[HB 2217](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Griffey, Hill T (SB 2148 by *Johnson)

Commerce and Insurance, Dept. of - As introduced, enacts the "Licensing Innovation Act." - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 56, Chapter 1; Title 62 and Title 63.

[HB 2877](#) by *Weaver (SB 2536 by *Pody)

Explosives - As introduced, increases fine that may be assessed against persons who fail to give notice of blasting operations prior to conducting such operations; reduces maximum allowable peak particle velocity limits for blasting site distances; revises other provisions regarding blasting. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 105.

[HB 1472](#) by *Hardaway (SB 1310 by *Kyle)

Business and Commerce - As introduced, enacts certain provisions relative to business or industries undergoing a reduction in operations that negatively impacts employees. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 9; Title 10; Title 50; Title 64 and Title 67.

[HB 1481](#) by *Hardaway (SB 1271 by *Pody)

Uniform Commercial Code - As introduced, makes available to all Tennessee residents the streamlined process in current law for certain public officials to contest Uniform Commercial Code financing statements that they believe to lack any legal basis. - Amends TCA Title 47, Chapter 9, Part 5.

[HB 2807](#) by *Beck (SB 2712 by *Yarbro)

Landlord and Tenant - As introduced, requires landlords in counties with a population greater than 75,000 to provide security deposit alternatives to tenants. - Amends TCA Title 66, Chapter 28.

HB 2449 by *Beck (SB 2430 by *Gilmore)

Real Property - As introduced, requires real property owners to disclose to purchasers or purchasers' representatives or lenders to purchasers, whether the road on which the property is located is a private or public road and the name of the person or entity responsible for its maintenance. - Amends TCA Title 54; Title 55 and Title 66.

HB 1681 by *Haston (SB 1811 by *Hensley)

Real Property - As introduced, authorizes an offeree to cancel a contract or agreement, within 30 days from the offeree signing the agreement or contract, that was entered into following an unsolicited offer to purchase the offeree's real property that was sent through the mail. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 13; Title 39; Title 47; Title 66 and Title 71.

HB 2344 by *Clemmons (SB 2135 by *Gilmore)

Real Property - As introduced, enacts the "Tennessee Source of Income Protection and Fair Access to Housing Act." - Amends TCA Title 66, Chapter 28.

HB 1903 by *Smith, Griffey (SB 2858 by *Gardenhire)

Business and Commerce - As introduced, authorizes the annual report filed by limited liability companies with the secretary of state's office to be filed by electronic means. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 13; Title 42; Title 43; Title 44; Title 45; Title 46; Title 47; Title 48; Title 50; Title 53; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 61; Title 62; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68.

[HB 2400](#) by *Williams (SB 2851 by *Bailey)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, designates as an unfair or deceptive act or practice in violation of the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act of 1977 certain failures by a provider of broadband services to provide the stated upload and download speeds to a consumer; allows the attorney general to assess a civil penalty of \$5,000 to \$15,000 for each violation. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 47, Chapter 18 and Title 65.

[HB 2838](#) by *Farmer (SB 2816 by *Akbari)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, decreases the number of days a business may advertise that the business is going out of business from 90 to 60 days. - Amends TCA Title 47.

Education, Higher - As introduced, extends eligibility for tuition reimbursement provided to members of the Tennessee national guard under the STRONG Act of 2017 to include technical certificates and diplomas and certain graduate programs. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4, Part 10.

[HB 2229](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, White, Holt, Lafferty, Dunn, Todd (SB 2160 by *Johnson, Gresham, Crowe, White)

Education - As introduced, establishes various requirements relating to literacy instruction provided to students in any of the grades kindergarten through two; establishes methods of evaluating the reading proficiency of students in any of the grades kindergarten through three; establishes requirements relating to literacy instruction provided to teaching candidates; establishes various studies and review processes relating to the state's accountability model and the licensure process for teachers. - Amends TCA Title 49.

[HB 1999](#) by *Lynn, White (SB 1881 by *Watson)

Education - As introduced, allows, instead of requires, the chairs of excellence endowment trust funds to be invested in accordance with TCRS policies and guidelines. - Amends TCA Section 49-7-501.

[HB 2589](#) by *Littleton (SB 2633 by *White)

Purchasing and Procurement - As introduced, increases from \$10,000 or more to \$25,000 or more, the amount for which a local board of education or the governing body of a public charter school must make purchases or expenditures by competitive bids; requires the amount to be increased each fiscal year, beginning with the 2021-2022 fiscal year, by the greater of 2 percent or the rate of inflation. - Amends TCA Section 12-3-1212; Section 49-13-111 and Section 49-2-203.

HB 2169 by *Hazlewood (SB 2102 by *Massey)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires an LEA or the governing body of a public charter school that constructs or renovates a school building to install water bottle filling stations. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 13; Title 49, Chapter 2 and Title 49, Chapter 3.

HB 2130 by *Crawford (SB 1558 by *Gardenhire)

Education, Higher - As introduced, declares an act of the general assembly enacted after January 1, 2020, that mandates a discount or waiver of the tuition or fees charged at public institutions of higher education unenforceable against an institution affected by the act unless the general assembly annually appropriates a sum sufficient to fully fund the discount or waiver program at the institution; requires each public institution of higher education to report certain information concerning discount and waiver programs. - Amends TCA Title 8 and Title 49.

HB 1623 by *Ragan (SB 2283 by *Hensley)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the comptroller of the treasury to conduct a performance audit of the department's office for civil rights every two years; requires the department to promulgate rules to assist the office for civil rights with effectuating the office's duty to ensure that the department and programs that receive funding from the department comply with federal civil rights laws. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 49.

HB 2408 by *Ragan, Byrd, Griffey (SB 2348 by *Gresham, Massey)

Education - As introduced, creates the robotics education task force to research opportunities for expansion of robotics education programs in the kindergarten through grade 12 curriculum. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2112 by *Vaughan (SB 2486 by *Dickerson)

Education, Higher - As introduced, requires each institution governed by the board of regents or a state university board to make the grievance procedure for its support staff employees available on its website. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2880 by *Weaver (SB 2231 by *Haile)

Education - As introduced, establishes \$500 as the minimum fine for a person's unlawful trespass onto a school bus or other school premises; makes it an unlawful trespass for certain persons to enter onto a school bus without first obtaining authorization to do so from the bus driver; authorizes an LEA or public charter school to post on its respective school buses notice of a potential trespass violation if a person enters onto the school bus without first obtaining authorization to do so from the bus driver. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 1 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2496 by *Hawk (SB 2719 by *Gresham)

Education, Higher - As introduced, allows, under certain conditions, the advisory boards of the University of Tennessee institutions and state university boards to meet electronically or by other means of communication without a physical quorum present at the location of the meeting given in the meeting notice; changes from April 15 to May 31 the date by which the faculty member and the student member must be appointed to a University of Tennessee institution advisory board. - Amends TCA Section 8-44-108; Section 49-9-501 and Section 49-7-151.

HB 2601 by *Cochran (SB 2503 by *Dickerson, Yarbro)

Education, Higher - As introduced, requires public institutions of higher education to provide certain information to a student about available financial aid to the student, including loans and work study funds, to enable the student to better assess the impact of borrowing. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1976 by *White, Dunn, DeBerry, Haston, Rudder, Cepicky, Hurt, Leatherwood (SB 2260 by *Gresham, Haile, Hensley)

Education, State Board of - As introduced, gives the state board of education administrative subpoena power in connection with investigations related to licensure disciplinary actions. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1, Part 3 and Title 49, Chapter 5.

HB 2105 by *White (SB 2344 by *Gresham, Rose)

Board of Regents - As introduced, revises a provision relating to the level and intended recipients of occupational training and technical education provided by state colleges of applied technology; deletes provisions relating to the creation of certain staff positions for vocational-technical education. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 11, Part 4.

HB 1839 by *Daniel (SB 2339 by *Gresham)

Education, Higher - As introduced, prohibits a governing board of a public institution of higher education from contracting or affiliating with a foreign nation; a political subdivision of a foreign nation; or an organization sponsored, operated, or funded by a foreign nation for the provision or establishment of a program of instruction or a learning center to teach the language or culture of the foreign nation at the public institution of higher education. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2452 by *Cooper, Hardaway, Potts, Dixie, Shaw, Thompson, Johnson G, Stewart, Camper (SB 2407 by *Kyle)

Education - As introduced, requires each local board of education and governing body of a charter school to post the board's or governing body's policy governing background check procedures for contract workers and volunteers to the board's or governing body's website. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 49.

HB 2872 by *Cooper, Hardaway, Potts, Dixie, Shaw, Thompson, Johnson G, Stewart, Camper (SB 2805 by *Akbari)

Education - As introduced, authorizes an LEA that develops its own adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) training program for the LEA's school personnel to offer that program partially or wholly online. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2761 by *Ogles (SB 2209 by *Johnson)

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, authorizes each LEA and school that offers a firearm safety class or program to elementary-school students to post the curriculum and any corresponding educational materials on the school's or LEA's website. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2462 by *White (SB 2784 by *Bell, Crowe)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, prohibits a parent or guardian of a student who has accumulated five or more days of unexcused absences during the school year from withdrawing the student from school during the school year in a month other than the first month of a school semester; creates exceptions to the general prohibition in certain circumstances. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2461 by *White, Littleton (SB 2088 by *Haile)

Child Abuse - As introduced, creates a procedure for school teachers, school officials, and other school personnel to follow in regard to reporting suspected child abuse or child sexual abuse. - Amends TCA Title 37 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2712 by *Cochran, Hicks (SB 2584 by *Rose)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, revises the requirements for the first and second tiers of a local board of education's progressive truancy intervention plan. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 30.

HB 2123 by *Baum (SB 2061 by *White)

Basic Education Program (BEP) - As introduced, increases the number of BEP funded full-time public school nurse positions from one for every 3,000 students to one for every 2,500 students. - Amends TCA Title 49 and Title 68, Chapter 1, Part 12.

HB 1687 by *Cepicky, Van Huss, Doggett, Jernigan, DeBerry, Haston, Weaver, Moody, Hurt (SB 1735 by *Hensley)

Education, State Board of - As introduced, requires the board to abolish all academic standards for science and social studies for students in kindergarten through grade two; allows the subjects of science and social studies to be incorporated into the curriculum aligned with the academic standards for English language arts for students in kindergarten through grade two. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1.

HB 1688 by *Cepicky, Ragan, Van Huss, Hurt, Lafferty, DeBerry, Weaver, Moody (SB 1739 by *Hensley)

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, deletes requirement for LEAs to provide a physical education class taught by a licensed teacher with an endorsement in physical education or by a specialist in physical education; deletes reporting requirements; requires each LEA to integrate at least two 25- minute periods of physical activity into each school day. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 1689 by *Cepicky, Doggett, Lamberth, Gant, Hill T, Hill M, Van Huss, Hurt, Sexton C, Lafferty, Faison, Weaver, Moody, Cochran, Griffey, Moon, Sherrell, Reedy, Holsclaw, Johnson C, Crawford, Holt, Tillis, Powers, Byrd, Carr, Leatherwood, Rudder, Ragan, Hulse, Rudd, Todd, Wright, Hall, Sparks, Grills, Casada, Hazlewood, Whitson, Hicks, Kumar, Eldridge, Sexton J (SB 1736 by *Hensley)

Students - As introduced, prohibits a student from participating in a single-sex interscholastic sport or athletic event provided by the student's public school unless the student verifies with the public school that the student is of the respective sex. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1691 by *Cepicky, Hill T, Hill M, Ragan, Van Huss, Hurt, DeBerry, Jernigan, Weaver, Moody, Griffey, Sexton J (SB 1738 by *Hensley)

Education - As introduced, changes, from August 15 to June 1, the date on which a child must be five years of age to enroll in kindergarten; changes, from September 30 to July 31, the date on which a child determined by the director of schools to be sufficiently mature must be five years of age to enroll in kindergarten. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2440 by *Cepicky, Hurt (SB 2568 by *Jackson)

Education - As introduced, establishes a reporting date of January 15 of each year for the board of regents, each state university board, and the board of trustees of University of Tennessee to submit a report summarizing grievance activities for the previous year to the education committees. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2134 by *Cepicky, Howell, Hill M, Rudder, Hurt, Hall, DeBerry, Hodges, Towns, Van Huss, Sexton J, Griffey, Hill T, Moon, Sherrell, Reedy, Lafferty, Johnson C, Holsclaw, Crawford, Weaver, Holt, Powers, Byrd, Carr, Tillis, Hulsey, Todd, Vaughan, Rudd, Coley, Wright, Garrett, Grills, Sparks, Casada, Hazlewood, Helton, Hakeem, Faison, Ramsey, Eldridge, Doggett, Kumar, Marsh, Littleton, Baum, Ragan, Daniel, Halford, Calfee, Farmer, Moody, Hawk, Jernigan, Potts, Lamar, Zachary, Lamberth, Russell, Gant, Williams, Keisling, Smith, Staples, Bricken, Sexton C, Haston (SB 2252 by *Hensley, Powers, White)

Education - As introduced, enacts the "Teacher's Discipline Act"; establishes a disciplinary process for students who have been removed from the classroom by the teacher. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1692 by *Cepicky, Doggett, Gant, Hill T, Ragan, Van Huss, Hurt, Baum, DeBerry, Haston, Moody, Griffey (SB 1740 by *Hensley)

Education - As introduced, requires a student in any grade kindergarten through three to attend summer school if the student's teacher determines that the student is not academically prepared to advance to the next grade level and that grade retention may benefit the student. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2002 by *Cepicky, DeBerry (SB 2035 by *Hensley)

Education - As introduced, outlines workload considerations for the state board of education when establishing the maximum class size and caseload standards for instructional personnel and teachers having primary responsibility for a student's individualized education program (IEP) or a classroom that includes students with disabilities or students eligible for special education services; establishes workload calculations for purposes of an LEA's request for a waiver from mandatory maximum class sizes, average class sizes, or caseload standards. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2267 by *Lamberth, Gant, Haston (SB 2200 by *Johnson, Haile)

Education - As introduced, requires the department of education, in coordination with the department of mental health and substance abuse services, to submit a report to the education committees of the senate and house of representatives regarding state-funded mental and behavioral health services available to elementary and secondary school students on or before December 31 of each year. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 16; Title 33 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2021 by *Terry, Baum (SB 2063 by *White)

Basic Education Program (BEP) - As introduced, changes, from November 1 to November 15, the date by which the BEP review committee must provide its annual report on the BEP. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2135 by *Smith, Lamberth (SB 2089 by *Haile, Johnson, Gresham, Kelsey)

Education - As introduced, changes, beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the counties within which each LEA must implement a program of family life education from counties with a pregnancy rate of 19.5 pregnancies for every 1,000 females ages 15 to 17 to counties with a pregnancy rate of 19.5 pregnancies for every 1,000 females ages 15 to 19; prohibits persons present on school property from making abortion referrals or from otherwise advocating or encouraging abortion. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1; Title 49, Chapter 2; Title 49, Chapter 5 and Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 0420 by *Smith (SB 0460 by *Akbari)

Education - As introduced, requires the department of education to submit the annual report detailing the operation of the virtual education programs to the comptroller of the treasury. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 1966 by *Haston, Parkinson, White (SB 1947 by *Hensley)

Education - As introduced, creates the rural at-risk pre-kindergarten fund to provide an additional source of funding for local education agencies operating an approved voluntary pre-kindergarten program in a distressed rural county or in an at-risk county that demonstrate a need for additional seats in the program. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 1.

HB 2542 by *Powers (SB 2473 by *Yager)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires a public school to excuse a student from school to attend a released time course if requested by the student's parent or legal guardian even if the local board of education has not adopted a policy on released time courses; authorizes local boards of education to transport students attending a released time course to and from the place of instruction if the entity providing the instruction reimburses the LEA for the services. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2438 by *Terry, Griffey, Van Huss, Cepicky, Doggett, Moody, Hill T, Kumar, Hill M, Hall, Eldridge, Sexton J, Ogles, Boyd (SB 2781 by *Bell, White)

Education, Higher - As introduced, prohibits a state institution of higher education from discriminating against a student based on the political viewpoint expressed by the student; prohibits an institution from penalizing, rewarding, or grading a student's coursework based on the political viewpoint expressed by the student; authorizes a student to pursue a cause of action against an institution for discriminating against the student based on the political viewpoint expressed by the student. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2527 by *Hakeem, Clemmons (SB 2411 by *Robinson)

Education, Curriculum - As introduced, requires the state board of education to develop standards, and the department of education to develop an aligned curriculum, for instruction on healthy relationships in the lifetime wellness standards. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 10.

HB 2736 by *Williams (SB 2872 by *Bailey)

State Employees - As introduced, clarifies that online and alternative delivery fees are covered by the tuition and fee waiver for full-time state employees. - Amends TCA Section 8-50-114.

HB 2409 by *Ragan (SB 2345 by *Gresham)

Education - As introduced, requires organizations to use high-quality instructional materials to be eligible for a LEAP grant; gives preference in the award of LEAP grants to applicants offering summer programs focused on closing literacy gaps among students entering grades one through three. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6, Part 7.

HB 2300 by *Haston (SB 2512 by *Dickerson)

Education - As introduced, removes the requirement that the department of education annually assign an A, B, C, D, or F letter grade to schools based on student achievement and the results of state-mandated student assessments. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1, Part 2.

HB 2595 by *Dixie (SB 2560 by *Robinson)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, requires an LEA to include media literacy skills in a character education curriculum; encourages the department of education to post media literacy resources for LEAs to the department's website. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 6.

HB 2755 by *DeBerry (SB 2249 by *Robinson, Yager)

Basic Education Program (BEP) - As introduced, requires, beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the BEP to fund one full-time public school nurse position for each school in an LEA. - Amends TCA Title 49 and Title 68.

HB 2756 by *DeBerry (SB 2559 by *Robinson)

Basic Education Program (BEP) - As introduced, requires, beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the BEP formula to fund at least one full-time mental health counselor position for each school in an LEA. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2707 by *Clemmons, Hodges (SB 2604 by *Robinson)

Education - As introduced, prompts the state board of education and the department of safety to update the DARE curriculum as new forms of substance abuse are identified. - Amends TCA Title 49.

HB 2460 by *White (SB 1982 by *Stevens, Gilmore)

Education - As introduced, directs the department of labor and workforce development to establish a three-year pilot program to assist adults 19 years of age or older with obtaining a high school diploma. - Amends TCA Title 49.

[HB 2735](#) by *Sexton C (SB 2873 by *Bailey)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the commissioner to give 15 days' notice in writing, instead of 10 days' notice in writing, to a teacher, principal, supervisor, or other official who has been found guilty of immoral conduct, before revoking the person's license. - Amends TCA Title 49.

[HB 1934](#) by *Dunn (SB 2337 by *Gresham)

Education, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the commissioner to obtain approval from the state board of education for any changes to the performance goals and measures for schools and LEAs; requires the department and the state board to seek input from stakeholders regarding proposed changes to performance goals and measures for schools and LEAs; authorizes the state board to promulgate rules to effectuate this bill. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 1.

[HB 1936](#) by *Dunn (SB 1953 by *Haile)

HB 2380 by *Hulsey (SB 1964 by *Crowe)

Sexual Offenses - As introduced, increases the penalty for statutory rape to a Class C felony when the victim is 13 or 14 years of age and the defendant is at least four years older; requires a defendant convicted under such circumstances to register as a sexual offender; prohibits a court from granting judicial diversion to a defendant under such circumstances. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40.

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, creates the Class E felony of assault of a public servant, which is assaulting a person known to be a law enforcement officer, first responder, or healthcare provider while that person is engaged in official duties. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13.

HB 0989 by *Littleton (SB 0755 by *Roberts)

Children's Services, Dept. of - As introduced, changes from March 1 to April 1 the date by which the department must appear before the appropriate committees in the senate and the house of representatives for a review of the department's policies that affect the children it serves. - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 34; Title 36; Title 37; Title 41; Title 49; Title 68 and Title 71.

HB 2584 by *Littleton, Griffey (SB 1926 by *White, Briggs)

Sexual Offenders - As introduced, expands the sexual offenses for which a defendant is required to submit to an evaluation for and be subject to a standardized plan of sex offender treatment as part of the defendant's sentence. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 7.

HB 2356 by *Littleton, Lamberth (SB 2318 by *Roberts)

Sexual Offenses - As introduced, states that a victim of sexual battery is incapable of consenting to sexual contact with a physician, psychologist, therapist, or certain other professionals during the course of receiving treatment for a mental, emotional, or physical condition or interpersonal relationship. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 5.

HB 0852 by *Griffey, Hodges, Whitson, Freeman (SB 1277 by *Pody)

Animal Cruelty and Abuse - As introduced, enhances the punishment for a second or subsequent conviction of aggravated cruelty to animals or a first conviction of aggravated cruelty to animals involving five or more animals, from a Class E felony to a Class C felony with a mandatory minimum sentence of 180 days; requires that 100 percent of the minimum sentence be served. - Amends TCA Title 29, Chapter 3; Title 39; Title 63, Chapter 12 and Title 66.

HB 1130 by *Hazlewood (SB 0732 by *Lundberg)

Bail, Bail Bonds - As introduced, specifies that the receipt required to be furnished by a professional bondsman to any person who transacts business with the bondsman may be written or electronic. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 11.

HB 1922 by *Hazlewood (SB 1895 by *Lundberg)

Sexual Offenders - As introduced, allows a sexual or violent sexual offender to attend a house of worship within the restricted area for the purpose of attending religious services or receiving educational or social services if the offender has notified the house of worship's leader of the person's offender status and received permission from the house of worship leader. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 39.

HB 2630 by *Tillis, Dunn, Bricken, Byrd, Marsh, Cepicky, Holsclaw, Hill T, Shaw, Powell, Ramsey, Freeman, Whitson, Jernigan, Carr, Crawford, Calfee (SB 2104 by *Massey, Briggs, Crowe, Yager, Swann, Southerland)

Tennessee Bureau of Investigation - As introduced, requires the bureau to provide oversight for and implement a program to assist in the locating of missing, vulnerable citizens, called the Silver Alert program, that will supersede the Care Alert program. - Amends TCA Title 38, Chapter 6.

HB 2663 by *Grills (SB 2399 by *Hensley)

Weapons - As introduced, identifies a blackjack and stun baton as examples of prohibited weapons for purposes of offense of possessing implements for the infliction of serious bodily injury or death. - Amends TCA Section 39-17-1302.

HB 2104 by *Love (SB 2046 by *Yarbro)

Finance and Administration, Dept. of - As introduced, creates the Tennessee violence intervention program within the department's office of criminal justice programs to invest in evidence-based violence reduction initiatives. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 38, Chapter 6; Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 2034 by *Love (SB 1850 by *Akbari)

Controlled Substances - As introduced, reduces, from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C misdemeanor, the offenses of knowing possession, casual exchange, and distribution of small amounts of marijuana; establishes early release eligibility for nonviolent offenders convicted of Class A misdemeanor marijuana offense. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 41.

HB 2741 by *Miller, Clemmons (SB 2441 by *Kyle)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, creates an exception to the offense of simple possession of marijuana for persons with a valid, state-issued medical marijuana identification card who obtained the marijuana pursuant to a valid physician's recommendation. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4.

HB 2804 by *Chism (SB 1848 by *Akbari)

Controlled Substances - As introduced, requires a court to grant judicial diversion for possession of less than one ounce of marijuana, regardless of a defendant's prior criminal convictions. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 1186 by *Chism, Hardaway (SB 0656 by *Robinson)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, revises the penalties for theft of property. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Section 40-32-101.

HB 2426 by *Mitchell, Griffey (SB 2403 by *Kyle)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, increases the penalty for failure of a driver involved in a motor vehicle accident to stop at the scene of the accident from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class E felony when the person knew or should have known that the accident resulted in injury. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55.

HB 2482 by *Freeman, Clemmons, Jernigan (SB 2388 by *Robinson)

Tennessee Bureau of Investigation - As introduced, requires the bureau to develop and implement an electronic tracking system for sexual assault evidence collection kits released to a law enforcement agency at the conclusion of a forensic medical examination; requires law enforcement agencies, upon receipt of a DNA data analysis report from the bureau, to notify the victim of a DNA databank match and provide the victim with a copy of the forensic analysis report. - Amends TCA Title 38, Chapter 6 and Title 39.

HB 2598 by *Faison, Dixie (SB 2806 by *Akbari)

Bail, Bail Bonds - As introduced, lengthens, from 180 days to 190 days, the period of time that must expire from the date a defendant's surety is served with scire facias or scire facias is returned to the clerk unserved or undelivered, before the court may enter judgment against the defendant for the amount of the bail. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 1417 by *Towns (SB 0742 by *Kyle)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, increases the penalty for aggravated assault and reckless endangerment when committed from within a motor vehicle; requires the court to revoke a defendant's license for up to one year following any period of confinement imposed; requires that a motor vehicle used in a second or subsequent offense be seized and forfeited. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13 and Title 40.

HB 1424 by *Towns (SB 0843 by *Akbari)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, increases the penalty from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class E felony for the failure to report known or suspected child sexual abuse. - Amends TCA Title 37, Chapter 1.

HB 1608 by *Staples, Byrd (SB 1601 by *Briggs)

Elder Abuse - As introduced, enacts the "Safe Seniors Act of 2020." - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 71.

HB 1610 by *Staples (SB 1898 by *Robinson)

Controlled Substances - As introduced, authorizes counties to hold referendum elections to authorize the growing, processing, manufacture, delivery, and retail sale of marijuana within jurisdictional boundaries; decriminalizes the possession of small amounts of marijuana statewide. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4; Title 40; Title 53; Title 67 and Title 68.

HB 2816 by *Ogles (SB 2674 by *Johnson)

Correction, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to prepare and provide a report on the initial and ongoing training received by probation and parole officers regarding graduated sanctions for violations of supervision conditions upon request by a standing committee of the general assembly. - Amends TCA Title 36; Title 39; Title 40; Title 41 and Title 71, Chapter 6.

HB 2762 by *Ogles (SB 2673 by *Johnson)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, requires each district attorney general to make a one-time report on or before February 1, 2021, to the judiciary committees of the senate and house of representatives as to the number of cases the district attorney general is handling in their jurisdiction regarding reports of threats to school employees and reports of threats of harm communicated in a school setting. - Amends TCA Title 38; Title 39 and Title 49.

HB 2763 by *Ogles (SB 2676 by *Johnson)

Evidence - As introduced, changes from within 60 days to within 30 days from the date the police take possession of a sexual assault evidence collection kit that police must submit the kit to the Tennessee bureau of investigation. - Amends TCA Title 38; Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 2126 by *Ogles (SB 2211 by *Johnson)

Evidence - As introduced, requires a local law enforcement agency to submit a sexual assault evidence collection kit to the state crime lab or other similar qualified laboratory for testing within 45 days of a victim filing a police report, rather than within 60 days. - Amends TCA Title 38, Chapter 6 and Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 5.

HJR 0817 by *Ogles

Constitutional Amendments - Proposes an amendment to Article II of the Tennessee Constitution that would grant the legislature the power to authorize capital punishment for certain criminal offenses. -

HB 2620 by *Curcio, Griffey (SB 2273 by *Stevens)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, raises the permissible fine for aggravated assault to no more than \$15,000, in addition to any authorized term of imprisonment. - Amends TCA Title 39.

HB 2621 by *Curcio (SB 2276 by *Stevens)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, clarifies that the term "crime of violence" in regard to weapons offenses includes aggravated rape of a child rather than especially aggravated rape of a child. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 16; Title 33; Title 36; Title 37; Title 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 49 and Title 70.

HB 1131 by *Curcio (SB 0409 by *Stevens)

Bail, Bail Bonds - As introduced, creates a rebuttable presumption that a person charged with a bailable offense will not violate the conditions of their release if the offense is expungeable and the person has not been previously convicted of an offense that is ineligible for expunction. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 11 and Title 40, Chapter 7.

HB 2280 by *Curcio (SB 2275 by *Stevens)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, requires an agent or officer of the Tennessee bureau of investigation, in addition to a law enforcement officer, to provide a minor with the Tennessee human trafficking resource center hotline and release the minor to a parent's or guardian's custody or transport the minor to a shelter when the minor is taken into custody for suspicion of committing the offense of prostitution. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 39; Title 40 and Title 71.

HB 2003 by *Curcio (SB 2004 by *Bowling)

Criminal Procedure - As introduced, allows the treasurer's report on the amount of any surplus in the electronic monitoring indigency fund to be reported to the commissioner of finance and administration electronically. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40; Title 55 and Title 69.

HB 2275 by *Curcio (SB 2749 by *Bell)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, deletes the offense of impersonation of a licensed professional. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 16, Part 3.

HB 2388 by *Camper (SB 1836 by *Akbari)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, prohibits law enforcement from altering a photograph of a suspect prior to presenting the photograph to a witness as part of a police lineup; prohibits the admission of an identification that resulted from a police lineup using an altered photograph. - Amends TCA Title 24, Chapter 7; Title 38 and Title 40.

HB 1625 by *Parkinson (SB 1617 by *Robinson)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, creates the offense of mail theft, which is intentionally obtaining mail from another person's mailbox or premises without the consent of the addressee and with the intent to deprive the addressee of the mail. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 14, Part 1.

HB 1818 by *Parkinson (SB 1805 by *Robinson)

Checks, Deferred Presentments - As introduced, includes equipment used to counterfeit checks using valid routing numbers in the offense of criminal simulation; requires check cashing companies and other companies who cash checks for a consideration to keep certain records on persons attempting to cash checks. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 14, Part 1 and Title 45, Chapter 18.

HB 2850 by *Parkinson, Clemmons (SB 2613 by *Robinson)

Controlled Substances - As introduced, increases the amount of marijuana possessed or exchanged under the offenses of simple possession or casual exchange from less than one-half ounce to less than one ounce; prohibits the inference of purpose of selling or otherwise dispensing solely from the simple possession or casual exchange of less than one ounce of marijuana. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40.

HJR 0821 by *Hardaway, Hodges, Clemmons

Memorials, Government Officials - Urges U.S. Attorneys to pursue criminal charges against persons discharging firearms in violation of state or federal laws on the interstate system and other federal highways in Tennessee. -

HB 1577 by *Hardaway, Carter, Griffey (SB 2447 by *Kyle)

Domestic Violence - As introduced, requires a magistrate imposing global positioning monitoring on a defendant as a condition for bail for an offense involving domestic violence to inform the victim of how to obtain a copy of the defendant's conditions of bail including any geographic restrictions. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 4.

HB 1471 by *Hardaway (SB 1322 by *Kyle)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, requires each local law enforcement agency to enter into an agreement with the Tennessee bureau of investigation to require the TBI to investigate any officer-involved shooting that occurs within the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 6; Title 8, Chapter 7 and Title 38.

HB 1475 by *Hardaway (SB 1321 by *Kyle)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, creates Class E felony of law enforcement officer operating a law enforcement body camera in any manner that would prevent the creation of evidence with the intent to obstruct justice. - Amends TCA Title 10 and Title 39.

HB 2839 by *Farmer (SB 2817 by *Akbari)

Evidence - As introduced, increases the time which a sheriff is required to advertise any evidence that is ordered to be sold following the conclusion of a judicial proceeding in a newspaper of general circulation, from at least 30 days prior to the sale to at least 45 days. - Amends TCA Title 18, Chapter 1, Part 2; Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 2840 by *Farmer (SB 2736 by *Bell)

Bail, Bail Bonds - As introduced, requires a person who is released on the person's personal recognizance or an unsecured appearance bond to report any change of address or change of employment that occurs while the person's case is pending to the clerk of the court having jurisdiction over the criminal charge within five business days of the change. - Amends TCA Title 18 and Title 40, Chapter 11.

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, designates the Ford Ice Centers in Davidson County as sports authority facilities for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

HB 2612 by *Freeman (SB 2496 by *Dickerson)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, requires persons applying for a manufacturer or distiller license to provide commission with names and percentage of ownership of any person having more than 10 percent interest in the manufacturer or distiller. - Amends TCA Section 57-2-104 and Section 57-3-202.

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, extends the grace period, from 30 days to 45 days, that the commissioner of revenue may grant to liquor-by-the-drink licensees for the filing of tax returns. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4, Part 1 and Title 57, Chapter 4, Part 3.

HB 1651 by *Lamar (SB 1839 by *Akbari, Gilmore)

Prisons and Reformatory Institutions - As introduced, requires a physician to provide prenatal and postpartum medical care to pregnant prisoners and detainees; requires correctional institutions to provide pregnant prisoners nutritionally appropriate meals and supplemental provisions. - Amends TCA Title 41, Chapter 21, Part 2.

Correctional Programs - As introduced, authorizes TRICOR to enter contractual agreements with counties and cities to provide work training programs for prisoners incarcerated in county and city jails. - Amends TCA Title 41, Chapter 22, Part 4.

HB 1799 by *Ramsey (SB 2478 by *Dickerson)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, removes residency requirements for any person applying for a retail license. - Amends TCA Section 57-3-204.

Public Employees - As introduced, provides a \$1,000 pay supplement to emergency medical professionals who complete 40 hours of in-service training. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 68.

Law Enforcement - As introduced, increases, from \$800 to \$1,000, the pay supplement a police officer is entitled to receive in 2020 upon successful completion of 40 hours of in-service training. - Amends TCA Section 38-8-111.

Revenue, Dept. of - As introduced, establishes procedures for requesting the redaction of confidential information from the text of revenue and letter rulings issued by the department. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 1.

Fire Prevention and Investigation - As introduced, requires the state fire marshal to submit a report with the commissioner of commerce and insurance on the benefits of using sealed battery smoke alarms in residential buildings located in this state. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 102; Title 68, Chapter 11 and Title 68, Chapter 120.

HB 2442 by *Ramsey, Hill T, Jernigan, Love, Beck, Tillis, DeBerry, Powell, Staples, Casada, Hodges, Mitchell, Shaw (SB 2481 by *Dickerson)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, makes changes related to a caterer's license for purposes of consumption on the premises; restricts the number of undercover investigations the alcoholic beverage commission can perform on a single licensee in a year; requires a server permit for a doorman employed at an establishment that sells liquor-by-the-drink; makes certain other alcohol sales revisions. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 57.

HB 1673 by *Russell, Powers, Eldridge, Ramsey, Calfee, Bricken (SB 2762 by *Bell)

Emergency Communications Districts - As introduced, requires each emergency communication district, by January 1, 2022, to adopt the direct dispatch method in response to emergency calls received by public safety answering points within the district. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 86.

HB 2809 by *Ogles (SB 2206 by *Johnson)

Law Enforcement Training Academy - As introduced, changes the time period within which the general assembly must confirm the appointment of a citizen member to the Tennessee peace officer standards and training commission from within 90 calendar days to within 60 calendar days. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 38 and Title 49, Chapter 4.

HJR 0827 by *Hardaway, Haston, Lamberth

Memorials, Congress - Expresses support for H.R. 1954, the Cellphone Jamming Reform Act of 2019. -

HB 2007 by *Daniel (SB 2073 by *Pody)

Public Records - As introduced, revises provisions governing confidentiality of certain documents held by the comptroller. - Amends TCA Title 10.

HB 2284 by *Hill M (SB 2357 by *Hensley)

Boards and Commissions - As introduced, revises the confirmation process for appointments to the Tennessee heritage conservation trust fund board of trustees, the state board of education, the standards recommendation committee, the board of regents, and the local governing board of trustees for each of the six state universities. - Amends TCA Title 11 and Title 49.

HB 2687 by *Hill T (SB 2541 by *Niceley)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, requires the comptroller to notify the governing body of a local government regarding the comptroller's approval or disapproval of a private negotiated sale of general obligation refunding bonds within 20 days instead of 15 days from the date the comptroller receives all required information. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 12.

Memorials, Congress - Urges the President of the United States and the United States Congress to enact legislation securing the citizenship of internationally adopted adult individuals. -

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, prohibits public funds from being expended to pay a claim or action resulting from an incident of sexual harassment or a sexual crime in which a public official is found guilty or responsible. - Amends TCA Title 2; Title 3; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 29.

HB 2627 by *Thompson (SB 2813 by *Akbari)

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, clarifies that funds held by the state or a local government pursuant to a deferred compensation plan for employees are not required to be invested in gold, silver, or other minerals. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8 and Title 50.

HB 2702 by *Doggett, Griffey (SB 2458 by *Roberts, Haile, Pody, Stevens)

Public Employees - As introduced, clarifies that the current prohibition against traffic offense citation quotas is applicable to public officials or public employees; creates a Class B misdemeanor offense, subject to fine only, for officials and employees violating that prohibition. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 38; Title 39 and Title 40.
