COVID-19, TIME SENSITIVE, OR BUDGET RELATED BILLS

- 1. [SB 2878](#) *Bailey (HB 2734 by *Sexton C, Keisling)**
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, changes, from July 1 to July 15, the date by which a list of economically distressed counties eligible for apportionment of sales and use tax revenue to commercial development districts is to be published by the commissioners of finance and administration, economic and community development, and revenue. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.
- 2. [SB 2097](#) *Gresham, Bell (HB 2157 by *Hicks, Ragan)**
Scholarships and Financial Aid- As introduced, enacts the "Financial Aid Simplification for Tennesseans (FAST) Act." - Amends TCA Title 12, Chapter 3; Title 49, Chapter 1 and Title 49, Chapter 4.
- 3. [SB 2111](#) *Lundberg (HB 2156 by *Boyd)**
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, changes from January 31 to March 1, the date by which the commissioner of economic and community development must report to the general assembly on the administration of the program allocating the state's bond authority among governmental units having authority to issue bonds. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 12.

4. [SB 2677](#) *Johnson (HB 2760 by *Ogles)
Taxes, Sales- As introduced, changes, from February 1 to February 15, the date by which the department of revenue must report findings and recommendations regarding sales taxes collected on electronic nicotine delivery devices to the speakers of the senate and the house of representatives and the chairs of the respective finance, ways and means committees. - Amends TCA Title 67.

5. [SB 1633](#) *Yager (HB 1675 by *Keisling)
Air Pollution- As introduced, requires the department of environment and conservation to develop a plan to implement the federal affordable clean energy rule and submit the plan to the EPA for approval by June 15, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 7; Title 65; Title 68 and Chapter 478 of the Public Acts of 2015.

6. [SB 1727](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1806 by *Hazlewood)
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, specifies the assumptions that a political subdivision's actuary's report must include when analyzing financing obligations under the political subdivision's pension plan; adds other related revisions. - Amends TCA Title 9, Chapter 3, Part 5.

7. [SB 2312](#) *Gardenhire, Reeves, Watson, Jackson, Crowe (HB 2350 by *Smith, Daniel)
Hospitals and Health Care Facilities- As introduced, makes various changes to the certificate of need process for healthcare facilities and services. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 11, Part 16.

- 1. [SB 2505](#) *Dickerson (HB 2153 by *Smith, Todd, Garrett, Doggett, Rudder, Wright, Helton, Cochran, Russell, Moon, Baum, Cepicky, Eldridge, Hall, Haston, White, Terry)**
Federal Aid- As introduced, changes the date, from March 1 to March 15, by which the fiscal review committee staff must provide the general assembly's finance, ways and means committees information regarding state programs that have suffered reductions of federal financial support in the amount of 10 percent or more during the preceding year. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 9; Title 12, Chapter 4; Title 13; Title 41; Title 42; Title 49; Title 54; Title 55 and Title 71.
- 2. [SB 0721](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1268 by *Crawford)**
Revenue, Dept. of- As introduced, increases from 10 to 12 days the deadline for requesting a formal hearing before the commissioner on adverse action proposed or taken to implement any revenue regulatory or registration law administered by the commissioner, not including those laws relating to assessments or levies of taxes, fees, fines, penalties, interest, or the waiver of penalties. - Amends TCA Title 67.
- 3. [SB 1033](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1191 by *Williams, Smith, Thompson)**
Insurance, Life- As introduced, extends the effective date of a commercial risk insurance policy cancellation from 10 days to 15 days after notice is mailed to a named insured. - Amends TCA Title 56 and Title 67.

4. [SB 2127](#) *Hensley (HB 2673 by *Williams)

Taxes, Sales- As introduced, defines "micro market" and "micro market display" for purposes of sales and use taxes; authorizes dealers who own and operate micro markets in multiple locations to submit to the department of revenue a single monthly sales tax return and payment from sales made at all micro markets owned and operated by the dealer. - Amends TCA Title 67.

COVID-19, TIME SENSITIVE, OR BUDGET RELATED BILLS

- 1. [SB 2187](#) *Johnson** (HB 2254 by *Lamberth, Gant, Johnson C)
Boards and Commissions- As introduced, transfers responsibility for administration of the Tennessee sports hall of fame from the commissioner of tourist development to the hall's board of directors and makes other changes concerning the sports hall of fame. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 22 and Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 54.
- 2. [SB 0247](#) *Haile** (HB 0225 by *Crawford)
Election Laws- As introduced, requires election officials to inspect filings for sufficiency and timeliness; establishes conclusive presumption that accepted filings are sufficient and timely filed. - Amends TCA Title 2.
- 3. [SB 2821](#) *Akbari** (HB 2106 by *White)
Tourism- As introduced, clarifies that accounting and legal services are exempted from the fee on sales of services and tangible personal property within central business improvement districts within tourism development zones. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 88 and Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 30.

4. [SB 2826](#) *Akbari (HB 2111 by *White)

Tourism- As introduced, increases from 10 percent to 15 percent, the percentage of qualified voters who must sign a petition filed with the county election commission within 30 days of final approval of an ordinance by the municipal legislative body levying a privilege tax on sales in business activity in a qualified public use facility and in tourism development zones in order for the county election commission to call an election on the question of whether or not the privilege tax should be levied. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 88, Part 1 and Title 67, Chapter 4, Part 30.

5. [SB 0193](#) *Robinson (HB 0145 by *Lamar)

Election Laws- As introduced, authorizes a person who registered to vote by mail or online and who is voting for the first time to vote absentee by applying to vote absentee at any county election commission office. - Amends TCA Title 2.

6. [SB 1753](#) *Lundberg (HB 1722 by *Faison)

Beer- As introduced, authorizes beer manufacturers to self-distribute beer within a 100-mile radius of the manufacturer if the manufacturer brews 50,000 gallons or less. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 5.

7. [SB 2485](#) *Dickerson, Gilmore (HB 1642 by *Jernigan, Love)

Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates the Tennessee State Fairgrounds in Nashville as an urban park center; authorizes the granting of a franchise for the provision of food or beverage, including alcoholic beverages, on its premises; specifies that the holder of such franchise is also considered an urban park center. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

8. [SB 2667](#) *Briggs (HB 2842 by *Farmer)

Lottery, Charitable- As introduced, adds tickets and coupons to the types of legal instruments entitling a winner of a charitable gaming event to a non-cash prize or award. - Amends TCA Title 3.

- 1. [SB 2408](#) *Kyle (HB 2523 by *Stewart, Clemmons)**
Public Funds and Financing- As introduced, prohibits public funds from being expended to pay a claim or action resulting from an incident of sexual harassment or a sexual crime in which a public official is found guilty or responsible. - Amends TCA Title 2; Title 3; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 29.
- 2. [SB 0741](#) *Kyle (HB 1207 by *Mitchell, Clemmons)**
Human Services, Dept. of- As introduced, authorizes state agencies to provide child care services for state employees, with the department tasked to approve, administer, and coordinate such services. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 49 and Title 71.
- 3. [SB 2116](#) *Gardenhire (HB 2731 by *Sexton C, Smith)**
Comptroller, State- As introduced, requires that insurance pool, special fund, and reserve fund created by a governmental entity and any entity administering such funds be audited annually by the comptroller of the treasury. - Amends TCA Section 10-7-503 and Section 29-20-401.
- 4. [SB 2715](#) *Gardenhire (HB 2727 by *Sexton C, Travis)**
General Services, Dept. of- As introduced, clarifies that the fiscal review committee must be allowed to review noncompetitive procurement agreements; requires the chief procurement officer to report procurement contracts monthly to the fiscal review committee; revises various other provisions related to procurement of state contracts. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8; Title 9; Title 12 and Title 49.

5. [SB 2688](#) *Gardenhire (HB 2520 by *Bricken, Russell)

Emergency Communications Districts- As introduced, reduces the time period in which the board of directors of an emergency communications district must file a copy of the district's annual audit with the appropriate authorities, from 30 days after receipt of the audit by the board to 15 days after receipt of the audit. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 86.

6. [SB 2760](#) *Bell (HB 2173 by *Garrett, Griffey)

Ethics- As introduced, clarifies that trial court judges and chancellors must file statements of interest. - Amends TCA Title 2, Chapter 10, Part 2; Title 3, Chapter 6, Part 1; Title 4, Chapter 55 and Title 8, Chapter 50, Part 5.

7. [SB 1067](#) *Dickerson (HB 0511 by *Curcio)

Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, removes certain defenses to criminal trespass at a retail package store. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 2; Title 57, Chapter 3 and Title 57, Chapter 4.

8. [SB 0621](#) *Hensley, Yager, Crowe (HB 0644 by *Hill T, Dunn, Hawk, Griffey, Ogles, Ramsey, Faison)

State Employees- As introduced, requires a state agency in any proceeding to suspend, terminate, or discipline an employee in state service to prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the employee violated state law or a rule or policy of the agency prior to taking such action. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8, Chapter 30; Title 9; Title 10 and Title 12.

9. [SB 2528](#) *Lundberg (HB 2700 by *Kumar)

Industrial Development- As introduced, requires each member of a board of directors of an industrial development corporation to complete a conflict-of-interest statement; requires the Tennessee Ethics Commission to post on its website a sample conflict of interest statement. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 53.

10. [SB 2872](#) *Bailey (HB 2736 by *Williams)

State Employees- As introduced, clarifies that online and alternative delivery fees are covered by the tuition and fee waiver for full-time state employees. - Amends TCA Section 8-50-114.

11. [SB 2882](#) *Bailey (HB 2715 by *Windle, Crawford, Griffey, Towns)

Public Employees- As introduced, provides a \$1,000 pay supplement to emergency medical professionals who complete 40 hours of in-service training. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 68.

- 12. [SB 2886](#) *Bailey** (HB 2665 by *Williams, Todd, Daniel, Lafferty)
Privacy, Confidentiality- As introduced, enacts the "Personal Privacy Protection Act," which prohibits the release of certain personal information by a public agency, makes certain personal information confidential and not an open record, and creates a civil cause of action and criminal offense for violations. - Amends TCA Title 2; Title 3; Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 10; Title 12; Title 39; Title 40 and Title 41.
- 13. [SB 2898](#) *Bailey** (HB 2669 by *Williams)
Pensions and Retirement Benefits- As introduced, replaces the statutory terms "board member" and "member" with the term "trustee" in the provisions governing appointments to the board of trustees in the event of vacancies resulting from the death, disability, resignation, or ineligibility of a state employee who serves on the board. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.
- 14. [SB 0675](#) *Gilmore** (HB 1450 by *Camper)
Purchasing and Procurement- As introduced, authorizes the chief procurement officer to submit the annual report on the awarding of purchases to a minority-owned business, woman-owned business, service-disabled veteran-owned business, business owned by persons with disabilities, or small business to the general assembly in electronic format. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 7, Chapter 4; Title 8, Chapter 37, Part 1; Title 12; Title 13, Chapter 29; Section 39-14-137; Title 49; Section 62-43-105 and Title 65, Chapter 5.
- 15. [SB 2582](#) *Yarbro** (HB 2142 by *Love)
Zoning- As introduced, exempts Nashville-Davidson County from the prohibition on enacting laws that require existing or newly constructed private residential or commercial units to be sold or rented at below market rates. - Amends TCA Section 66-35-102.
- 16. [SB 2331](#) *White** (HB 2493 by *Van Huss)
Veterans- As introduced, expands from honorably discharged veterans of World War II to all honorably discharged veterans the ability to substitute time in military service for the experience needed to qualify for any position, trade, profession, or vocation. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 38; Title 58; Title 62; Title 63 and Title 68.
- 17. [SB 2064](#) *White** (HB 2685 by *Sparks, Griffey)
Pensions and Retirement Benefits- As introduced, authorizes a department of correction officer who is a member of the state retirement system to retire under the state retirement system upon completion of 25 years of creditable service. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 36.

18. [SB 2427](#) *Crowe (HB 2592 by *Holsclaw, Ramsey)

Naming and Designating- As introduced, recognizes the Algonquin, the Chickamaugan, the Iroquoian, the Muskogean, the Siouan, and the Yuchean cultural groups as Tennessee's first peoples. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 1, Part 3 and Title 4, Chapter 1, Part 4.

19. [SB 1782](#) *Bowling (HB 1708 by *Sherrell)

Taxes, Hotel Motel- As introduced, authorizes the City of Tracy City to levy a privilege tax of up to 5 percent upon the privilege of occupancy by a two-thirds vote of its governing body. - Amends TCA Section 67-4-1425.

20. [SB 1915](#) *Bowling (HB 1946 by *Daniel, Calfee, Moon, Lafferty, Rudd, Hulsey, Doggett, Cepicky, Hardaway, Reedy)

Professions and Occupations- As introduced, allows members of the United States armed forces and honorably discharged veterans who receive certified occupational training as a member of the United States armed forces to receive equivalent credit toward an occupational license relating to the training received. - Amends TCA Title 58; Title 62 and Title 63.

1. [SB 1942](#) *Briggs (HB 1890 by *Helton, Smith, Ramsey, Daniel, Hodges, Williams, Hakeem, Mitchell, Thompson, Rudder, Eldridge, Staples, Hazlewood, Whitson, Moon, Garrett, Hill T, Cepicky, Kumar, Hill M, Miller, Sparks, Carr, Powers, Hawk, Jernigan, Beck, DeBerry, Parkinson, Johnson G, Casada)

Pharmacy, Pharmacists- As introduced, prohibits a pharmacy benefit manager and certain other third parties from taking certain actions against entities and pharmacies participating in the federal 340B drug discount program; creates a private cause of action against violators. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 56 and Title 71.

2. [SB 2207](#) *Johnson (HB 1593 by *Whitson, Gant, Marsh, Lamberth)

Motor Vehicles- As introduced, extends, from September 30 to October 15 of each year, the deadline by which the governing committee of the Tennessee automobile insurance plan must submit its annual financial report to the department of commerce and insurance. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 42; Title 47, Chapter 18; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 65 and Title 67.

3. [SB 2684](#) *Watson (HB 2680 by *Hill T, Smith)

Health Care- As introduced, authorizes healthcare facilities to provide an electronic method for insureds or their representatives to acknowledge and sign the statutorily required notice that the insured agrees to receive medical services by an out-of-network provider and will receive a bill for the amount unpaid by the insured's insurer. - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 56; Title 63 and Title 68.

- 1. [SB 1310](#) *Kyle** (HB 1472 by *Hardaway)
Business and Commerce- As introduced, enacts certain provisions relative to business or industries undergoing a reduction in operations that negatively impacts employees. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 9; Title 10; Title 50; Title 64 and Title 67.
- 2. [SB 1746](#) *Lundberg** (HB 1628 by *Parkinson, Cooper, Thompson, Towns, Cochran, Sparks)
Consumer Protection- As introduced, creates a reward for information leading to the recovery of a civil penalty against a person who knowingly causes any caller identification service to transmit misleading or inaccurate caller identification information to a subscriber with the intent to defraud or cause harm to another person or to wrongfully obtain anything of value. - Amends TCA Title 40 and Title 47, Chapter 18.
- 3. [SB 1811](#) *Hensley** (HB 1681 by *Haston)
Real Property- As introduced, authorizes an offeree to cancel a contract or agreement, within 30 days from the offeree signing the agreement or contract, that was entered into following an unsolicited offer to purchase the offeree's real property that was sent through the mail. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 13; Title 39; Title 47; Title 66 and Title 71.

4. [SB 2029](#) *Rose (HB 2672 by *Williams, Faison, Carter)
Contractors- As introduced, authorizes owners of real property to construct certain residential buildings on that property without obtaining a contractor license; requires notice of such construction to be made to the board for licensing contractors, the register of deeds, and subsequent purchasers of the property. - Amends TCA Title 13; Title 62, Chapter 6 and Title 66.

5. [SB 2103](#) *Gardenhire (HB 2044 by *Sparks)
Insurance, Motor Vehicles- As introduced, requires insurers who write automobile liability insurance policies in this state to include coverage for diminution in value on motor vehicles that are three years of age or newer and have less than 100,000 miles on the odometer; establishes a calculation for diminution in value. - Amends TCA Title 56.

6. [SB 2617](#) *Swann (HB 1996 by *Curcio)
Child Labor- As introduced, allows an age-restricted venue to continue to permit smoking in the venue even if the venue employs a person under 21 years of age if the employee is a child of the owner of the venue. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 18; Title 50, Chapter 5, Part 1 and Title 57.

7. [SB 2641](#) *Yarbro (HB 2545 by *Potts, Parkinson, Lamar, Thompson)
Salaries and Benefits- As introduced, prohibits private employers with 50 or more employees and public employers from making employment decisions with regard to an applicant or current employee based on wage or salary history. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 12 and Title 50.

8. [SB 2814](#) *Akbari, Gilmore (HB 1549 by *Camper, Clemmons)
Human Rights- As introduced, defines race and protective hairstyle for the purposes of the Tennessee Human Rights Act. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 21; Title 8; Title 49 and Title 50.

9. [SB 2816](#) *Akbari (HB 2838 by *Farmer)
Consumer Protection- As introduced, decreases the number of days a business may advertise that the business is going out of business from 90 to 60 days. - Amends TCA Title 47.

10. [SB 2827](#) *Akbari (HB 2764 by *Ogles)

Employees, Employers- As introduced, requires the department of human resources to make an annual report on or before January 15, instead of periodically, to the governor on recommendations for improvements of the state service system. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8; Title 28; Title 29; Title 39; Title 40; Title 49 and Title 50.

11. [SB 2843](#) *Niceley (HB 2859 by *Vaughan)

Consumer Protection- As introduced, increases from 10-point to 12-point the size of type required on the statements health clubs must provide regarding a buyer's right to cancel and the implications of paying an agreement in full. - Amends TCA Title 47, Chapter 18, Part 3.

12. [SB 2855](#) *Bailey (HB 2871 by *Hill T, Faison, Carter)

Commerce and Insurance, Dept. of- As introduced, allows electronic submission of the report that an association formed under the provisions governing sheep producers indemnity must file with the commissioner. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 13; Title 42; Title 43; Title 44; Title 45; Title 46; Title 47; Title 48; Title 50; Title 53; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 61; Title 62; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68.

13. [SB 2875](#) *Bailey (HB 1566 by *Holt, Griffey, Parkinson)

Insurance Companies, Agents, Brokers, Policies- As introduced, requires the commissioner of commerce and insurance to develop a proposal to create an insurance pool for the purpose of providing full coverage to vendors operating horseback riding services in Tennessee state parks. - Amends TCA Title 11; Title 56 and Title 70.

14. [SB 2909](#) *Bailey (HB 1947 by *Daniel)

Employees, Employers- As introduced, clarifies statutes related to retaliatory termination of an employee. - Amends TCA Title 20; Title 29 and Title 50, Chapter 1.
