Environment and Conservation, Department of - As introduced,  
changes due dates and content requirements for reports that the

management. - Amends TCA Section 4-3-506; Section 68-211-305;  
Section 68-212-118 and Section 68-212-212.

Environment and Conservation, Department of - As introduced,  
prohibits the department from administering federal Farm Service Agency  
and Natural Resources Conservation Service programs beyond the extent  
allowable under federal law or regulation. - Amends TCA Title 68 and Title  
69.

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, prohibits political subdivisions from prohibiting the connection or reconnection of a utility service based on the type or source of energy to be delivered to an individual customer. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 65 and Title 68.

**[HB 2733](#) by \*Sexton C, Marsh (SB 2455 by \*Roberts)**

Public Utility Commission - As introduced, extends the time period the general assembly has to confirm an appointment to the commission from 30 days to 90 days. - Amends TCA Title 65, Chapter 1 and Title 65, Chapter 2.

**[HB 2213](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, Travis (SB 2144 by \*Johnson, Southerland)**

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, changes the requirements for persons who have an ownership interest in an appraisal management company in order for the company to be registered; removes the current exception to an appraisal management company otherwise being prohibited from removing an appraiser from its appraiser panel or refusing to assign requests for real estate appraisal services to an appraiser without meeting certain requirements. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 39, Part 4.

**[HB 2215](#) by \*Lamberth, Gant, Hulsey, Griffey (SB 2146 by \*Johnson, Lundberg)**

Private Protective Services - As introduced, changes the fingerprint requirement for contract security company licensee applicants and security guard/officer applicants from three sets of classifiable fingerprints to one set of classifiable electronic fingerprints; reduces from three to one the number of photographs a security guard/officer applicant must submit; and makes certain other changes to the Private Protective Services Licensing and Regulatory Act. - Amends TCA Section 40-35-114 and Title 62, Chapter 35.

**HB 2216 by \*Lamberth, Gant, Lafferty (SB 2147 by \*Johnson, Bowling)**

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, requires automobile clubs to file an application for certificate of authority prior to commencement of operations; makes other related revisions. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 18.

**HB 2234 by \*Lamberth, Gant, Bricken (SB 2165 by \*Johnson)**

Banks and Financial Institutions - As introduced, removes requirement that all individuals who control a private trust company must be family members; authorizes commissioner of financial institutions to publicly disclose any written agreement jointly issued to a bank by the commissioner, FDIC, and federal reserve board or board's designee. - Amends TCA Section 45-2-1603 and Section 45-2-2001.

**HB 2235 by \*Lamberth, Gant, Leatherwood (SB 2166 by \*Johnson)**

Financial Institutions, Dept. of - As introduced, allows the commissioner to require applicants for money transmitter licensure to consent to a criminal history records check and to submit a fingerprint sample; revises other provisions regarding money transmitters. - Amends TCA Title 45, Chapter 7, Part 2.

**HB 2739 by \*Moon (SB 2723 by \*Southerland)**

Cooperatives - As introduced, clarifies that the Rural Electric and Community Services Cooperative Act does not affect, abrogate, or eliminate any obligation of a cooperative's third-party contractors that are permitted by law to operate within the cooperative's service area to comply with applicable permitting requirements that the cooperative is subject to with respect to property that is held or controlled by a railroad company. - Amends TCA Section 65-25-105.

**HB 1843 by \*Reedy (SB 1821 by \*Bowling)**

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, repeals the Locksmith Licensing Act of 2006. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 11; Title 62, Chapter 35 and Title 62, Chapter 76.

**HB 1946 by \*Daniel, Calfee, Moon, Lafferty, Rudd, Hulsey, Doggett, Cepicky, Hardaway (SB 1915 by \*Bowling)**

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, allows members of the United States armed forces and honorably discharged veterans who receive certified occupational training as a member of the United States armed forces to receive equivalent credit toward an occupational license relating to the training received. - Amends TCA Title 58; Title 62 and Title 63.

**HB 1709 by \*Grills (SB 1792 by \*Swann)**

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, requires utility districts, water systems, and wastewater facilities to submit annual reports to the utility management review board or the water and wastewater financing board, as applicable; authorizes the boards to impose sanctions on utility districts, water systems, and wastewater facilities that fail to submit the reports on time. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 3 and Title 68, Chapter 221, Part 10.

Workers Compensation - As introduced, transfers administration of construction service provider registration from the secretary of state to the bureau of workers' compensation. - Amends TCA Title 50, Chapter 6, Part 4 and Title 50, Chapter 6, Part 9.

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**[HB 1589](#) by \*Clemmons, Parkinson, Johnson G (SB 1593 by \*Kyle)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, enacts the "Tennessee Anti-Lunch Shaming Act"; prohibits a school from taking certain actions against a student who cannot pay for a meal, or who has accumulated a meal debt; requires a school to provide a United States department of agriculture reimbursable meal to each student who requests one; requires a school to assist parents and guardians with obtaining free or reduced-price meals for the parent's or guardian's eligible student. - Amends TCA Title 49 and Title 71.

**[HB 1835](#) by \*Johnson C, Hodges, Griffey (SB 1790 by \*Powers)**

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, permits the commissioner to grant an LEA a waiver of average class size limits to assist the LEA with funding a grow your own program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2; Title 49, Chapter 3; Title 49, Chapter 5 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

**[HB 1655](#) by \*Holt, Griffey (SB 2352 by \*Gresham)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires a public school to credit a student who participates in a non-school-sponsored extracurricular activity, or who participates in up to 10 days of basic training required by a branch of the United States armed services, as present for attendance purposes; requires, subject to certain exceptions, a principal, or the principal's designee, to excuse a student from school attendance for up to 10 days to pursue an educational advancement opportunity. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 1657 by \*Holt (SB 2033 by \*Rose)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires, in addition to the United States flag, that the official Tennessee state flag to be displayed on every public school building in this state; requires the commissioner of education to specify the size and quality of the official Tennessee state flags that school districts may purchase and to prescribe rules for the proper care, display, and observance of the official Tennessee state flag. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 2634 by \*Holt (SB 2774 by \*Bell)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires an LEA to allocate prorated daily per pupil state and local funding to an out-of-state residential mental health facility if a student of the LEA is admitted to the facility and certain conditions are met. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 1975 by \*Moody, Ragan, White, Dunn, Sexton J, DeBerry, Haston, Rudder, Cepicky, Dixie, Hurt, Leatherwood (SB 2262 by \*Gresham, Haile, Lundberg, Hensley, Dickerson)**

Education, State Board of - As introduced, adds offenses to the list of offenses for which, upon conviction, the state board of education shall automatically revoke a teacher's or administrator's license. - Amends TCA Section 49-5-417.

**HB 1665 by \*Hodges, Windle, Griffey (SB 1729 by \*Briggs, Robinson)**

Education, Higher - As introduced, requires public institutions of higher education to classify a student who is the spouse or dependent child of a service member as an in-state student for tuition purposes, regardless of the spouse's or dependent child's domicile or place of residence. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 1664 by \*Hodges (SB 1728 by \*Briggs)**

Education, State Board of - As introduced, establishes the grading scale that must be used to assign letter grades to students enrolled in grades nine through 12 for purposes of reporting students' grades for postsecondary financial assistance; specifies that the state board or an LEA may develop a grading system for purposes other than reporting students' grades for postsecondary financial assistance. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 1617 by \*Dixie (SB 1616 by \*Haile)**

Teachers, Principals and School Personnel - As introduced, reduces, from 14 days to three days, the period of time after a local board of education or director of schools makes an initial offer of employment to a person for a teaching position that the person has to accept or reject the offer of employment. - Amends TCA Section 49-5-406.

**HB 1822 by \*Dixie, Love, Clemmons (SB 2578 by \*Yarbro)**

Education - As introduced, authorizes LEAs serving any of the grades three through 12 to offer advanced mathematics courses; requires an LEA that offers advanced mathematics courses to place students achieving a benchmark score as determined by the state board of education on the end-of-grade or end-of-course test in mathematics in an advanced course for the next mathematics course in which the student will enroll; adds other requirements concerning advanced mathematics courses. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**HB 1935 by \*Dunn (SB 1886 by \*Massey)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, authorizes an LEA's local board of education to locate the board's administrative offices within a building owned by the United States government, or an agency or instrumentality of the United States government, pursuant to a lease or easement authorized by the United States government. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 2.

**HB 1974 by \*Dunn, DeBerry, Ragan, Rudder, Cepicky, Dixie, Hurt, Leatherwood, White (SB 2261 by \*Gresham, Haile, Lundberg, Hensley)**

Education, State Board of - As introduced, permits the state board of education to assess reasonable costs against a teacher or administrator when a final order is issued following a contested case hearing in which a teacher or administrator is issued a formal reprimand or the teacher's or administrator's license is denied, non-renewed, suspended, or revoked; requires the state board to promulgate rules for such assessments. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 5, Part 4 and Title 49, Chapter 1, Part 3.

**HB 1993 by \*Dunn, White, Moody (SB 2343 by \*Gresham)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires each LEA to have an open enrollment period in which a parent or guardian of a student may seek to transfer the parent's or guardian's student to a school in the LEA that the student is not zoned to attend. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 2404 by \*Ragan (SB 2350 by \*Gresham)**

Education - As introduced, extends eligibility for the work-based learning student grant program to include students enrolled in a middle college program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 11, Part 9.

**[HB 2407](#) by \*Ragan, White, Griffey (SB 1637 by \*Yager, Massey, Jackson, Powers)**

Education - As introduced, permits a student whose IEP provides testing accommodations to use the same accommodations when taking an assessment under the Tennessee comprehensive assessment program (TCAP) or an end-of-course examination. - Amends TCA Title 49.

**[HB 1687](#) by \*Cepicky, Van Huss, Doggett, Jernigan, DeBerry, Haston, Weaver, Moody, Hurt (SB 1735 by \*Hensley)**

Education, State Board of - As introduced, requires the board to abolish all academic standards for science and social studies for students in kindergarten through grade two; allows the subjects of science and social studies to be incorporated into the curriculum aligned with the academic standards for English language arts for students in kindergarten through grade two. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1.

**[HB 2335](#) by \*Cepicky, Leatherwood (SB 2284 by \*Hensley)**

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to survey all LEAs, public charter schools, and state special schools to determine whether there are enough licensed speech-language pathologists to serve the needs of public school students with speech disorders; requires the department to survey and collect information on speech pathologists' caseloads and workloads; requires the department to report its findings and recommendations to the education committees of the senate and house of representatives by January 15, 2021. - Amends TCA Title 49; Title 56 and Title 63.

**[HB 1691](#) by \*Cepicky, Hill T, Hill M, Ragan, Van Huss, Hurt, DeBerry, Jernigan, Weaver, Moody, Griffey, Sexton J (SB 1738 by \*Hensley)**

Education - As introduced, changes, from August 15 to June 1, the date on which a child must be five years of age to enroll in kindergarten; changes, from September 30 to July 31, the date on which a child determined by the director of schools to be sufficiently mature must be five years of age to enroll in kindergarten. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

**[HB 2001](#) by \*White (SB 1962 by \*Gresham)**

Budget Procedures - As introduced, requires a county legislative body to make revenue estimates and determine the level of revenue necessary to establish a budget for the operation of county schools that is at least equal to the minimum budget required to comply with the local match and maintenance of effort provisions of the BEP; requires the director of schools and the chair of the local board of education to prepare a budget according to the revenue estimates and revenue determinations made by the county legislative body. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 2.

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**[HB 1574](#) by \*Lamberth (SB 1561 by \*Haile)**

Traffic Safety - As introduced, authorizes Sumner County and municipalities within the county to establish special speed limits in school zones. - Amends TCA Section 55-8-152.

**[HB 1596](#) by \*Howell, Jernigan, Moody, Powell, Calfee, Helton, Mitchell (SB 1612 by \*Massey, Dickerson, Robinson)**

Transportation, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to create the office for accessible transportation within the department to provide resources and expertise for expanding and improving accessible transportation in the state. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 23; Title 54 and Title 55.

**[HB 1614](#) by \*Hulsey (SB 1749 by \*Lundberg)**

Motor Vehicles, Titling and Registration - As introduced, authorizes issuance of special purpose boat dealer plates to manufacturers and dealers who hire operators of boat trailers to transport boats to customers. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 4.

**[HB 1677](#) by \*Ramsey (SB 1596 by \*White, Robinson)**

Secretary of State - As introduced, extends from March 1 until March 8 each year, the date by which the secretary of state must transmit to the house of representatives the omnibus list of qualifying applicants to conduct a charitable gaming event in this state; permits rather than requires the secretary of state to develop application and other forms required to obtain approval to conduct a charitable gaming event in this state. - Amends TCA Title 3, Chapter 17.

**HB 2227 by \*Lamberth, Gant, Vaughan (SB 2158 by \*Johnson, Hensley)**

Taxes, Exemption and Credits - As introduced, authorizes tax credits for privilege and excise taxes equal to 75 percent of the purchase price of brownfield property purchased in a tier 3 or tier 4 enhancement county for the purpose of a qualified development project; makes other revisions regarding tax credits for brownfield properties. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-2009.

**HB 2000 by \*Gant (SB 1979 by \*Stevens)**

Taxes, Tobacco, Tobacco Products - As introduced, exempts smokeless nicotine products from the tax on tobacco products and cigarettes. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1001 and Section 67-4-1005.

**HB 1587 by \*Clemmons, Ogles (SB 1644 by \*Kyle)**

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, authorizes LEAs to develop and implement a "Stop the Bleed" program that provides limited civil immunity to LEAs, schools, and LEA employees for personal injuries resulting from the use of items in a bleeding control kit; establishes requirements for the program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

**HB 1544 by \*Staples, Hakeem, Hardaway, Chism, Parkinson, Lamar, Ogles (SB 1831 by \*Akbari)**

Holidays and Days of Special Observance - As introduced, designates Emancipation Day, August 8 each year, as a state legal holiday. - Amends TCA Title 15.

**HB 0618 by \*Windle, Todd (SB 1497 by \*Bailey, Pody)**

Traffic Safety - As introduced, extends the "Slow Poke Law," which prohibits the operation of vehicles in the left lane, except for passing and other purposes, to interstates and multilane divided highways with two or more lanes. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 8, Part 2.

Tennessee Student Assistance Corporation - As introduced, requires TSAC to promulgate rules designating pregnancy as an approved medical leave of absence for purposes of the Tennessee HOPE scholarship. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4.

**[HB 2825](#) by \*Grills (SB 2594 by \*Niceley)**

Administrative Procedure (UAPA) - As introduced, requires an agency that promulgates a new permanent rule to identify and repeal one existing permanent rule. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 5.

**[HB 1951](#) by \*Daniel (SB 2322 by \*Roberts)**

Administrative Procedure (UAPA) - As introduced, requires state agencies to hold rulemaking hearings when promulgating proposed administrative rules that may affect a person's rights. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 5, Part 2.

**[HB 1953](#) by \*Daniel (SB 2769 by \*Bell)**

Administrative Procedure (UAPA) - As introduced, requires each state agency to complete periodic training for purposes of complying with the requirements of the "Regulatory Flexibility Act of 2007." - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 5.

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the board of examiners for architects and engineers to June 30, 2026. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 62, Chapter 2, Part 2.

**[HB 1732](#) by \*Daniel (SB 1654 by \*Roberts)**

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the board of medical examiners to June 30, 2023. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 63, Chapter 6, Part 1.

**[HB 1736](#) by \*Daniel (SB 1658 by \*Roberts)**

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the Civil Defense and Disaster Compact to June 30, 2025. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 58, Chapter 2, Part 4.

**[HB 1740](#) by \*Daniel (SB 1662 by \*Roberts)**

Sunset Laws - As introduced, extends the department of finance and administration to June 30, 2024; requires the department to appear before the government operations committee by June 30, 2020, to update the committee on the department's progress in addressing audit report findings relating to records disposition authorizations. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29 and Title 4, Chapter 3.

**[HB 1749](#) by \*Daniel (SB 1671 by \*Roberts)**
