[HB 2910](#) by *Grills (SB 2920 by *Jackson)

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, changes the compensation, from an amount not to exceed \$1,000 annually to an amount not to exceed \$200 monthly, for the board of directors of the Reelfoot Lake regional utility and planning district. - Amends Chapter 222 of the Public Acts of 1983.

Sentencing - As introduced, removes requirement that a person convicted of a drug offense in a drug-free school zone must serve the entire minimum sentence imposed before being eligible for release on parole; decreases the drug-free school zone from 1,000 feet to 500 feet; makes various changes to sentencing requirements for certain controlled substance violations. - Amends TCA Title 16, Chapter 2; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4 and Section 49-2-116.

[HB 1949](#) by *Daniel (SB 2074 by *Pody)

Boards and Commissions - As introduced, allows certain entities to use up to 10 percent of the entities' reserve fund if the entity has a deficit for the fiscal year. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 9.

[HB 2333](#) by *Howell, Griffey, Van Huss (SB 2737 by *Bell, White, Crowe, Pody, Rose, Stevens)

Handgun Permits - As introduced, waives the lifetime handgun carry permit fees for retired law enforcement officers who served for at least 10 years, rather than former law enforcement officers who served for at least 10 years. - Amends TCA Section 39-17-1351.

[HB 1801](#) by *Hulsey, Griffey, Russell (SB 1752 by *Lundberg, Stevens, White)

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, makes state correctional officers who are members of the state retirement system eligible for service retirement after completing 25 years of creditable service. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 34; Title 8, Chapter 35; Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 8, Chapter 37.

HB 2339 by *Hulsey, Dixie (SB 2257 by *Crowe)

Probation and Parole - As introduced, specifies that a prisoner who has served greater than 50 percent of the sentence imposed on combined state sentences and has an active detainer to serve a term of imprisonment in another jurisdiction must be considered for parole to the detainer if certain conditions are met. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 28.

HB 1932 by *Hulsey (SB 2129 by *Hensley)

Pensions and Retirement Benefits - As introduced, adds emergency medical services personnel to the mandatory retirement age provisions that apply to TCRS members employed as police officers or firefighters with a participating political subdivision. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 36 and Title 68, Chapter 140, Part 3.

HB 2158 by *Marsh, Boyd, Calfee (SB 2491 by *Dickerson)

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, changes the frequency with which the underground utility damage enforcement board must meet each calendar year from a minimum of two times to a minimum of three times. - Amends TCA Title 65, Chapter 28 and Title 65, Chapter 31.

HB 2246 by *Lamberth, Gant, Moon, Griffey, Whitson, Wright, Carr, Garrett, Camper, Boyd, Stewart, Beck, Calfee, Van Huss, Cepicky, Russell, Hulsey, Hicks, Faison, Zachary, Keisling, Reedy (SB 2177 by *Johnson, Lundberg, Powers, White)

Education, Higher - As introduced, extends eligibility for tuition reimbursement provided to members of the Tennessee national guard under the STRONG Act of 2017 to include technical certificates and diplomas and certain graduate programs. - Amends TCA Title 49, Chapter 4, Part 10.

HB 2075 by *Powers, Shaw, Wright (SB 1642 by *Massey, Yager, Crowe, Powers, Robinson)

Disabled Persons - As introduced, makes changes to the law concerning governmental entities, supported in whole or in part by the general assembly, purchasing services or commodities from the central nonprofit agency that works to provide individuals with severe disabilities competitive integrated employment opportunities. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 21; Title 12; Title 50 and Title 71, Chapter 4, Part 7.

HB 1930 by *Ramsey, Marsh, Camper, Wright, Thompson, Griffey, Rudder, Curcio, Lynn, Weaver, Boyd, Ragan (SB 2492 by *Dickerson, Yager)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, deletes an antiquated reporting requirement relating to an expired pilot project of the alcoholic beverage commission related to the sale of alcoholic beverages and beer on the premises. - Amends TCA Title 57.

Constitutional Amendments - Proposes adding a provision establishing right to work regardless of status of affiliation with any labor union or employee organization. -

[HB 2285](#) by *Beck (SB 2509 by *Dickerson)

Taxes - As introduced, changes from January 1 to January 31, the date by which the commissioner of revenue must report to the members of the finance, ways and means committees of the house of representatives and the senate with respect to certain franchise and excise tax credits for tax periods ending during the previous fiscal year. - Amends TCA Title 67.

[HB 2427](#) by *Mitchell, Clemmons (SB 2493 by *Dickerson, Gilmore)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, designates the Ford Ice Centers in Davidson County as sports authority facilities for purposes of consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

[HB 2033](#) by *Love (SB 1803 by *Gilmore)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, requires each state agency to submit, on or before December 1 of each year, a report to members of the finance, ways and means committees summarizing amounts of federal block grants and purposes for which funds were expended, including any unexpended or returned portions. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 9, Chapter 4.

[HB 1672](#) by *Russell (SB 1762 by *Reeves)

Workers Compensation - As introduced, transfers administration of construction service provider registration from the secretary of state to the bureau of workers' compensation. - Amends TCA Title 50, Chapter 6, Part 4 and Title 50, Chapter 6, Part 9.

[HB 2235](#) by *Lamberth, Gant, Leatherwood (SB 2166 by *Johnson)

Financial Institutions, Dept. of - As introduced, allows the commissioner to require applicants for money transmitter licensure to consent to a criminal history records check and to submit a fingerprint sample; revises other provisions regarding money transmitters. - Amends TCA Title 45, Chapter 7, Part 2.

HB 1305 by *Baum (SB 0183 by *Reeves)

Bonding, Surety and Professional - As introduced, requires each county government to report to the comptroller of the treasury on or before December 1, 2019, whether the county government has elected to obtain blanket surety bond coverage or an insurance policy for employees of the county. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 19.

HB 2329 by *Crawford (SB 2244 by *Lundberg)

Public Records - As introduced, removes discretion for the registers, or other public officers whose duty it may be to keep an index of public records, to maintain separate indices for records maintained in the office of the county register; authorizes registers and such officers to maintain all indices by electronic means. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 2.

HB 2330 by *Crawford (SB 2243 by *Lundberg)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, designates Bristol Motor Speedway as a sports authority facility for purposes of the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

HB 2214 by *Lamberth, Gant, Hawk (SB 2145 by *Johnson, Bailey)

Commerce and Insurance, Dept. of - As introduced, enacts the "Insurance Modernization Act." - Amends TCA Title 56, Chapter 2, Part 2; Title 56, Chapter 5, Part 1 and Title 56, Chapter 54.

HB 2632 by *Holt (SB 2280 by *Stevens)

Handgun Permits - As introduced, requires an applicant for a concealed handgun carry permit renewal to pay a \$50 renewal fee. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 13.

SJR 0178 by *Pody, Kelsey, White, Rose (SJR 0178 Reedy)

Constitutional Amendments - Proposes amendment to remove Article IX, Section 1 of the Constitution of Tennessee, which provides that no minister of the gospel, or priest of any denomination whatever, shall be eligible to a seat in either house of the legislature. -

HB 2201 by *Tillis, Whitson (SB 1775 by *Massey)

Mobile Homes and Manufactured Buildings - As introduced, removes the commissioner of the department of commerce and insurance's ability to establish a monitoring inspection fee paid by manufactured home manufacturers. - Amends TCA Title 55; Title 67 and Title 68.

HB 1191 by *Williams, Smith, Thompson (SB 1033 by *Gardenhire)

Insurance, Life - As introduced, extends the effective date of a commercial risk insurance policy cancellation from 10 days to 15 days after notice is mailed to a named insured. - Amends TCA Title 56 and Title 67.

HB 1851 by *Zachary (SB 1634 by *Massey)

Unclaimed Property - As introduced, increases from “eight months to a year” to “32 to 36 months” the time within which the treasurer must sell a security after receiving it; extends from “eight months” to “32 months” the minimum time period during which the treasurer is required to hold a security prior to selling it and paying the sale proceeds to the owner, upon the owner's request. - Amends TCA Section 66-29-142 and Section 66-29-154.

HB 2131 by *Lamberth, Sexton C, Lynn (SB 2301 by *Watson, Stevens, Yager)

Museums - As introduced, designates the Tennessee state museum located at 1000 Rosa L. Parks Boulevard as the "William E. Haslam Center". - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 12.

[HB 1830](#) by *Boyd, Moon (SB 1778 by *Stevens)

Real Property - As introduced, clarifies that a "bed and breakfast homestay" may be operated in a private condominium, as well as a private home, for purposes of the Bed and Breakfast Establishment Inspection Act of 1990, which requires inspection of a bed and breakfast homestay. - Amends TCA Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 13; Title 56; Title 62; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68.

[HB 0340](#) by *Daniel, Todd, Lafferty, Staples, Faison, Terry, Holt, Hill T, Hill M, Rudder, Hall, Parkinson, Sexton J, DeBerry, Jernigan, Hulsey, Hardaway, Lamar, Hodges, Thompson, Hakeem, Calfee, Dixie, Bricken, Rudd, Dunn, Cepicky, Crawford, Eldridge, Byrd, Wright, Love, Kumar, Chism, Cooper, Miller, Van Huss, Shaw, Carr, Haston (SB 0362 by *Niceley)

Forfeiture of Assets - As introduced, makes various changes to civil forfeiture procedure, including requiring the district attorney general to review the underlying circumstances of a seizure to determine if probable cause exists to justify forfeiture and, when appropriate, file a motion to dismiss the application for forfeiture warrant, upon which the court shall dismiss the application and return the seized property. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 33.

[HB 1857](#) by *Hill T (SB 1862 by *Lundberg)

County Government - As introduced, authorizes a county, upon two-thirds vote of the county legislative body, to dispose of real property at a nominal cost by private negotiation and sale to a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, incorporated under the laws of this state, whose purpose includes educational services to youth in areas including health, science, agriculture, and civic engagement through in-school and after-school programs and school and community clubs and camps. - Amends TCA Title 5.

HB 2687 by *Hill T (SB 2541 by *Niceley)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, requires the comptroller to notify the governing body of a local government regarding the comptroller's approval or disapproval of a private negotiated sale of general obligation refunding bonds within 20 days instead of 15 days from the date the comptroller receives all required information. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 12.

HB 1675 by *Keisling, Dixie (SB 1633 by *Yager)

Air Pollution - As introduced, requires the department of environment and conservation to develop a plan to implement the federal affordable clean energy rule and submit the plan to the EPA for approval by June 15, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 7; Title 65; Title 68 and Chapter 478 of the Public Acts of 2015.

HB 2589 by *Littleton (SB 2633 by *White)

Purchasing and Procurement - As introduced, increases from \$10,000 or more to \$25,000 or more, the amount for which a local board of education or the governing body of a public charter school must make purchases or expenditures by competitive bids; requires the amount to be increased each fiscal year, beginning with the 2021-2022 fiscal year, by the greater of 2 percent or the rate of inflation. - Amends TCA Section 12-3-1212; Section 49-13-111 and Section 49-2-203.

HB 2199 by *Marsh, Carr, Bricken (SB 2120 by *Bowling)

Taxes, Personal Property - As introduced, authorizes the county trustee to proceed against delinquent taxpayers by retaining an agent to collect delinquent personal property taxes, interest, costs, and attorneys' fees. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 5.

HB 2350 by *Smith, Daniel, Sherrell (SB 2312 by *Gardenhire, Reeves, Watson, Jackson, Crowe)

Hospitals and Health Care Facilities - As introduced, makes various changes to the certificate of need process for healthcare facilities and services. - Amends TCA Title 68, Chapter 11, Part 16.

HB 1387 by *Williams, Jernigan (SB 1457 by *Bailey)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, requires out-of-state sellers with more than \$100,000 in sales or more than 200 separate sales in this state during previous 12-month period to collect and remit sales tax to department of revenue rather than having in-state consumers remit the use tax for purchases made from such dealers. - Amends TCA Title 49; Title 67; Chapter 72 of the Public Acts of 2011; Chapter 193 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 273 of the Public Acts of 2015; Chapter 452 of the Public Acts of 2017; Chapter 480 of the Public Acts of 2013; Chapter 530 of the Public Acts of 2009 and Chapter 602 of the Public Acts of 2007.

HB 2715 by *Windle, Crawford, Griffey, Towns, Miller (SB 2882 by *Bailey)

Public Employees - As introduced, provides a \$1,000 pay supplement to emergency medical professionals who complete 40 hours of in-service training. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 68.

HB 2716 by *Windle, Griffey, Miller (SB 2892 by *Bailey)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, increases, from \$800 to \$1,000, the pay supplement a police officer is entitled to receive in 2020 upon successful completion of 40 hours of in-service training. - Amends TCA Section 38-8-111.

HB 2385 by *Calfee, Russell, Griffey, Grills, Sherrell, Powers, Carter, Leatherwood, Littleton, Cochran, Williams, Keisling, Crawford, Carr, Vaughan, Eldridge, Van Huss, Windle, Rudd, Baum (SB 1639 by *Yager)

Firefighters - As introduced, allows a volunteer firefighter to receive \$800 from the commission on firefighting personnel standards and education for completing 40 hours of training annually. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 24.

HB 2479 by *Freeman, Clemmons (SB 2771 by *Bell)

Game and Fish Laws - As introduced, deletes one of two similar options for the purchase of a lifetime sportsman license for senior citizens, the fee for which cannot be automatically adjusted to reflect the same percentage increase as the annual sportsman license. - Amends TCA Title 70, Chapter 2.

HB 1586 by *Griffey (SB 2596 by *Niceley)

Economic and Community Development, Dept. of - As introduced, requires the department to develop a plan to be submitted to the general assembly to ensure that two-thirds of all grant and loan money distributed by the department is distributed to rural counties. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 7 and Title 9.

HB 1815 by *Hardaway, Griffey, Clemmons, Ramsey, Parkinson, Van Huss, DeBerry, Hawk, Staples, Johnson C, Halford, White, Miller, Thompson, Hakeem, Freeman (SB 2042 by *Gilmore)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, creates an offense of using force or coercion to cause a person to join a criminal gang against the person's will; sets penalty based on the age of the victim. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 1626 by *Parkinson, Clemmons (SB 1829 by *Akbari)

Holidays and Days of Special Observance - As introduced, designates as a legal holiday June 19 each year as Juneteenth Day. - Amends TCA Title 15.

HB 2858 by *Sherrell, Sexton C (SB 2687 by *Bowling)

Judicial Officers - As introduced, authorizes the state comptroller to submit data and information regarding state trial judge positions and the weighted caseload formula to the judiciary committees of the house of representatives and the senate in electronic format. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 16; Title 17; Title 36; Title 37 and Title 40.

HB 2661 by *Todd, Lamberth, Carter, Van Huss, Doggett, Moody, Littleton, Hulsey, Rudder, Holt, Leatherwood, Ragan, Wright, Crawford, Eldridge, Reedy, Byrd, Grills, Griffey (SB 2888 by *Bailey)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, permits a person to carry a handgun in a concealed manner; permits a person carrying a handgun in a concealed manner to carry in parks, higher education campuses, and areas posted by local governments in the same manner permitted by handgun carry permit holders. - Amends TCA Section 10-7-504; Section 33-6-413; Section 38-8-116; Title 39; Section 50-1-312; Title 70, Chapter 4, Part 1 and Section 70-5-101.

HB 2041 by *Todd (SB 1956 by *Jackson)

Industrial Development - As introduced, creates an exception to the prohibition on an industrial development corporation purchasing a hotel, motel, or apartment building, if the project is a tourism attraction involving an aggregate investment of public and private funds in excess of \$75 million. - Amends TCA Title 7, Chapter 53.

HB 2139 by *Todd (SB 2546 by *Jackson)

Local Education Agencies - As introduced, deletes the provision that limited the availability of recall elections for school board members to only Madison County. - Amends TCA Title 2 and Title 49, Chapter 2, Part 2.

HB 0992 by *Gant, Holt, Hulsey, Eldridge, Leatherwood, Sexton C, Lamberth, Travis, Lafferty, Zachary, Carter (SB 0457 by *Stevens, Niceley, Southerland, Gresham)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, exempts certain sales of gold, silver, platinum, and palladium coins and bullion from the sales and use tax. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

HB 1633 by *Gant (SB 1961 by *Gresham, Powers)

Utilities, Utility Districts - As introduced, requires a municipal utility board or the municipal governing body, and the comptroller, to establish procedures and guidelines for a natural gas utility system to devote revenues derived from the system to fund chambers of commerce or economic and community organizations; requires certain financial reporting by entities receiving such funds. - Amends TCA Section 7-34-115.

HB 2809 by *Ogles (SB 2206 by *Johnson)

Law Enforcement Training Academy - As introduced, changes the time period within which the general assembly must confirm the appointment of a citizen member to the Tennessee peace officer standards and training commission from within 90 calendar days to within 60 calendar days. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 38 and Title 49, Chapter 4.

HB 2760 by *Ogles (SB 2677 by *Johnson)

Taxes, Sales - As introduced, changes, from February 1 to February 15, the date by which the department of revenue must report findings and recommendations regarding sales taxes collected on electronic nicotine delivery devices to the speakers of the senate and the house of representatives and the chairs of the respective finance, ways and means committees. - Amends TCA Title 67.

HB 1723 by *Camper (SB 1560 by *Kelsey, Kyle)

Alcoholic Beverages - As introduced, authorizes the sale of alcoholic beverages and beer for consumption on the premises of the Memphis Zoo during the zoo's regular operating hours. - Amends TCA Section 57-4-101.

HB 1923 by *Hazlewood, Gant, White, Griffey, Eldridge (SB 1991 by *Stevens)

Professions and Occupations - As introduced, requires persons working with certain electrical equipment to meet certain requirements; makes that electrical equipment subject to inspection by the state electrical inspector; prohibits liability against certain electric systems arising from those persons working with that electrical equipment; requires copies of the national standards to be available for public viewing. - Amends TCA Section 68-101-104.

HB 2168 by *Hazlewood, Love, Ramsey (SB 2253 by *Haile, Crowe)

General Assembly, Directed Studies - As introduced, creates the Tennessee Child Care Task Force. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 29; Title 49 and Title 71.

HB 1806 by *Hazlewood (SB 1727 by *Gardenhire)

Public Funds and Financing - As introduced, specifies the assumptions that a political subdivision's actuary's report must include when analyzing financing obligations under the political subdivision's pension plan; adds other related revisions. - Amends TCA Title 9, Chapter 3, Part 5.

HB 2633 by *Holt (SB 2305 by *Stevens)

Auctions and Auctioneers - As introduced, establishes how a person may obtain a gallery license to operate an auction house, auction barn, auction gallery, or any other type of auction operating at a fixed site. - Amends TCA Title 62, Chapter 19.

HB 2749 by *Miller (SB 2799 by *Akbari)

Taxes - As introduced, enacts the "Taxpayer Protection Act." - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 9 and Title 67.

HB 0095 by *Shaw (SB 0060 by *Gilmore)

Taxes, Exemption and Credits - As introduced, eliminates the sales tax on feminine hygiene products. - Amends TCA Title 67, Chapter 6.

HB 1611 by *Staples, Dixie (SB 1622 by *Massey, Yager)

Criminal Procedure - As introduced, authorizes the issuance of electronic citations, and not just written citations on paper, for certain misdemeanor criminal offenses in lieu of arrest. - Amends TCA Title 40 and Title 55.

HB 2498 by *Hawk, Clemmons (SB 2267 by *Yarbro, Crowe, Massey)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, repeals the law that allows handgun carry permit holders to transport or store a firearm or firearm ammunition in the permit holder's motor vehicle while on or utilizing a public or private parking area if the firearm or firearm ammunition is kept from ordinary observation. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 49 and Title 50.

HB 2900 by *Hardaway, Clemmons (SB 2829 by *Robinson, Kyle)

Expunction - As introduced, requires the court to notify a defendant at the time of sentencing if the conviction is for an expungeable offense and the time period after which a petition to expunge may be filed. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 32; Title 40, Chapter 35, Part 3 and Chapter 244 of the Public Acts of 2019.

HJR 0821 by *Hardaway, Hodges, Clemmons

Memorials, Government Officials - Urges U.S. Attorneys to pursue criminal charges against persons discharging firearms in violation of state or federal laws on the interstate system and other federal highways in Tennessee. -

HB 1577 by *Hardaway, Carter, Griffey (SB 2447 by *Kyle)

Domestic Violence - As introduced, requires a magistrate imposing global positioning monitoring on a defendant as a condition for bail for an offense involving domestic violence to inform the victim of how to obtain a copy of the defendant's conditions of bail including any geographic restrictions. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 4.

HB 1471 by *Hardaway (SB 1322 by *Kyle)

Law Enforcement - As introduced, requires each local law enforcement agency to enter into an agreement with the Tennessee bureau of investigation to require the TBI to investigate any officer-involved shooting that occurs within the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 6; Title 8, Chapter 7 and Title 38.

HB 2395 by *Curcio (SB 2362 by *Haile)

Children - As introduced, changes, from March 1 to February 1, the date by which the department of children's services must appear before the judiciary committees of the senate and the house of representatives for a review of the department's policies affecting children served by the department. - Amends TCA Title 37; Title 39 and Title 40.

HB 2621 by *Curcio (SB 2276 by *Stevens)

Firearms and Ammunition - As introduced, clarifies that the term "crime of violence" in regard to weapons offenses includes aggravated rape of a child rather than especially aggravated rape of a child. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 16; Title 33; Title 36; Title 37; Title 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 49 and Title 70.

HB 1131 by *Curcio (SB 0409 by *Stevens)

Bail, Bail Bonds - As introduced, creates a rebuttable presumption that a person charged with a bailable offense will not violate the conditions of their release if the offense is expungeable and the person has not been previously convicted of an offense that is ineligible for expunction. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 11 and Title 40, Chapter 7.

HB 2280 by *Curcio (SB 2275 by *Stevens)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, requires an agent or officer of the Tennessee bureau of investigation, in addition to a law enforcement officer, to provide a minor with the Tennessee human trafficking resource center hotline and release the minor to a parent's or guardian's custody or transport the minor to a shelter when the minor is taken into custody for suspicion of committing the offense of prostitution. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 39; Title 40 and Title 71.

HB 2003 by *Curcio (SB 2004 by *Bowling)

Criminal Procedure - As introduced, allows the treasurer's report on the amount of any surplus in the electronic monitoring indigency fund to be reported to the commissioner of finance and administration electronically. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40; Title 55 and Title 69.

HB 2275 by *Curcio (SB 2749 by *Bell)

Criminal Offenses - As introduced, deletes the offense of impersonation of a licensed professional. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 16, Part 3.

Portland - Subject to local approval, revises charter provisions relating to contracts procured by the City; authorizes city council to fix the time and place of regular meetings of the council; requires a two-thirds vote of the city council to adopt an ordinance or resolution where specified; clarifies that certain ordinances may require a minimum time between two readings prior to becoming effective. - Amends Chapter 568 of the Private Acts of 1939; as amended.

Dickson County - Subject to local approval, specifies that the General Sessions Court Clerk must serve as the Clerk of the Juvenile Court of Dickson County rather than the County Clerk. - Amends Chapter 267 of the Private Acts of 1982; as amended.

Sharon - Subject to local approval, changes the title of marshal to police chief; removes the police chief's duty to collect taxes; removes the recorder and treasurer and police chief's term of one year; removes antiquated language regarding jails. - Amends Chapter 177 of the Acts of 1901; as amended.
