[HB 2210](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Hall (SB 2141 by *Johnson, Powers, Gresham)

Weights and Measures - As introduced, replaces the statutory list of standard of weights and measures for agricultural products with a requirement that the commissioner of agriculture establish weights and measures by rule. - Amends TCA Section 47-26-101.

[HB 2222](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Sparks (SB 2153 by *Johnson, Southerland)

Parks, Natural Areas Preservation - As introduced, designates Sherwood Forest in Franklin County and Walnut Knob in Smith County as Class II natural areas. - Amends TCA Section 11-14-108.

[HB 2225](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Whitson (SB 2156 by *Johnson, Stevens)

Environment and Conservation, Department of - As introduced, authorizes the commissioner to commission employees of the department who have completed the required training as law enforcement officers; permits law enforcement officers within the division of parks and recreation to provide assistance outside of state parks and recreation areas. - Amends TCA Section 11-1-101; Section 11-3-107; Section 59-8-308 and Section 59-8-404.

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Urges the US Army Corps of Engineers to comply with Tennessee law in its administration of water projects in the State of Tennessee -

Game and Fish Laws - As introduced, extends the exemption from licensure to hunt and fish on farmlands owned by a spouse, parent, or grandparent, to include spouses of children of landowners. - Amends TCA Title 70.

[HB 2494](#) by *Van Huss, Griffey (SB 2300 by *Jackson, Rose)

Game and Fish Laws - As introduced, specifies that a sportsman's license is not required in order to assist a person with a disability who is fishing or hunting pursuant to a discounted license or an exemption from licensure, if certain requirements are met, including executing a form and compliance with certain laws by the assistant. - Amends TCA Title 70.

General Assembly, Statement of Intent or Position - Recognizes the importance of the honeybee and pollinators to the agricultural industry of Tennessee. -

Food and Food Products - As introduced, repeals the Tennessee Egg Law, which establishes a licensure system for certain persons who buy, sell, trade, traffic, or process eggs in Tennessee. - Amends TCA Section 43-1-701; Title 53, Chapter 1, Part 2 and Title 53, Chapter 2.

[HB 1841](#) by *Marsh, Calfee (SB 1766 by *Johnson)

Water Authorities - As introduced, revises the process by which a city, metropolitan, or county government may create a new water or wastewater treatment authority. - Amends TCA Section 7-34-106; Section 7-35-432; Section 68-221-604; Title 68, Chapter 221, Part 10 and Section 68-221-1304.

[HB 2366](#) by *Marsh, Halford, Holt (SB 2378 by *Reeves, Bailey, Crowe, Gresham, Haile, Hensley, Jackson, Lundberg, Niceley, Powers, Stevens)

Local Government, General - As introduced, prohibits local governing bodies from adopting or continuing in effect any ordinance regarding the exhibition of livestock; declares that any such ordinance presently or later enacted is void and of no legal effect. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7 and Title 44.

[HB 0325](#) by *Travis (SB 1357 by *Yager)

Parks, Natural Areas Preservation - As introduced, requires the department of environment and conservation to publish on its website the registry of riparian lands that it maintains under The Tennessee Scenic Rivers Act of 1968. - Amends TCA Title 11, Chapter 13.

HB 1129 by *Hazlewood (SB 1123 by *Briggs)

Public Health - As introduced, changes from December 31 to December 15 the annual date by which the departments of health and human services must jointly provide to the appropriate committees of the senate and the house of representatives a written list of available state and federal options under medicaid and temporary assistance for needy families. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 39; Title 43; Title 44; Title 53; Title 67 and Title 68.

HB 2005 by *Gant (SB 2773 by *Bell, Watson, Powers)

Tennessee Fish & Wildlife Commission - As introduced, extends the notice period that a commissioner is entitled to prior to a hearing to defend charges that may result in the commissioner's removal from not less than 10 business days before the hearing to not less than 14 business days before the hearing. - Amends TCA Title 70, Chapter 1, Part 2.

HB 2067 by *Lafferty, Van Huss, Hardaway, Sherrell, Moody, Hill M, Hall, Kumar, Hill T, Eldridge, Sexton J, Ogles, Leatherwood, Hulsey, Holt (SB 2005 by *Bowling)

Food and Food Products - As introduced, enacts the "Tennessee Food Freedom Act." - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 43; Title 53 and Title 68.

HB 2206 by *Zachary, Faison (SB 2224 by *Southerland)

Water Pollution - As introduced, reduces from five to three days the amount of time within which final orders concerning water quality permitting must be published on the department of environment and conservation website. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 5; Title 7, Chapter 35; Title 65 and Title 69.

HB 2338 by *Sparks (SB 2049 by *Niceley, Pody, Crowe, Gresham)

Food and Food Products - As introduced, establishes standards for proper branding of meat and poultry as "Tennessee-raised" for purposes of the Tennessee Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. - Amends TCA Title 44 and Title 53.

HB 2479 by *Freeman, Clemmons (SB 2771 by *Bell)

Game and Fish Laws - As introduced, deletes one of two similar options for the purchase of a lifetime sportsman license for senior citizens, the fee for which cannot be automatically adjusted to reflect the same percentage increase as the annual sportsman license. - Amends TCA Title 70, Chapter 2.

[HB 2533](#) by *Doggett, Hurt, Hill M, Hill T, Calfee, Halford, Grills, Holt, Griffey (SB 2335 by *Rose)

Taxes, Real Property - As introduced, increases the total acreage a single owner may have classified by the assessor of property as agricultural, forest, or open space land, from 1,500 acres to 5,000 acres, for purposes of greenbelt property taxation. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

[HB 2543](#) by *Potts, Littleton (SB 2442 by *Kyle)

Animal Control - As introduced, requires an animal owner's relative to retrieve the animal from an animal control agency within seven days of the owner's death; permits the animal control agency to treat the animal as an abandoned animal if the relative has not retrieved the animal within seven days. - Amends TCA Title 44; Title 63, Chapter 12 and Title 68.

[HB 2561](#) by *Rudder (SB 2320 by *Roberts)

Regional Authorities and Special Districts - As introduced, repeals the Bledsoe Regional Water Authority. - Amends TCA Title 64, Chapter 1, Part 12.

[HB 2583](#) by *White, Holt, Halford, Griffey, Marsh (SB 2550 by *Jackson)

Agriculture - As introduced, creates an advisory task force of farmers and foresters to lead a strategic planning process and resulting implementation plan to position this state as a leading hub for agtech and value-added agriculture; requires a report to the general assembly no later than April 1, 2021. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 11, Chapter 4; Title 43; Title 44; Title 49 and Title 67.

[HB 2793](#) by *Johnson G, Clemmons (SB 2521 by *Briggs)

Environment and Conservation, Department of - As introduced, requires the commissioner to promulgate rules to create a permitting process for owners and operators of recovered materials processing facilities. - Amends TCA Title 68.

[HB 2892](#) by *Russell (SB 2119 by *Bowling, Pody)

Environment and Conservation, Department of - As introduced, requires the department to issue permits or a denial accompanied by a written explanation within 30 days of receipt of permit applications subject to exceptions for certain permitting processes concerning landfills and waste management; requires the department to issue a permit in situations where an approval or denial is not made within the 30-day time limit. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 7; Title 11; Section 39-14-306; Section 57-4-102; Title 59; Title 62; Title 66; Title 68; Title 69 and Title 70.

Game and Fish Laws - As introduced, creates a five-member Asian carp advisory commission to recommend methods and seek funding for the eradication of Asian carp from Tennessee waters. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 70.

[HB 0845](#) by *Todd (SB 0811 by *Jackson)

Water Pollution - As introduced, requires state to assume regulatory oversight relative to effluents during periods in which the federal government does not have adequate funds to exercise such responsibilities. - Amends TCA Title 68 and Title 69.

[HB 2636](#) by *Holt (SB 2219 by *Southerland)

Water Pollution - As introduced, adds representatives of groups representing recreational users of streams to the advisory committee to the division of water pollution control to advise and assist the division on procedures and policies concerning the application of the Water Quality Control Act to the removal of debris from streams and stabilization of stream banks. - Amends TCA Title 69, Chapter 3, Part 1.

Agriculture, Dept. of - As introduced, establishes the Tennessee equine health advisory commission. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 43.

[HB 2706](#) by *Gant (SB 2681 by *Johnson)

Real Property - As introduced, increases from 15 days to 15 business days, the time period in which a person must endeavor to serve notice of a claim against a contractor, subcontractor, supplier, or design professional related to an alleged construction defect following discovery of the alleged defect. - Amends TCA Title 28 and Title 66.

[HB 2485](#) by *Garrett (SB 2098 by *Massey)

Real Property - As introduced, requires homeowners' associations to make certain financial information publicly available, permit access to association property to persons with written permission from a member of the association, and provide copies of dedicatory instruments to a prospective property buyer upon request; requires homeowners' associations to have bylaws that meet certain requirements. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 14, Part 4; Title 48, Chapter 66 and Title 66.

[HB 2871](#) by *Hill T, Faison, Carter (SB 2855 by *Bailey)

Commerce and Insurance, Dept. of - As introduced, allows electronic submission of the report that an association formed under the provisions governing sheep producers indemnity must file with the commissioner. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 13; Title 42; Title 43; Title 44; Title 45; Title 46; Title 47; Title 48; Title 50; Title 53; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 61; Title 62; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68.

[HB 1661](#) by *Farmer (SB 1933 by *Swann)

Disabled Persons - As introduced, adds to the Class B misdemeanor offense of misrepresentation of a service animal or support animal any person who knowingly represents fraudulently, as a part of a request to enter a place of public accommodation, amusement, or recreation with a dog guide or dog guide in training, that the person has a disability or disability-related need for the use of the animal. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 13; Title 16; Title 33; Title 39; Title 41; Title 49; Title 50; Title 62; Title 66 and Title 68.

HB 2600 by *Camper, Clemmons (SB 2818 by *Akbari)

Economic and Community Development, Dept. of - As introduced, directs the Tennessee film, entertainment and music commission to perform a study of film production incentives and programs in Tennessee and contiguous states and report findings and recommendations to the general assembly by February 1, 2021. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 50; Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 7 and Title 9.

HB 2633 by *Holt (SB 2305 by *Stevens)

Auctions and Auctioneers - As introduced, establishes how a person may obtain a gallery license to operate an auction house, auction barn, auction gallery, or any other type of auction operating at a fixed site. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 19.

HB 2313 by *Stewart, Clemmons, Griffey (SB 2237 by *Jackson)

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, allows a member of the armed forces who is licensed to practice a professional service in another state to practice in this state. - Amends TCA Title 62; Title 63 and Section 68-1-101.

HB 2563 by *Sherrell (SB 2865 by *Bailey)

Contractors - As introduced, requires a person with knowledge of faulty electrical work performed by a limited licensed electrician to notify the board of licensing contractors within three business days from the date the person knows of the faulty electrical work. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 6 and Title 68, Chapter 102.

HB 2672 by *Williams, Faison, Carter (SB 2029 by *Rose)

Contractors - As introduced, authorizes owners of real property to construct certain residential buildings on that property without obtaining a contractor license; requires notice of such construction to be made to the board for licensing contractors, the register of deeds, and subsequent purchasers of the property. - Amends TCA Title 13; Title 62, Chapter 6 and Title 66.

HB 2352 by *Miller (SB 2543 by *Niceley)

Fireworks - As introduced, removes the certification requirement for flame effect display operators; changes the requirement for an outdoor fireworks display or proximate pyrotechnic display operator certification or renewal applicants to show supervised past experience from three displays in the previous three years to 10 displays in the past 12 months. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 104.

HB 2562 by *Rudder (SB 2319 by *Roberts)

Private Investigators - As introduced, eliminates the restriction on the number of apprentices a private investigator may have at one time. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 26.

HB 0614 by *Griffey, Weaver (SB 1167 by *Hensley)

Landlord and Tenant - As introduced, requires a landlord to provide local governmental agencies responsible for enforcing building codes the landlord's email address in addition to the landlord's name, telephone number, and physical address. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 62 and Title 66.

HB 1970 by *Whitson, Hardaway, Johnson C, Helton, Moon, Jernigan, Hazlewood (SB 2084 by *Briggs)

Barbers and/or Cosmetologists - As introduced, lengthens, from 10 days to 14 days, the time period in which the board of cosmetology and barber examiners has to publish changes to applicable laws and rules on its website from the effective date of such changes. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 3 and Title 62, Chapter 4.

HB 1593 by *Whitson, Gant, Marsh, Lamberth (SB 2207 by *Johnson)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, extends, from September 30 to October 15 of each year, the deadline by which the governing committee of the Tennessee automobile insurance plan must submit its annual financial report to the department of commerce and insurance. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 42; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 65 and Title 67.

Employees, Employers - As introduced, clarifies statutes related to retaliatory termination of an employee. - Amends TCA Title 20; Title 29 and Title 50, Chapter 1.

[HB 1996](#) by *Curcio (SB 2617 by *Swann)

Child Labor - As introduced, allows an age-restricted venue to continue to permit smoking in the venue even if the venue employs a person under 21 years of age if the employee is a child of the owner of the venue. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 18; Title 50, Chapter 5, Part 1 and Title 57.

[HB 2577](#) by *Ragan, Sherrell, Van Huss, Cepicky, Doggett, Moody, Hill M, Kumar, Hill T, Hall, Eldridge, Sexton J, Ogles, Leatherwood, Hulsey (SB 2691 by *Briggs)

Public Employees - As introduced, creates a presumption that a public safety employee diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) sustained the injury in the line of duty for purposes of workers' compensation; expands definition of public safety employee. - Amends TCA Title 7; Title 8; Title 33; Title 50, Chapter 6 and Title 56.

[HB 2846](#) by *Kumar, Van Huss (SB 2595 by *Niceley)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, extends the deadline by which the commissioner of agriculture must submit to the governor and the general assembly a report entitled "Annual Report on the Quality of Kerosene and Motor Fuel in Tennessee" from September 15 of each year to October 1 of each year. - Amends TCA Title 43; Title 47, Chapter 18 and Title 55.

[HB 2859](#) by *Vaughan (SB 2843 by *Niceley)

Consumer Protection - As introduced, increases from 10-point to 12-point the size of type required on the statements health clubs must provide regarding a buyer's right to cancel and the implications of paying an agreement in full. - Amends TCA Title 47, Chapter 18, Part 3.

Employees, Employers - As introduced, requires the department of human resources to make an annual report on or before January 15, instead of periodically, to the governor on recommendations for improvements of the state service system. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8; Title 28; Title 29; Title 39; Title 40; Title 49 and Title 50.

[HB 2560](#) by *Rudder (SB 2333 by *Roberts)

Commerce and Insurance, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to combine all moneys received and expenses incurred under the Tennessee Credit Services Businesses Act and the Uniform Debt-Management Services Act into a single fund for the purpose of administering the acts. - Amends TCA Title 47, Chapter 18, Part 10 and Title 47, Chapter 18, Part 55.

[HB 1549](#) by *Camper, Clemmons (SB 2814 by *Akbari, Gilmore)

Human Rights - As introduced, defines race and protective hairstyle for the purposes of the Tennessee Human Rights Act. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 21; Title 8; Title 49 and Title 50.

[HB 2719](#) by *Windle, Halford, Ragan, Hodges, Towns, Freeman, Lamar (SB 2462 by *Kyle)

Holidays and Days of Special Observance - As introduced, encourages all employers in this state to provide a paid day off each Veterans' Day for all employees of the employer who are veterans. - Amends TCA Title 15 and Title 58.

[HB 1862](#) by *Beck (SB 1796 by *Yarbro, Gilmore)

Employees, Employers - As introduced, prohibits marketplace platforms from keeping tips intended for marketplace contractors. - Amends TCA Title 50; Title 56 and Title 62.

HB 2545 by *Potts, Parkinson, Lamar, Thompson (SB 2641 by *Yarbro)

Salaries and Benefits - As introduced, prohibits private employers with 50 or more employees and public employers from making employment decisions with regard to an applicant or current employee based on wage or salary history. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 12 and Title 50.

HB 2400 by *Williams, Windle (SB 2851 by *Bailey)

Museums - As introduced, designates the Tennessee state museum located at 1000 Rosa L. Parks Boulevard as the "William E. Haslam Center". - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 12.

HB 2052 by *Lynn (SB 2506 by *Dickerson)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, provides an example of the type of entity that falls within the definition of the term "private nonprofit college or university," for purposes of the tax exemption where the title holder of certain tangible personal property used by a contractor or subcontractor is a private nonprofit college or university. - Amends TCA Section 67-6-209.

Finance and Administration, Dept. of - As introduced, creates the Tennessee violence intervention program within the department's office of criminal justice programs to invest in evidence-based violence reduction initiatives. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 38, Chapter 6; Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 1424 by *Towns (SB 0843 by *Akbari)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, increases the penalty from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class E felony for the failure to report known or suspected child sexual abuse. - Amends TCA Title 37, Chapter 1.

HB 2762 by *Ogles (SB 2673 by *Johnson)

Domestic Violence - As introduced, requires a magistrate imposing global positioning monitoring on a defendant as a condition for bail for an offense involving domestic violence to inform the victim of how to obtain a copy of the defendant's conditions of bail including any geographic restrictions. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 4.

HB 1471 by *Hardaway (SB 1322 by *Kyle)

HB 2580 by *Hulsey, Faison, Sexton J, Moon, Russell, Hurt, Lafferty, Daniel, Staples, Van Huss, Calfee, Coley (SB 2530 by *Southerland)

Political Parties - As introduced, designates a specific time frame of 48 hours within which the state executive committees should post on the websites of the respective political parties, any change to a scheduled appearance of a candidate or the unavailability of a candidate to appear at an event scheduled during the time between the primary and general elections. - Amends TCA Title 2.

HB 2041 by *Todd (SB 1956 by *Jackson)

Industrial Development - As introduced, creates an exception to the prohibition on an industrial development corporation purchasing a hotel, motel, or apartment building, if the project is a tourism attraction involving an aggregate investment of public and private funds in excess of \$75 million. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 53.

HB 2139 by *Todd (SB 2546 by *Jackson)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, deletes the provision that limited the availability of recall elections for school board members to only Madison County. - Amends TCA Title 2 and Title 49, Chapter 2, Part 2.

HB 2077 by *Leatherwood, Coley, Griffey (SB 2030 by *Rose)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, opens eligibility to vote in a referendum on the levy of a local option sales tax by a county to all voters in the county, including city residents, even if the proposed levy is equal to or below the current tax levied in the city. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6, Part 7.

HB 2142 by *Love (SB 2582 by *Yarbro)

Zoning - As introduced, exempts Nashville-Davidson County from the prohibition on enacting laws that require existing or newly constructed private residential or commercial units to be sold or rented at below market rates. - Amends TCA Section 66-35-102.

HB 1893 by *DeBerry (SB 1772 by *Kelsey)

Election Laws - As introduced, requires absentee ballot counting boards to tabulate the results of early and absentee voting at the time the polls are statutorily required to close; requires the absentee ballot counting board to publicly announce the results immediately upon completing the tabulations, even if voters in the county are still waiting in line to vote. - Amends TCA Title 2.

HB 2129 by *Powell (SB 2490 by *Dickerson)

Metropolitan Government - As introduced, authorizes, instead of requires, metropolitan government to furnish to the department of revenue a certified copy of a resolution designating a central business improvement district. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 88 and Title 67.

HB 2898 by *Thompson (SB 2729 by *Kyle)

Taxes, Real Property - As introduced, requires the assessor of property to advise the county or municipal tax collector of a revised assessment based on commercial and industrial tangible personal property that is destroyed, demolished, or substantially damaged by fire, flood, wind, or any other disaster. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

HB 2445 by *Hardaway, Clemmons, Hakeem (SB 2445 by *Kyle)

Tennessee Housing Development Agency - As introduced, requires state-wide grant programs operated by the THDA through the Tennessee housing trust fund to consider applicant homeowners eligible if the applicant is making property tax payments via a written, approved payment plan and not just if the applicant has paid property taxes in full. - Amends TCA Title 13, Chapter 23.

HB 2199 by *Tillis, Marsh, Carr, Bricken (SB 2120 by *Bowling)

Taxes, Personal Property - As introduced, authorizes the county trustee to proceed against delinquent taxpayers by retaining an agent to collect delinquent personal property taxes, interest, costs, and attorneys' fees. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

HB 1969 by *Helton, Faison, Carter, Moon, Carr, Hall, Hakeem, Rudder, Eldridge (SB 1825 by *Kelsey)

Planning, Public - As introduced, allows an owner or agent of the owner of land to sell, agree to sell, or negotiate to sell the land by reference to a subdivision plat before the final subdivision plat is approved by the planning commission. - Amends TCA Title 13, Chapter 3; Title 13, Chapter 4 and Title 66.

[HB 2348](#) by *Carter, Helton, Moon, Carr, Hall, Hakeem, Rudder, Eldridge, Smith (SB 2453 by *Roberts)

Taxes, Ad Valorem - As introduced, extends, from March 1 to March 15, the deadline by which an owner of land may submit an application to the assessor of property for its classification to be designated as agricultural. - Amends TCA Title 67.

[HB 2767](#) by *Carter, Moon, Wright (SB 2310 by *Gardenhire)

County Government - As enacted, requires counties that provide insurance coverage for employees to put the policy or policies on the county's website. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 8 and Title 56.

[HB 2385](#) by *Calfee, Russell, Griffey, Grills (SB 1639 by *Yager)

Firefighters - As introduced, allows a volunteer firefighter to receive \$800 from the commission on firefighting personnel standards and education for completing 40 hours of training annually. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 24.

[HB 2907](#) by *Wright (SB 2915 by *Briggs)

Knox County - As introduced and subject to local approval, authorizes Knox County to collect the privilege tax on occupancy from transients in owner-occupied single family residences, in apartments or condominiums where less than 25 percent of the total units are rented to transients, and in single-family homes where each single-family dwelling unit occupies a separate lot. - Amends Chapter 847 of the Public Acts of 1982, as amended by Chapter 628 of the Public Acts of 1996.

[HB 2738](#) by *Moon (SB 2477 by *Stevens)

Taxes, Hotel Motel - As introduced, lengthens the time a hotel operator in a home rule municipality that levies an occupancy tax is required to maintain tax records, from three years to four years. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 4; Title 13, Chapter 7, Part 6 and Title 67.

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, removes references to ambulatory disability certifications being made by Christian Science practitioners from the definition of "disabled driver". - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 54; Title 55; Title 65 and Title 67.

[HB 2278](#) by *Curcio (SB 2454 by *Roberts)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, authorizes all-terrain vehicles and Class I and Class II off-highway vehicles that are registered, insured, and equipped with safety equipment, to be operated on state routes in Hickman County. - Amends TCA Section 55-8-185.

[HB 1887](#) by *Hill T (SB 1872 by *Lundberg, Crowe)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, authorizes off-highway vehicles to be operated on a certain segment of a state highway in Johnson County; makes other revisions related to the Doe Mountain recreation area. - Amends TCA Title 11, Chapter 25; Title 54 and Title 55.

[HB 2320](#) by *Windle (SB 2903 by *Bailey)

Motor Vehicles - As introduced, authorizes operation of off-highway vehicles on certain segments of state highways in Jackson County. - Amends TCA Section 55-8-185.

[HB 2061](#) by *Littleton (SB 1995 by *Massey)

Driver Licenses - As introduced, requires department of safety to distribute to entities contracting with the department to issue driver licenses an additional fee of \$6.00 per license for administrative costs. - Amends TCA Section 55-50-331.

Highway Signs - As introduced, defines "breakfast" for specific service-sign purposes. - Amends TCA Title 54.

Motor Vehicles, Titling and Registration - As introduced, requires county clerks to remit to the commissioner, instead of commissioner or commissioner's designee, the remaining \$5.50 of the \$10.00 issuance fee received by county clerks for issuing temporary operation permits; authorizes commissioner's designee to issue temporary trailer permits. - Amends TCA Section 55-4-115.

[HB 2610](#) by *Cochran (SB 2599 by *Niceley)

Highways, Roads and Bridges - As introduced, requires guide signs for recreation sites or cultural interest areas located in counties with a population less than 100,000 along state highways to be for those sites or areas that have a minimum annual attendance of at least 30 percent of the population of the county. - Amends TCA Title 54.
