Memorials, Recognition- 25th anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day as national day of service -

2. [SB 2880](#) *Bailey (HB 2088 by *Travis)

Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, authorizes the state treasurer to enter into agreements with any federal reserve bank, instead of a federal reserve member bank or trust company located in Tennessee, for the purpose of transferring public funds and funds of the Tennessee consolidated retirement system through the facilities of the federal reserve banking system. - Amends TCA Section 9-4-308.

3. [SB 1762](#) *Reeves (HB 1672 by *Russell)

Workers Compensation- As introduced, transfers administration of construction service provider registration from the secretary of state to the bureau of workers' compensation. - Amends TCA Title 50, Chapter 6, Part 4 and Title 50, Chapter 6, Part 9.

4. [SB 1612](#) *Massey, Dickerson, Robinson (HB 1596 by *Howell, Jernigan, Moody, Powell, Calfee, Helton)

Transportation, Dept. of- As introduced, requires the department to create the office for accessible transportation within the department to provide resources and expertise for expanding and improving accessible transportation in the state. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 23; Title 54 and Title 55.

5. [SB 2158](#) *Johnson, Hensley (HB 2227 by *Lamberth, Gant, Vaughan)

Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, authorizes tax credits for privilege and excise taxes equal to 75 percent of the purchase price of brownfield property purchased in a tier 3 or tier 4 enhancement county for the purpose of a qualified development project; makes other revisions regarding tax credits for brownfield properties. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-2009.

1. [SB 2182](#) *Johnson (HB 2249 by *Lamberth, Gant)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, requires marketplace facilitators to remit sales tax. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

2. [SB 2014](#) *White, Johnson (HB 2124 by *Baum)
Taxes- As introduced, increases maximum civil penalty for submitting a fraudulent application for a refund of sales tax paid on appliances bought due to a natural disaster from \$25,000 to \$25,500. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12 and Title 67.

3. [SB 1878](#) *Yarbro (HB 2080 by *Powell)
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, authorizes a franchise and excise tax credit equal to a percentage of the amount of human capital investment, which is defined as the amount incurred or paid by an employer for certain activities, including job training and work education programs. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 9; Title 50 and Title 67.

4. [SB 2799](#) *Akbari (HB 2749 by *Miller)
Taxes- As introduced, enacts the "Taxpayer Protection Act." - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 67.

5. [SB 2854](#) *Bailey (HB 2697 by *Kumar)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, levies a one-cent surcharge on each telephone call made if the call originates in, or is received in, this state. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4 and Title 67, Chapter 6.
6. [SB 2878](#) *Bailey (HB 2734 by *Sexton C)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, changes, from July 1 to July 15, the date by which a list of economically distressed counties eligible for apportionment of sales and use tax revenue to commercial development districts is to be published by the commissioners of finance and administration, economic and community development, and revenue. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
7. [SB 2879](#) *Bailey (HB 2392 by *Hicks)
Taxes- As introduced, deletes the prohibition on apportionment of state sales and use tax revenue to the county revenue partnership fund for fiscal years 2007-2008 and 2008-2009. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5 and Title 67.
8. [SB 1083](#) *Dickerson (HB 0161 by *Beck)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, names the present law that authorizes an allocation of sales and use tax revenue for the use of certain sports authorities the "Sports Authority Appreciation Act." - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 1.
9. [SB 2506](#) *Dickerson (HB 2052 by *Lynn)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, provides an example of the type of entity that falls within the definition of the term "private nonprofit college or university," for purposes of the tax exemption where the title holder of certain tangible personal property used by a contractor or subcontractor is a private nonprofit college or university, - Amends TCA Section 67-6-209.
10. [SB 2507](#) *Dickerson (HB 1927 by *Hicks)
Revenue, Dept. of- As introduced, authorizes the department to identify on its website any municipal sports facility to which sales and use tax revenue apportionment may be reallocated pursuant to statutory authorization. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
11. [SB 2509](#) *Dickerson (HB 2285 by *Beck)
Taxes- As introduced, changes from January 1 to January 31, the date by which the commissioner of revenue must report to the members of the finance, ways and means committees of the house of representatives and the senate with respect to certain franchise and excise tax credits for tax periods ending during the previous fiscal year. - Amends TCA Title 67.

12. [SB 2510](#) *Dickerson (HB 2092 by *Jernigan)

Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, changes the purposes for which surplus revenues collected from the privilege tax on contracted vehicles exiting the Nashville International Airport may be used from a reserve fund for future debt service to the general fund of the county for any county purpose. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 4, Part 2.

13. [SB 2238](#) *Jackson (HB 2314 by *Stewart)

Taxes- As introduced, increases the number of days a person in the armed forces has to pay privilege taxes from 180 days following the conclusion of hostilities in which such person is actually engaged outside the United States or 180 days after such person is transferred from the theater of such hostilities, whichever is sooner, to 240 days following conclusion or 240 days following transfer, whichever is sooner. - Amends TCA Title 67.

14. [SB 2567](#) *Jackson (HB 2828 by *Clemmons)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, terminates the allocation of revenue generated from the 0.5 percent increase in the state sales tax rate that is earmarked for education purposes; terminates the allocation of revenue generated from the 1 percent increase in the state sales tax rate to the state general fund. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

15. [SB 2421](#) *Niceley (HB 2571 by *Sparks)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts the retail sale of fresh, frozen, and canned vegetables for human consumption from the sales tax. - Amends TCA Section 67-6-228.

16. [SB 2424](#) *Niceley (HB 2375 by *Faison)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, grants exemption from taxes imposed on the sale of farm equipment and machinery to out-of-state residents who possess valid certificates of qualification issued by their resident state. - Amends TCA Title 43 and Title 67, Chapter 6.

17. [SB 2372](#) *Reeves (HB 2453 by *Sparks)

Taxes, Privilege- As introduced, directs the Tennessee advisory commission on intergovernmental relations (TACIR) to perform a study and make recommendations regarding privilege taxes on development. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4.

18. [SB 2716](#) *Reeves (HB 2174 by *Todd, Grills, White, Littleton, Van Huss)

Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, exempts tangible personal property from the sales and use tax when sold by a charitable organization for fundraising purposes. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 3.

19. [SB 1905](#) *Robinson (HB 2032 by *Love)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, eliminates the sales tax on diapers and wipes. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 3.

20. [SB 2606](#) *Robinson (HB 2833 by *Towns)
Taxes- As introduced, changes , from January 1 to January 15, the date by which the commissioner of revenue must submit an annual report regarding franchise and excise tax credits for gross premiums and jobs to the finance, ways and means committees of the house of representatives and the senate. - Amends TCA Title 67.

21. [SB 2612](#) *Robinson (HB 2528 by *Hakeem)
Taxes- As introduced, imposes a tax equal to 6.25 percent on all stock purchases made by Tennessee residents; exempts purchases made by retirement accounts. - Amends TCA Title 67.

22. [SB 1979](#) *Stevens (HB 2000 by *Gant)
Taxes, Tobacco, Tobacco Products- As introduced, exempts smokeless nicotine products from the tax on tobacco products and cigarettes. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1001 and Section 67-4-1005.

23. [SB 2279](#) *Stevens (HB 2116 by *Garrett)
Taxes- As introduced, requires the commissioner of revenue to, on a monthly basis, compile and transmit to the chairs of the finance, ways and means committees of both houses, in addition to the appropriate licensing board or agency, a list of taxpayers who are delinquent 90 days or more from the due date of the professional privilege tax. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 4.

24. [SB 2306](#) *Stevens (HB 2637 by *Holt, Cepicky)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, exempts fencing materials used in a farming operation from sales and use taxes. - Amends TCA Title 67.

25. [SB 1810](#) *Yager (HB 1919 by *Travis, Griffey)
Taxes, Exemption and Credits- As introduced, lowers, from \$500,000 to \$100,000, the amount of the required capital investment to be made by a business engaged in an enterprise located in an adventure tourism district to qualify for a job tax credit. - Amends TCA Title 11, Chapter 11, Part 2 and Section 67-4-2109.

26. [SB 2686](#) *Haile, Gresham, White (HB 2301 by *Gant, Sexton C, Lynn, Hicks, Todd, Faison, Carter, Halford, Howell, Sexton J, Casada, Johnson C, Tillis, Vaughan, Doggett, Holsclaw, Coley, Zachary, Daniel, Lafferty, Whitson, Terry, Keisling, Eldridge, Cepicky, Haston, Griffey, Travis, Byrd, Jernigan, Marsh, Boyd, Hazlewood, Moon, Littleton)

Taxes, Excise- As introduced, establishes a statutory mechanism for automatic adjustments to the current excise tax rate of 6.5 percent based on economic conditions. - Amends TCA Section 9-4-5202 and Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 20.

27. [SB 0721](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1268 by *Haston)

Revenue, Dept. of- As introduced, increases from 10 to 12 days the deadline for requesting a formal hearing before the commissioner on adverse action proposed or taken to implement any revenue regulatory or registration law administered by the commissioner, not including those laws relating to assessments or levies of taxes, fees, fines, penalties, interest, or the waiver of penalties. - Amends TCA Title 67.

- 1. [SB 2755](#) *Bell (HB 1797 by *Hall)**
Veterans Services, Dept. of- As introduced, requires the department to provide training in suicide prevention to employees of the department who directly interact with veterans. - Amends TCA Title 58, Chapter 3.
- 2. [SB 2756](#) *Bell (HB 2132 by *Lamberth)**
Public Records- As introduced, enhances requirements for public access to certain public records of governmental entities. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7.

3. [SB 2758](#) ***Bell** (HB 2565 by *Moon, Helton, Hazlewood, Lamberth, Faison, Crawford, Rudd, Hurt, Lafferty, Griffey)

Election Laws- As introduced, requires a chair of the nominating body of a statewide political party or recognized minor party to certify the party's nominees for president and vice president to the coordinator of elections by the first business day in September.
- Amends TCA Title 2, Chapter 13.

4. [SB 2247](#) ***Crowe** (HB 2463 by *Holsclaw)

Privacy, Confidentiality- As introduced, clarifies that certain provisions related to the confidentiality of private records held by public utilities only apply to those records and not to all confidential records. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 5.

5. [SB 1961](#) ***Gresham** (HB 1633 by *Gant)

Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, requires a municipal utility board or the municipal governing body, and the comptroller, to establish procedures and guidelines for a natural gas utility system to devote revenues derived from the system to fund chambers of commerce or economic and community organizations; requires certain financial reporting by entities receiving such funds. - Amends TCA Section 7-34-115.

6. [SB 2835](#) ***Watson** (HB 2899 by *Smith)

Wine & Wineries- As introduced, requires shipment of wine to be in a clearly marked container that is visible to a person four feet away, instead of three feet away, that the container contains alcoholic beverages. - Amends TCA Section 57-3-101; Section 57-3-202; Section 57-3-207 and Section 57-3-217.

7. [SB 2393](#) ***Massey** (HB 2566 by *Wright)

Election Laws- As introduced, authorizes up to two owners of an LLC that owns property in a city to vote in the city's elections. - Amends TCA Title 2, Chapter 2.

8. [SB 2221](#) ***Southerland** (HB 2306 by *Eldridge)

Growth and Development- As introduced, deletes requirements for cities and counties to develop comprehensive growth plans. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 10; Title 6; Title 7; Title 13 and Title 65, Chapter 4.

9. [SB 1753](#) ***Lundberg** (HB 1722 by *Faison)

Beer- As introduced, authorizes beer manufacturers to self-distribute beer within a 100-mile radius of the manufacturer if the manufacturer brews 50,000 gallons or less. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 5.

- 10. [SB 1752](#) *Lundberg** (HB 1801 by *Hulsey, Griffey, Russell)
Pensions and Retirement Benefits- As introduced, makes state correctional officers who are members of the state retirement system eligible for service retirement after completing 25 years of creditable service. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.
- 11. [SB 1862](#) *Lundberg** (HB 1857 by *Hill T)
County Government- As introduced, authorizes a county, upon two-thirds vote of the county legislative body, to dispose of real property at a nominal cost by private negotiation and sale to a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, incorporated under the laws of this state, whose purpose includes educational services to youth in areas including health, science, agriculture, and civic engagement through in-school and after-school programs and school and community clubs and camps. - Amends TCA Title 5.
- 12. [SB 2114](#) *Lundberg** (HB 2656 by *Holsclaw)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates the Log Cabin Inn in Johnson County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of consuming alcoholic beverages on premises. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-102.
- 13. [SB 2243](#) *Lundberg** (HB 2330 by *Crawford)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates Bristol Motor Speedway as a sports authority facility for purposes of the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.
- 14. [SB 1871](#) *Lundberg** (HB 1983 by *Crawford)
Election Laws- As introduced, authorizes the county election commission to appoint as an emergency registrar, the licensed physician attending a hospitalized person when the person requests an emergency ballot; allows such appointment when the hospital administrator is absent. - Amends TCA Title 2 and Title 3.
- 15. [SB 2244](#) *Lundberg** (HB 2329 by *Crawford)
Public Records- As introduced, removes discretion for the registers, or other public officers whose duty it may be to keep an index of public records, to maintain separate indices for records maintained in the office of the county register; authorizes registers and such officers to maintain all indices by electronic means. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 2.
- 16. [SB 1934](#) *Swann, Stevens, Lundberg** (HB 1838 by *Boyd, Curcio, Marsh, Calfee, Moon)
Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, prohibits political subdivisions from prohibiting the connection or reconnection of a utility service based on the type or source of energy to be delivered to an individual customer. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 65 and Title 68.

17. [SB 1929](#) *Swann (HB 1724 by *Moon, Camper, Hicks, Crawford, Marsh)
Utilities, Utility Districts- As introduced, deletes restrictions regarding the compensation for members of the utility district board of commissioners in Blount County. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 82, Part 3.

18. [SJR 0836](#) *Bowling, Bailey, Yager, Massey, Briggs, Johnson
General Assembly, Review Or Ratification of Rules- Ratifies the increase of the 911 surcharge rate to \$1.50 as approved by the Tennessee Emergency Communications Board. -

19. [SB 2367](#) *Pody (HB 2323 by *Powers)
State Symbols- As introduced, designates the poem "My Beloved Tennessee" by Marlene Tidwell as an official state poem. - Amends TCA Section 4-1-303.

20. [SB 1553](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1579 by *Hazlewood)
Naming and Designating- As introduced, renames the CSM Bobby G. Davis and BG Carl E. Levi National Guard Armory as the BG Carl E. Levi and CSM Bobby G. Davis National Guard Armory. - Amends Chapter 358 of the Public Acts of 2019.

21. [SB 1562](#) *Gardenhire, Bell (HB 1652 by *Hall, Howell)
Naming and Designating- As introduced, names the entry driveway at the Bradley County Tennessee State Veterans Home the John Simmons Parkway. -

22. [SR 0092](#) *Dickerson
Naming and Designating- "Don Spain Media Gallery," Senate Hearing Room I in Cordell Hull Building -

23. [SB 1941](#) *Briggs (HB 1884 by *Wright)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates Willow Creek Golf Club in Knox County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

24. [SB 2115](#) *Yager (HB 2355 by *Littleton)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, allows a manufacturer to sell product transferred between different sites owned by the same manufacturer upon certain conditions. - Amends TCA Section 57-3-202.

- 25. [SB 2045](#) *Yager** (HB 2288 by *Beck)
Wine & Wineries- As introduced, prohibits the levy of privilege taxes on wine sold for consumption on the premises at any winery, farm wine producer, or satellite facility. - Amends TCA Section 57-3-207.
- 26. [SB 2126](#) *Reeves** (HB 2115 by *Marsh)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates Sand Creek Farm in Bedford County as a premier type tourist resort for purposes of the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4, Part 1.
- 27. [SB 2375](#) *Reeves** (HB 2467 by *Baum)
Election Laws- As introduced, authorizes the county election commission to notify individuals filing a petition for recall, referendum, or initiative to notify the individuals of any defects in the petition that must be cured prior to certification for final approval. - Amends TCA Title 2.
- 28. [SB 2376](#) *Reeves** (HB 2370 by *Wright)
Registers of Deeds- As introduced, requires either a licensed attorney or the custodian of the original version of an electronic document, instead of the custodian of the electronic version, to certify the electronic document for registration by a county register. - Amends TCA Title 66, Chapter 24, Part 1.
- 29. [SB 2635](#) *White** (HB 2586 by *Littleton)
Holidays and Days of Special Observance- As introduced, designates "Women's Suffrage Day" as a day of special observance. - Amends TCA Title 15, Chapter 2.
- 30. [SB 2631](#) *White** (HB 2805 by *Terry)
State Government- As introduced, prohibits state entities subject to review under the Tennessee governmental entity review law from promulgating rules or adopting policies to exempt members of such entities from rulemaking or policy requirements solely by virtue of their status as members. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29, Part 1.
- 31. [SB 2091](#) *Gardenhire** (HB 2885 by *Weaver)
Holidays and Days of Special Observance- As introduced, designates September 14 of each year as "Star-Spangled Banner Day," a day of special observance. - Amends TCA Title 15, Chapter 2.
- 32. [SB 2831](#) *Gardenhire** (HB 2889 by *Sparks)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, deletes an expired pilot project related to revocation and suspension of licenses and permits held by liquor-by-the-drink licensees and beer permittees. - Amends TCA Title 57.

- 33. [SB 1559](#) *Gardenhire** (HB 1845 by *Smith)

9. [SB 1785](#) *Kyle (HB 2030 by *Love)

Comptroller, State- As introduced, requires the office of research and education accountability to conduct a study of before and after school programs available to K-12 students in this state and issue a report to the speaker and education committee of each chamber by February 1, 2021. - Amends TCA Title 49.
