FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 763 - HB 1000

March 6, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Requires a degree-granting postsecondary educational institution to designate a staff member to serve as a homeless-student liaison. Requires the liaison to assist homeless students who are enrolled, or planning to enroll in the institution, and to develop a plan to provide homeless students access to housing offered by the institution during and between academic terms.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (005242): Deletes all language after the enacting clause and rewrites the legislation such that the only substantive change is requiring institutions that offer housing resources, to develop a plan to provide homeless students who are enrolled in the institution access to housing resources during and between academic terms.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Based on information provided by the locally-governed institutions, the provision of this legislation can be accomplished with the institution's existing staff and resource without a significant impact on institutional expenditures.
- Middle Tennessee State University currently utilizes a homeless student liaison to provide services for homeless students.
- Based on information provided by the University of Tennessee, the provisions of this legislation can be accomplished with the institution's existing staff and resources without a significant impact on institutional expenditures.
- Any impact to state or local government is estimated to be not significant.
