annual report to the governor and the general assembly of self-administered medications and healthcare procedures. - Amends TCA Title 49.

12. [SB 0033](#) *Dickerson (HB 0025 by *Jernigan, Hulse, Whitson, Hodges, Potts, Stewart, Ramsey, Clemmons, Love)

Education- As introduced, removes the Tennessee School for the Deaf from the Tennessee School for the Blind facilities beginning with the 2022-2023 school year; changes from Davidson County to middle Tennessee the location at which a Tennessee School for the Deaf branch must operate; prohibits certain schools from sharing certain leadership positions at the same time. - Amends TCA Title 49.

13. [SB 1061](#) *Dickerson, Robinson (HB 1303 by *Baum)

Education, Higher- As introduced, requires the department of correction, in partnership with the Tennessee higher education commission and the board of regents, to develop and submit to the general assembly an annual report detailing the higher education opportunities available to incarcerated individuals in this state. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 41; Title 49 and Title 50.

14. [SB 1058](#) *Dickerson, Yarbrow, Akbari, Gilmore (HB 1330 by *Haston, White)

Education- As introduced, deletes an obsolete provision requiring the office of research and education accountability to report on whether community schools have met their education and community goals to the education committees of the general assembly by November 1, 2018. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 24.

15. [SB 0668](#) *Akbari (HB 0823 by *Love)

Tennessee Higher Education Commission- As introduced, requires, by February 15 of each year, the commission to provide a report to the general assembly detailing any state and federal funds appropriated to, and any matching funds received by, land-grant institutions of higher education in this state. - Amends TCA Title 49.

16. [SB 0820](#) *Akbari, Gilmore (HB 0767 by *Love)

Education, Dept. of- As introduced, requires in-service training in restorative justice discipline practices for all employees of an LEA; requires the course of instruction in all public schools to include content designed to educate children on restorative justice discipline practices. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

17. [SB 0831](#) *Akbari, Robinson (HB 0689 by *Lamar, Dunn)

Lottery, Scholarships and Programs- As introduced, extends for a student who becomes pregnant during the four-month period immediately preceding the date on which the student completes high school in a Tennessee home school program, obtains a GED® or HiSET®, or graduates from high school, the time within which the student must be admitted to, and enrolled in, an eligible postsecondary institution to be eligible for a Tennessee HOPE scholarship. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4, Part 9.

18. [SB 0795](#) *Johnson, Gresham (HB 0939 by *Lamberth, Dunn)

Education- As introduced, extends, from 10 days to 30 days, the period of time after a local board of education orders a student's school assignment within which a parent, guardian, or legal representative may apply to the board for a hearing to challenge the reasonableness of the student's assignment and to request the student's transfer to another school. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

19. [SB 0800](#) *Johnson, Gresham, Crowe (HB 0944 by *Lamberth, Gant, Baum, White)

Education- As introduced, establishes the Governor's Civics Seal to recognize public schools and local education agencies implementing high-quality civic education programs. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 10.

20. [SB 1243](#) *Gresham, Hensley, Pody, Bowling, Reeves, Bailey, Dickerson, Kelsey, Swann, White (HB 1016 by *Weaver, Coley, Van Huss, Kumar, Cepicky, Lafferty, Hall, Ragan, Sanderson, Holt, Doggett, Baum, Helton, Carter, Eldridge, Reedy, Rudd, Rudder, Wright)

Local Education Agencies- As introduced, requires students to pass a civics test to receive a full diploma upon graduation from high school; requires LEAs to include all 100 questions from the United States civics test, instead of only 25 to 50 questions, on the civics test prepared by the LEA; increases from 70 to 75 the percentage of questions a student must correctly answer to pass the civics test. - Amends TCA Title 49.
