NON-BUDGET BILLS

- 1. [SB 2734](#) *Bell, Gilmore** (HB 2517 by *Curcio, Hulsey, Faison, Whitson, Cepicky, Dunn, Tillis, Farmer, Van Huss, Sherrell, Daniel, Eldridge, Hazlewood, Love, Carter, Dixie, Staples, Camper)
Sentencing- As introduced, removes requirement that a person convicted of a drug offense in a drug-free school zone must serve the entire minimum sentence imposed before being eligible for release on parole; decreases the drug-free school zone from 1,000 feet to 500 feet; makes various changes to sentencing requirements for certain controlled substance violations. - Amends TCA Title 16, Chapter 2; Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4 and Section 49-2-116.
- 2. [SB 2485](#) *Dickerson, Gilmore** (HB 1642 by *Jernigan, Love)
Alcoholic Beverages- As introduced, designates the Tennessee State Fairgrounds in Nashville as an urban park center; authorizes the granting of a franchise for the provision of food or beverage, including alcoholic beverages, on its premises; specifies that the holder of such franchise is also considered an urban park center. - Amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4.

3. [SB 1974](#) *Gresham (HB 2470 by *Dunn, White, Cepicky)
Education- As introduced, clarifies that the powers and authority of the state building commission with respect to construction or demolition projects undertaken by foundations created for the benefit of the state universities originally governed by the board of regents still apply, after the restructuring of the board of regents, to foundations created for the benefit of state universities governed by local governing boards of trustees. - Amends TCA Title 4 and Title 49.
4. [SB 2667](#) *Briggs (HB 2842 by *Farmer, Carter)
Lottery, Charitable- As introduced, adds tickets and coupons to the types of legal instruments entitling a winner of a charitable gaming event to a non-cash prize or award. - Amends TCA Title 3.

5. [SB 2931](#) *Johnson (HB 2922 by *Lamberth, Gant, Lynn, Hicks, Hill M)
Appropriations- As introduced, makes appropriations for the purpose of defraying the expenses of certain legislative enactments passed during the 2019 session of the 111th General Assembly; earmarks sufficient state funds for the purpose of funding any bill naming a highway or bridge in honor of a service member killed in action. -
6. [SB 2932](#) *Johnson (HB 2924 by *Lamberth, Gant, Lynn, Hicks, Hill M)
Budget Procedures- As introduced, authorizes grant payments under the grant assistance program for nursing home care to be made either monthly or quarterly. - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 9; Title 10; Title 12; Title 13; Title 16; Title 17; Title 18; Title 29; Title 33; Title 36; Title 37; Title 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 41; Title 42; Title 43; Title 44; Title 45; Title 47; Title 48; Title 49; Title 50; Title 53; Title 54; Title 55; Title 56; Title 57; Title 58; Title 59; Title 60; Title 61; Title 62; Title 63; Title 64; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67; Title 68; Title 69; Title 70 and Title 71.
7. [SB 2933](#) *Johnson (HB 2923 by *Lamberth, Gant, Lynn, Hicks, Hill M)
Bond Issues- As introduced, authorizes the state, acting by resolution of its funding board, to issue and sell its interest-bearing bonds and bond anticipation notes for certain purposes. - Amends certain public acts authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds and bond anticipation notes. This act makes appropriations for an indefinite period of time for the purpose of allocating the proceeds of the bonds and notes authorized by this act.

8. [SB 2935](#) *Johnson (HB 2930 by *Lamberth)

Bond Issues- As introduced, authorizes the state, acting by resolution of its funding board, to issue and sell its interest-bearing bonds and bond anticipation notes for certain purposes. -

Knox County- As introduced and subject to local approval, authorizes Knox County to collect the privilege tax on occupancy from transients in owner-occupied single family residences, in apartments or condominiums where less than 25 percent of the total units are rented to transients, and in single-family homes where each single-family dwelling unit occupies a separate lot. - Amends Chapter 847 of the Public Acts of 1982, as amended by Chapter 628 of the Public Acts of 1996.

10. [SB 1614](#) *Haile (HB 1607 by *Zachary, Cepicky)

Local Government, General- As introduced, removes prohibition on a member of a local governing body who is also an employee of the local governing body from voting on matters in which the member has a conflict of interest, and reinstates the declaration of conflict prior to voting. - Amends TCA Title 2; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8 and Title 12.

1. [SB 2681](#) *Rose, Johnson (HB 2706 by *Gant)

Real Property- As introduced, increases from 15 days to 15 business days, the time period in which a person must endeavor to serve notice of a claim against a contractor, subcontractor, supplier, or design professional related to an alleged construction defect following discovery of the alleged defect. - Amends TCA Title 28 and Title 66.

2. [SB 1942](#) *Briggs (HB 1890 by *Helton, Smith, Ramsey, Daniel, Hodges, Williams, Hakeem, Mitchell, Thompson, Rudder, Eldridge, Staples, Hazlewood, Whitson, Moon, Garrett, Hill T, Cepicky, Kumar, Hill M, Miller, Sparks, Carr, Powers, Hawk, Jernigan, Beck, DeBerry, Parkinson, Johnson G, Casada, Dixie)

Pharmacy, Pharmacists- As introduced, prohibits a pharmacy benefit manager and certain other third parties from taking certain actions against entities and pharmacies participating in the federal 340B drug discount program; creates a private cause of action against violators. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 56 and Title 71.

3. [SB 2684](#) *Watson (HB 2680 by *Hill T, Smith)

Health Care- As introduced, authorizes healthcare facilities to provide an electronic method for insureds or their representatives to acknowledge and sign the statutorily required notice that the insured agrees to receive medical services by an out-of-network provider and will receive a bill for the amount unpaid by the insured's insurer. - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 56; Title 63 and Title 68.

1. [SB 2381](#) *Bell, Kelsey, Reeves (HB 2623 by *Curcio, Casada, Weaver)
Civil Procedure- As introduced, changes, from not less than five days to not less than seven days before a hearing, the time the opposing party has to file a response to a petition under the Tennessee Public Participation Act. - Amends TCA Title 1; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 8; Title 9; Title 20; Title 27; Title 28; Title 29; Title 47 and Title 49.

1. [SB 2465](#) *Gresham (HB 2568 by *Faison, Lamberth, Lynn, Dunn, Gant, Sexton J, Moody, Zachary, Calfee, Weaver, Terry, Byrd, Smith, Leatherwood, Rudd, Helton, Sherrell, Williams, Todd, Hurt, Powers, Littleton, Ogles)

Abortion- As introduced, requires any facility in which more than 50 abortions were performed during the previous calendar year to post a sign informing patients that a chemical abortion may be reversed following the first dose of a two-dose treatment; requires a patient to receive similar notice prior to and after having the first dose of a chemical abortion; provides criminal penalties and civil actions for any violation of the act. - Amends TCA Title 11; Title 39, Chapter 15, Part 2; Title 63 and Title 68.

2. [SB 2420](#) *Rose (HB 2771 by *Moody)

Law Enforcement- As introduced, expands the type of equipment for which law enforcement agencies may exchange confiscated weapons to include any equipment suitable for use for legitimate law enforcement purposes. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 13.

3. [SB 2397](#) *Hensley (HB 2458 by *Griffey)

Remedies and Special Proceedings- As introduced, enacts the "Stop Social Media Censorship Act." - Amends TCA Title 3; Title 4; Title 8, Chapter 6 and Title 29.

4. [SB 2614](#) *Hensley (HB 2536 by *Doggett, Byrd, Reedy, Griffey, Van Huss, Moody, Hill T, Eldridge, Kumar, Sexton J, Todd)
Remedies and Special Proceedings- As introduced, creates a civil action against any person or government entity that infringes upon a person's right to bear arms under the Tennessee or United States Constitutions; requires the person or entity to be liable for actual or statutory damages, punitive damages, attorney's fees, and court costs. - Amends TCA Title 4, Chapter 54 and Title 8, Chapter 47.
5. [SB 2257](#) *Crowe (HB 2339 by *Hulsey, Dixie)
Probation and Parole- As introduced, specifies that a prisoner who has served greater than 50 percent of the sentence imposed on combined state sentences and has an active detainer to serve a term of imprisonment in another jurisdiction must be considered for parole to the detainer if certain conditions are met. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 28.
6. [SB 1300](#) *Pody (HB 1172 by *Weaver)
State Government- As introduced, creates a new division of state government, the Tennessee Office of Cooperative Disability Investigation, to operate for two years. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 8; Title 10; Title 38 and Title 71.
7. [SB 2230](#) *Pody (HB 2476 by *Moody, Van Huss)
Privacy, Confidentiality- As introduced, adds communications with a peer supporter occurring during a critical incident stress management intervention to those communications that are considered confidential and for which a person cannot be called to testify or otherwise divulge. - Amends TCA Title 10 and Title 24, Chapter 1.
8. [SB 2368](#) *Pody (HB 2291 by *Hulsey, Howell, Byrd, Crawford, Littleton, Moody, Doggett, Rudder, Helton, Tillis, Williams, Haston, Todd, Vaughan, Hill T, Griffey, Weaver, Cepicky)
Law Enforcement- As introduced, requires that a hearing requested by a police officer who has been dismissed, demoted, suspended, or transferred for punitive reasons be set within 21 calendar days following the request, rather than 14 calendar days. - Amends TCA Title 38.
9. [SB 1859](#) *Niceley (HB 1715 by *Hardaway, Clemmons, Ramsey, Parkinson, Lamberth, Ogles)
Criminal Offenses- As introduced, creates the offenses sexual abuse of a corpse, a Class D felony, and aggravated sexual abuse of a corpse, a Class C felony; requires a person convicted of either offense to register as a sexual offender. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 3 and Title 40, Chapter 39, Part 2.

10. [SB 1344](#) *Massey (HB 0969 by *Rudd)

Mental Illness- As introduced, allows courts to order a person into a program of assisted outpatient mental health treatment upon finding certain conditions are met; provides a process for certain persons to petition a court on behalf of a proposed patient; establishes criteria for the evaluation of proposed patients and reporting to the court by physicians and certain mental health professionals. - Amends TCA Title 33.

11. [SB 2887](#) *Bailey (HB 2298 by *Ragan, Van Huss, Sherrell)

Firearms and Ammunition- As introduced, changes from February 1 to January 15 the date by which the Tennessee bureau of investigation is required to provide an annual report to the judiciary committees of the senate and house of representatives on the amount of money collected from gun dealers to perform background checks that are in excess of the costs to the bureau to perform the checks. - Amends TCA Title 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 49; Section 50-3-201; Section 58-1-112; Section 70-4-123 and Section 70-5-101.

12. [SB 2888](#) *Bailey (HB 2661 by *Todd, Lamberth, Carter, Van Huss, Doggett, Moody, Littleton, Hulse, Rudder, Holt, Leatherwood, Ragan, Wright, Crawford, Eldridge, Reedy, Byrd, Grills, Griffey)

Firearms and Ammunition- As introduced, permits a person to carry a handgun in a concealed manner; permits a person carrying a handgun in a concealed manner to carry in parks, higher education campuses, and areas posted by local governments in the same manner permitted by handgun carry permit holders. - Amends TCA Section 10-7-504; Section 33-6-413; Section 38-8-116; Title 39; Section 50-1-312; Title 70, Chapter 4, Part 1 and Section 70-5-101.

13. [SB 2892](#) *Bailey (HB 2716 by *Windle, Griffey)

Law Enforcement- As introduced, increases, from \$800 to \$1,000, the pay supplement a police officer is entitled to receive in 2020 upon successful completion of 40 hours of in-service training. - Amends TCA Section 38-8-111.

14. [SB 2894](#) *Bailey (HB 1990 by *Keisling, Griffey, Lamberth, Faison)

Abuse- As introduced, authorizes release to law enforcement of information regarding the identity of a person who reports a case of suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of an adult so that law enforcement may follow up with the person to determine if the report was investigated and resolved. - Amends TCA Title 10, Chapter 7, Part 5; Title 39, Chapter 15, Part 5 and Title 71, Chapter 6, Part 1.

15. [SB 0069](#) *Akbari, Robinson, Gilmore (HB 0310 by *White, Thompson, Dixie)

Sentencing- As introduced, reduces the sentence a person who commits first degree murder as a minor is required to serve before becoming release eligible from 51 years to 25 years; applies to offenses committed on or after July 1, 2019. - Amends TCA Title 37; Title 39; Title 40 and Title 41.

16. [SB 1849](#) *Akbari (HB 2389 by *Camper, Clemmons)

Controlled Substances- As introduced, authorizes the retail sale of marijuana; levies a 12 percent tax on the retail sale of marijuana. - Amends TCA Title 29, Chapter 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 53, Chapter 11; Title 67; Title 68 and Title 71.

17. [SB 2527](#) *Stevens (HB 2660 by *Todd, Lamberth, Carter, Van Huss, Doggett, Moody, Littleton, Hulsey, Rudder, Holt, Leatherwood, Ragan, Wright, Crawford, Eldridge, Reedy, Byrd, Grills, Griffey, White, Farmer, Kumar, Haston, Russell, Bricken, Smith, Weaver, Williams, Faison, Hurt, Baum, Rudd, Helton, Sherrell)

Civil Procedure- As introduced, provides that a person who uses justifiable force against another may request a stay of proceedings in any civil action based on the use of force until the criminal investigation has concluded; creates an immunity hearing at which the court may dismiss an action that is barred by immunity. - Amends TCA Title 39.

18. [SB 1817](#) *Gardenhire (HB 1850 by *Carter, Lamberth, Sherrell, Boyd, White, Ogles, Whitson, Hazlewood, Helton, Windle, Farmer)

Law Enforcement- As introduced, requires the conduct of law enforcement personnel in initiating or continuing pursuit of a fleeing party to be in reckless disregard of law enforcement policies and procedures in order for the law enforcement personnel or the employer of the law enforcement personnel to be liable for injuries to a third party proximately caused by a fleeing party. - Amends TCA Title 55, Chapter 8.

19. [SB 0755](#) *Roberts (HB 0989 by *Littleton, Curcio)

Children's Services, Dept. of- As introduced, changes from March 1 to April 1 the date by which the department must appear before the appropriate committees in the senate and the house of representatives for a review of the department's policies that affect the children it serves. - Amends TCA Title 33; Title 34; Title 36; Title 37; Title 41; Title 49; Title 68 and Title 71.

20. [SB 2452](#) *Roberts (HB 2539 by *Doggett, Hill M, Hill T, Griffey, Faison)

Criminal Procedure- As introduced, specifies that an order of restitution entered in a criminal action is a final civil judgment upon entry of the order; makes various other changes in regard to restitution for victims of crime. - Amends TCA Title 28; Title 37; Title 39 and Title 40.

21. [SB 2460](#) *Roberts (HB 2540 by *Doggett, Faison)

Fines and Penalties- As introduced, clarifies that a clerk of the court must offer a payment plan after one year from the date of the completion of the sentence when a person has not paid all litigation taxes, court costs, and fines assessed as a result of the disposition of any offense under criminal laws. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 24.

22. [SB 1194](#) *White (HB 1309 by *Hill T, Crawford, Hulsey)

Children- As introduced, requires the Tennessee advisory commission on intergovernmental relations to study the implementation and effects of the missing children registry and report to the judiciary committees on or before January 1, 2020. - Amends TCA Title 37; Title 38 and Title 39.

23. [SB 1925](#) *White, Briggs (HB 2769 by *Moody, Van Huss, Griffey, Littleton, Smith, Howell, Hurt, Helton, Sherrell, Towns, Faison, Keisling, Todd, Farmer, Hakeem, Carter, Williams, Gant, Garrett, Eldridge, Ragan, Rudd, Rudder, Coley, Hazlewood, Moon, Powers, Calfee, Beck, Hardaway, Terry, Ogles, Zachary, White, Hall, Grills, Doggett, Crawford, Lamar, Bricken, Curcio, Weaver, Hicks, Hodges, Tillis, Parkinson, Whitson, Cepicky, Holsclaw, Lynn, Powell, Windle, Byrd, Carr, Stewart, Chism)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, adds the offense of trafficking a person for a commercial sex act to the meaning of predatory offenses for purposes of sentencing a person as a child sexual predator. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 5.

24. [SB 2062](#) *White (HB 2293 by *Van Huss, Holt, Ragan, Rudder, Griffey, Carr, Lamberth, Calfee, Bricken, Cepicky, Halford, Moon, Todd, Powers, Byrd, Carter, Lafferty, Eldridge, Hall, Russell, Helton, Crawford, Rudd, Haston, Sexton J, Keisling, Doggett, Hill T, Hazlewood, Littleton, Sparks, Leatherwood, Sherrell)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, creates the offense of mail theft, which is intentionally obtaining mail from another person's mailbox or premises without the consent of the addressee and with the intent to deprive the addressee of the mail. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 14.

25. [SB 2636](#) *White (HB 2615 by *Coley, Holt, Hill T, Reedy, Griffey, Smith, Doggett, Helton, Faison, Bricken, Littleton, Hurt, Terry, Towns, Russell, Todd, Sherrell, Powers)

Juvenile Offenders- As introduced, expands the unruly act of illegal use of a communication device by a minor to include possessing or transmitting an image of sexual activity involving a minor. - Amends TCA Title 37, Chapter 1, Part 1; Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 5 and Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 10.

26. [SB 0742](#) *Kyle (HB 1417 by *Towns)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, increases the penalty for aggravated assault and reckless endangerment when committed from within a motor vehicle; requires the court to revoke a defendant's license for up to one year following any period of confinement imposed; requires that a motor vehicle used in a second or subsequent offense be seized and forfeited. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 13 and Title 40.

- 27. [SB 1321](#) *Kyle (HB 1475 by *Hardaway)**
Law Enforcement- As introduced, creates Class E felony of law enforcement officer operating a law enforcement body camera in any manner that would prevent the creation of evidence with the intent to obstruct justice. - Amends TCA Title 10 and Title 39.
- 28. [SB 1322](#) *Kyle (HB 1471 by *Hardaway)**
Law Enforcement- As introduced, requires each local law enforcement agency to enter into an agreement with the Tennessee bureau of investigation to require the TBI to investigate any officer-involved shooting that occurs within the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency. - Amends TCA Title 8, Chapter 6; Title 8, Chapter 7 and Title 38.
- 29. [SB 1722](#) *Kyle (HB 2368 by *Hardaway, Clemmons, Mitchell)**
Firearms and Ammunition- As introduced, repeals the law that allows handgun carry permit holders to transport or store a firearm or firearm ammunition in the permit holder's motor vehicle while on or utilizing a public or private parking area if the firearm or firearm ammunition is kept from ordinary observation. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 49 and Title 50.
- 30. [SB 1725](#) *Kyle (HB 2081 by *Powell, Clemmons, Shaw)**
Child Custody and Support- As introduced, adds as a ground for termination of parental rights a finding by a court that a parent committed an act of nonconsensual sexual penetration from which act the child was conceived; gives the other parent standing to file a petition for termination of parental rights of the offending parent; includes a finding by a court that a parent committed an act of nonconsensual sexual penetration from which act the child was conceived as a basis for denial of custody, visitation, and inheritance rights. - Amends TCA Title 36, Chapter 1 and Title 36, Chapter 6.
- 31. [SB 1807](#) *Kyle (HB 1873 by *Johnson G, Clemmons)**
Orders of Protection- As introduced, allows a court to issue an emergency protection order upon a finding that a person poses an imminent risk of harm to the person or others if allowed to purchase or possess a firearm; authorizes a family member, household member, intimate partner, or law enforcement officer to petition for such an order. - Amends TCA Title 36 and Title 39.
- 32. [SB 2326](#) *Kyle (HB 2642 by *Towns)**
Criminal Procedure- As introduced, in the case of certain persons who are eligible for restoration of citizenship rights, authorizes the pardoning authority or agent or officer of the supervising or incarcerating authority that issues the certificate of restoration, to forward a copy of the certificate by mail or email to the state coordinator of elections. - Amends TCA Title 40, Chapter 29.

33. [SB 2403](#) *Kyle (HB 2426 by *Mitchell, Griffey)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, increases the penalty for failure of a driver involved in a motor vehicle accident to stop at the scene of the accident from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class E felony when the person knew or should have known that the accident resulted in injury. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55.

34. [SB 2441](#) *Kyle (HB 2741 by *Miller, Clemmons)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, creates an exception to the offense of simple possession of marijuana for persons with a valid, state-issued medical marijuana identification card who obtained the marijuana pursuant to a valid physician's recommendation. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 17, Part 4.

35. [SB 2447](#) *Kyle (HB 1577 by *Hardaway, Carter, Griffey)

Domestic Violence- As introduced, requires a magistrate imposing global positioning monitoring on a defendant as a condition for bail for an offense involving domestic violence to inform the victim of how to obtain a copy of the defendant's conditions of bail including any geographic restrictions. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 55, Chapter 10, Part 4.

36. [SB 2699](#) *Kyle (HB 2757 by *DeBerry)

Courts, General Sessions- As introduced, prohibits a general sessions court clerk from collecting a fine, costs, or litigation taxes that have been in default for at least 15 years following the year in which the fine, costs, or litigation taxes became delinquent. - Amends TCA Title 16; Title 18; Title 28; Title 29 and Title 40.

37. [SB 1781](#) *Bowling (HB 1814 by *Hardaway, Griffey, Lamberth, Van Huss, Towns, Mitchell, Rudder, Hulsey, Eldridge, Moody, Doggett, Daniel, Ogles, Todd)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, creates the Class D felony of possessing a telecommunications device in a penal institution; adds, as a new enhancement factor to be considered in sentencing, whether the offense was planned or executed using a telecommunications device within a penal institution. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40 and Title 41.

[SB 1820](#) *Bowling, Gilmore, White, Robinson (HB 1575 by *Ogles, Farmer, Lamar, Lamberth, Lynn, Moody, Faison, Littleton, Weaver, Hicks, Smith, Helton, Gant, Rudder, Van Huss, Holt, Todd, Garrett, Wright, Bricken, Boyd, Griffey, Doggett, Potts, Dixie, Carter, Hill T, Parkinson, Hodges, Rudd, Crawford, Casada, Calfee, Halford, Hurt, Hall, Eldridge, Haston, Leatherwood, Grills, Reedy, Howell, Russell, Keisling, Vaughan, Sexton J, Zachary, Cochran, Cepicky, Williams, Ragan, Baum, Carr, Hardaway, Sherrell, Towns, Thompson, Freeman, Terry, Coley, Curcio, Beck, Camper, White, Powers, Whitson, Byrd)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, adds imminent danger of serious sexual abuse as a justification for the use of deadly force in self-defense and to defenses of duress and use of deadly force by law enforcement officer; defines serious sexual abuse as rape,

aggravated rape, rape of a child, or aggravated rape of a child. - Amends TCA Title 39 and Title 40.

39. [SB 1913](#) *Bowling, Gilmore, Robinson (HB 1650 by *Lamar, Hardaway, Love, Beck, Ogles, Curcio, Farmer, Dixie, Potts, Coley, Hodges, Camper, Johnson G, Terry, Towns, Chism, Freeman, Hakeem, Weaver, Helton, Clemmons, Thompson, Smith, Doggett, Stewart, Shaw, Parkinson, Moon, Miller, Powell, Cepicky)

Criminal Offenses- As introduced, for purposes of determining if a person has a duty to retreat before threatening or using force in self-defense, declares that a person is not considered to be engaged in unlawful activity or where the person does not have a right to be if the person is engaged in activity or in a place due to the person's status as a victim of human trafficking. - Amends TCA Title 39, Chapter 11, Part 6.

40. [SB 2004](#) *Bowling (HB 2003 by *Curcio)

Criminal Procedure- As introduced, allows the treasurer's report on the amount of any surplus in the electronic monitoring indigency fund to be reported to the commissioner of finance and administration electronically. - Amends TCA Title 39; Title 40; Title 55 and Title 69.

41. [SB 2121](#) *Bowling (HB 2191 by *Coley, Beck, Ogles, Freeman)

Sexual Offenses- As introduced, revises and enacts various provisions regarding the rights of victims of sexually oriented crimes, including decreasing the time period within which a law enforcement agency must submit a sexual assault evidence collection (SAEC) kit to the TBI, requiring the TBI to begin analyzing an SAEC kit within 30 days of receipt, requiring the TBI to create a tracking system for SAEC kits, and prohibiting the use of forensic evidence against the victim in certain circumstances. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 29; Title 38; Title 39; Title 40 and Title 63.

42. [SB 2215](#) *Bowling, Pody (HB 2576 by *Ragan, Van Huss, Weaver, Griffey, Todd, Sherrell)

Children- As introduced, prohibits the provision of sexual identity change therapy to prepubescent minors; prohibits the provision of sexual identity change therapy to minors who have entered puberty unless a parent or guardian has written recommendations for the therapy from at least three physicians; punishes violations as child abuse; designates violations by healthcare professionals as professional misconduct. - Amends TCA Title 8; Title 36; Title 37; Title 39; Title 49; Title 53; Title 56; Title 63; Title 68 and Title 71.

43. [SB 2587](#) *Bowling (HB 2812 by *Rudder)

Vital Records- As introduced, grants discretion to the state registrar to issue a delayed birth certificate upon finding a preponderance of the evidence weighs in favor of an applicant; permits the state registrar to consider documentation such as obituaries and birth or death certificates of the applicant's parents or siblings, property tax records, and certain other documentary evidence that may support the applicant's claimed place of birth. - Amends TCA Title 4; Title 10 and Title 68, Chapter 3.
