- 1. [SB 2158](#) *Johnson** (HB 2227 by *Lamberth, Gant, Vaughan)
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, authorizes tax credits for privilege and excise taxes equal to 75 percent of the purchase price of brownfield property purchased in a tier 3 or tier 4 enhancement county for the purpose of a qualified development project; makes other revisions regarding tax credits for brownfield properties. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-2009.
- 2. [SB 1724](#) *Kyle, Robinson** (HB 1921 by *Lamar)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts feminine hygiene products from sales tax on the annual sales tax holiday. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
- 3. [SB 1810](#) *Yager** (HB 1919 by *Travis)
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, lowers, from \$500,000 to \$100,000, the amount of the required capital investment to be made by a business engaged in an enterprise located in an adventure tourism district to qualify for a job tax credit. - Amends TCA Title 11, Chapter 11, Part 2 and Section 67-4-2109.
- 4. [SB 2059](#) *Niceley** (HB 1853 by *Reedy)
Tobacco, Tobacco Products- As introduced, specifies that rolled hemp is not a cigarette and hemp is not a substitute for tobacco for purposes of clarifying that such products are not subject to the tobacco tax. - Amends TCA Title 43, Chapter 27 and Title 67, Chapter 4.

5. [SB 1979](#) *Stevens (HB 2000 by *Gant)

Taxes, Tobacco, Tobacco Products- As introduced, exempts smokeless nicotine products from the tax on tobacco products and cigarettes. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1001 and Section 67-4-1005.

6. [SB 1905](#) *Robinson (HB 2032 by *Love)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, eliminates the sales tax on diapers and wipes. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 3.

7. [SB 2686](#) *Haile, Gresham (HB 2301 by *Gant, Sexton C, Lynn, Hicks, Todd, Faison, Carter, Halford, Howell, Sexton J, Casada, Johnson C, Tillis, Vaughan, Doggett, Holsclaw, Coley, Zachary, Daniel, Lafferty, Whitson, Terry, Keisling, Eldridge, Cepicky, Haston, Griffey, Travis, Byrd, Jernigan, Marsh, Boyd, Hazlewood, Moon, Littleton)

1. [SB 1958](#) *Crowe (HB 1933 by *Cepicky, Van Huss, Ramsey, Keisling, Howell, Halford, Littleton, Ogles, Carter, Tillis, Casada)

Emergency Communications Districts- As introduced, requires training curriculum for 911 operators and public safety dispatchers to include guidelines for T-CPR; provides immunity from civil liability for a 911 operator or public safety dispatcher who provides T-CPR. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 86; Title 29, Chapter 20 and Title 68.

2. [SB 2161](#) *Johnson (HB 2230 by *Lamberth, Gant)

Finance and Administration, Dept. of- As introduced, authorizes the department to require its employees and contractors who have elevated and privileged access to data and personal information to submit to a background check to be performed by the TBI as a condition of employment. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3.

3. [SB 2162](#) *Johnson (HB 2231 by *Lamberth, Gant)
Finance and Administration, Dept. of- As introduced, renames the office of information resources in the department of finance and administration as the division of strategic technology solutions; makes other revisions related to the department. - Amends TCA Section 2-10-211; Title 3, Chapter 6; Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 10; Section 71-5-192 and Section 71-5-2517.

4. [SB 2173](#) *Johnson (HB 2242 by *Lamberth, Gant, Casada)
Lottery, Corporation- As introduced, lowers amount of prize winnings from \$5,000 to \$3,500 for when the Tennessee education lottery corporation is to provide the department of human services information on an individual collecting such prize. - Amends TCA Section 4-51-133.

5. [SB 1961](#) *Gresham (HB 1633 by *Gant)
Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, requires a municipal utility board or the municipal governing body, and the comptroller, to establish procedures and guidelines for a natural gas utility system to devote revenues derived from the system to fund chambers of commerce or economic and community organizations; requires certain financial reporting by entities receiving such funds. - Amends TCA Section 7-34-115.

Memorials, Recognition- Navy Week, March 30-April 5, 2020 -

7. [SB 1754](#) *Lundberg (HB 1811 by *Wright)
Secretary of State- As introduced, makes various changes concerning filings submitted by different entities to the secretary of state. - Amends TCA Title 43, Chapter 38, Part 11; Title 48, Chapter 101; Title 48, Chapter 11; Title 48, Chapter 228; Title 48, Chapter 247; Title 48, Chapter 249; Title 48, Chapter 26; Title 48, Chapter 51; Title 48, Chapter 66; Title 61, Chapter 1; Title 61, Chapter 2 and Title 61, Chapter 3.

8. [SJR 0835](#) *Roberts
Naming and Designating- "Certified Government Financial Manager Month," March 2020 -

9. [SB 2120](#) *Bowling (HB 2199 by *Tillis)
Taxes, Personal Property- As introduced, authorizes the county trustee to proceed against delinquent taxpayers by retaining an agent to collect delinquent personal property taxes, interest, costs, and attorneys' fees. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

- 10. [SB 2628](#) *Bowling** (HB 2559 by *Rudder)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates Big Foot Adventure in Grundy County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-102.
- 11. [SB 0741](#) *Kyle** (HB 1207 by *Mitchell)
Human Services, Dept. of- As introduced, authorizes state agencies to provide child care services for state employees, with the department tasked to approve, administer, and coordinate such services. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 49 and Title 71.
- 12. [SB 2044](#) *Yager** (HB 2411 by *Ragan)
County Government- As introduced, clarifies that a charter commission member's term of office ends the shorter of two years from the date of election or the date a proposed charter is filed with the county election commission for purposes of filing statements of interest. - Amends TCA Title 2, Chapter 10, Part 1; Title 5, Chapter 1, Part 2; Title 7, Chapter 2 and Title 8, Chapter 50, Part 5.
- 13. [SB 1575](#) *Yager** (HB 1641 by *Hicks)
Pensions and Retirement Benefits- As introduced, makes a person ineligible for a political subdivision's former retirement plan in the TCRS if the person is hired after the political subdivision changes to any other plan offered by the retirement system; requires that any person wishing to establish service credit in the retirement system must establish such service under the terms of the retirement system plan that existed at the time the service was established and not at the time the service was rendered. - Amends TCA Section 8-35-253 and Section 8-37-214.
- 14. [SB 2045](#) *Yager** (HB 2288 by *Beck)
Wine & Wineries- As introduced, prohibits the levy of privilege taxes on wine sold for consumption on the premises at any winery, farm wine producer, or satellite facility. - Amends TCA Section 57-3-207.
- 15. [SB 1798](#) *White** (HB 1630 by *Helton)
Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, clarifies definition of utility district commissioner for purposes of continuing education requirements; revises other related provisions. - Amends TCA Section 7-82-308; Section 7-82-709; Section 68-221-1305; Section 68-221-605; Section 68-221-1009 and Section 68-221-1206.

- 16. [SB 1628](#) *Jackson** (HB 1635 by *Haston)
State Government- As introduced, requires the chief procurement officer, on or before January 1, 2021, to develop rules, policies, procedures, or templates regarding the grant management process that establish a central database of information regarding grant recipients and sub-recipients for monitoring purposes. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 56.
- 17. [SB 2382](#) *Kelsey** (HB 2164 by *Thompson, White)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates the Harbor retirement facilities as premier type tourist resorts for the purpose of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-102.
- 18. [SB 1560](#) *Kelsey, Kyle** (HB 1723 by *Camper)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, authorizes the sale of alcoholic beverages and beer for consumption on the premises of the Memphis Zoo during the zoo's regular operating hours. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-101.
- 19. [SB 1772](#) *Kelsey** (HB 1893 by *DeBerry)
Election Laws- As introduced, requires absentee ballot counting boards to tabulate the results of early and absentee voting at the time the polls are statutorily required to close; requires the absentee ballot counting board to publicly announce the results immediately upon completing the tabulations, even if voters in the county are still waiting in line to vote. - Amends TCA Title 2.
- 20. [SB 1825](#) *Kelsey** (HB 1969 by *Helton)
Planning, Public- As introduced, allows an owner or agent of the owner of land to sell, agree to sell, or negotiate to sell the land by reference to a subdivision plat before the final subdivision plat is approved by the planning commission. - Amends TCA Title 13, Chapter 3; Title 13, Chapter 4 and Title 66.
- 21. [SB 1553](#) *Gardenhire** (HB 1579 by *Hazlewood)
Naming and Designating- As introduced, renames the CSM Bobby G. Davis and BG Carl E. Levi National Guard Armory as the BG Carl E. Levi and CSM Bobby G. Davis National Guard Armory. - Amends Chapter 358 of the Public Acts of 2019.
- 22. [SB 1559](#) *Gardenhire** (HB 1845 by *Smith)
Regional Authorities and Special Districts- As introduced, authorizes senators and representatives to decline appointment or appoint a designee to the board of the management corporation for a central business improvement district or inner-city redevelopment district; prohibits subsequent creation of a district for a period of one year if a petition fails to receive the requisite number of signatures. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 84, Part 5 and Title 7, Chapter 84, Part 6.

23. [SB 1562](#) ***Gardenhire, Bell** (HB 1652 by *Hall, Howell)
Naming and Designating- As introduced, names the entry driveway at the Bradley County Tennessee State Veterans Home the John Simmons Parkway. -
24. [SB 1727](#) ***Gardenhire** (HB 1806 by *Hazlewood)
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, specifies the assumptions that a political subdivision's actuary's report must include when analyzing financing obligations under the political subdivision's pension plan; adds other related revisions. - Amends TCA Title 9, Chapter 3, Part 5.
25. [SB 1941](#) ***Briggs** (HB 1884 by *Wright)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates Willow Creek Golf Club in Knox County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.
26. [SB 1773](#) ***Briggs** (HB 2045 by *Hicks, Lamberth)
Pensions and Retirement Benefits- As introduced, increases to \$75 the minimum amount that the state will match to an employee's optional retirement plan. - Amends TCA Section 3-9-103; Title 8, Chapter 25; Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.
27. [SR 0092](#) ***Dickerson**

1. [SB 0322](#) *Reeves, Jackson (HB 0278 by *Daniel, Smith, Hall, Hardaway)
Commerce and Insurance, Dept. of- As introduced, requires the department to enter into a memorandum of understanding for collaboration in the development of a comprehensive healthcare information system, which must be accessible on the department's website. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 33; Title 56; Title 63 and Title 68.
2. [SB 1343](#) *Massey (HB 1038 by *Moody)
Employees, Employers- As introduced, requires a covered employer under the drug-free workplace program to provide a written copy of the employer's policy on a drug-free workplace to an employee at the employee's request. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 50.
3. [SB 1615](#) *Haile (HB 1606 by *Lamberth)
Landlord and Tenant- As introduced, reduces the statutorily required notice period for termination of residential tenancy to three days in a county with a population more than 75,000 and to 14 days for all other counties in situations where an unauthorized subtenant refuses to vacate the premises. - Amends TCA Title 66.

4. [SB 1857](#) ***Swann, Bailey, Niceley** (HB 2048 by *Williams, Carter)
Real Property- As introduced, prohibits governmental entities from requiring right-of-way dedications from landowners with property located along an existing public right-of-way; authorizes governmental entities to require a right-of-way reservation as a condition of approving any proposed subdivision of property; clarifies that a real estate licensee has no duty to inform any party to a real estate transaction concerning a right-of-way reservation. - Amends TCA Title 13; Title 62 and Title 66.

5. [SB 2144](#) ***Johnson** (HB 2213 by *Lamberth, Gant, Travis)
Professions and Occupations- As introduced, changes the requirements for persons who have an ownership interest in an appraisal management company in order for the company to be registered; removes the current exception to an appraisal management company otherwise being prohibited from removing an appraiser from its appraiser panel or refusing to assign requests for real estate appraisal services to an appraiser without meeting certain requirements. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 39, Part 4.

6. [SB 2146](#) ***Johnson** (HB 2215 by *Lamberth, Gant, Hulsey)
Private Protective Services- As introduced, changes the fingerprint requirement for contract security company licensee applicants and security guard/officer applicants from three sets of classifiable fingerprints to one set of classifiable electronic fingerprints; reduces from three to one the number of photographs a security guard/officer applicant must submit; and makes certain other changes to the Private Protective Services Licensing and Regulatory Act. - Amends TCA Section 40-35-114 and Title 62, Chapter 35.

7. [SB 2165](#) ***Johnson** (HB 2234 by *Lamberth, Gant, Bricken)
Banks and Financial Institutions- As introduced, removes requirement that all individuals who control a private trust company must be family members; authorizes commissioner of financial institutions to publicly disclose any written agreement jointly issued to a bank by the commissioner, FDIC, and federal reserve board or board's designee. - Amends TCA Section 45-2-1603 and Section 45-2-2001.

8. [SB 2166](#) ***Johnson** (HB 2235 by *Lamberth, Gant, Leatherwood)
Financial Institutions, Dept. of- As introduced, allows the commissioner to require applicants for money transmitter licensure to consent to a criminal history records check and to submit a fingerprint sample. - Amends TCA Title 45, Chapter 7, Part 2.

9. [SB 2184](#) ***Johnson** (HB 2251 by *Lamberth, Gant, Haston)
Insurance, Health, Accident- As introduced, extends the Access Tennessee health insurance program from June 30, 2020, to June 30, 2025. - Amends TCA Section 56-7-2916.

1. **SB 1568** *Hensley (HB 1583 by *Doggett)
Sexual Offenders- As introduced, permits a sexual offender to reside, conduct an overnight visit, or be alone with the offender's child unless the offender's parental rights have been or are being terminated or any minor or adult child of the offender was a victim of the sexual offense committed by the offender. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 39.

2. **SB 0590** *Haile (HB 0626 by *Lamberth, Garrett, White)
Public Records- As introduced, authorizes a records custodian to petition a court for an injunction to prohibit a person from making records requests that constitute harassment. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 5 and Title 29.

3. **SB 1418** *Jackson, Bowling (HB 1490 by *Ragan, Powers, Moody)
Abortion- As introduced, enacts the "Life Appropriation Act." - Amends TCA Title 9, Chapter 4, Part 51; Title 67 and Title 68.

4. [SB 2268](#) *Yarbro (HB 2383 by *Powell)

Public Records- As introduced, permits a political subdivision to release the name or photograph of a minor victim of a criminal offense for the purpose of memorializing the victim if the custodial parent or legal guardian of the victim has consented to the release. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7.

5. [SB 2651](#) *Gardenhire (HB 2854 by *Carter)

Statutes of Limitations and Repose- As introduced, specifies that there is no time within which a judgment or decree of a court of record entered in a domestic relations matter must be acted upon. - Amends TCA Title 28 and Title 36.

6. [SB 1800](#) *White, Robinson (HB 1718 by *Littleton, Griffey, Farmer, Lamberth, Hill T, Curcio, Coley, Grills, Whitson, Casada, Carter, Terry, Marsh, Hurt, Ogles, Powers, Wright, Sparks, Reedy, Shaw)

Sexual Offenses- As introduced, increases the maximum age for a victim of aggravated rape of a child from three years of age to eight years of age. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 5.

7. [SB 2629](#) *White (HB 2357 by *Littleton)

Children- As introduced, increases the timeframe within which the mother of a newborn may surrender custody of the child to an approved medical facility without criminal liability from within 72 hours of birth to within two weeks. - Amends TCA Title 36 and Section 68-11-255.

8. [SB 2630](#) *White, Massey, Briggs (HB 2772 by *Moody)

Clerks, Court- As introduced, clarifies the requirements for a clerk of court to assess a fee for electronic filing, including authorization by local rule and compliance with technological standards promulgated by the supreme court. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 21, Part 4.

9. [SB 1747](#) *Lundberg, Dickerson (HB 1643 by *Jernigan, Griffey, Hodges, Tillis, Johnson G, Cepicky, Helton, Beck, Hawk, Rudder, Potts)

Animal Cruelty and Abuse- As introduced, requires a sentencing court to prohibit a defendant convicted of certain offenses against animals from owning any companion animal for at least two years from the date of conviction. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 14, Part 2 and Title 40, Chapter 39, Part 1.

10. [SB 1867](#) *Lundberg (HB 1988 by *Crawford, Hulsey, Curcio)

District Attorneys- As introduced, authorizes up to 12 years of prior service credits as a criminal investigator for law enforcement to creditable service calculation for persons employed as assistant district attorneys general. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 7.

- 11. [SB 1895](#) *Lundberg** (HB 1922 by *Hazlewood)
Sexual Offenders- As introduced, allows a sexual or violent sexual offender to attend a house of worship within the restricted area for the purpose of attending religious services or receiving educational or social services if the offender has notified the house of worship's leader of the person's offender status and received permission from the house of worship leader. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 39.
- 12. [SB 2066](#) *Lundberg** (HB 2590 by *Eldridge, Littleton)
