FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 44 - HB 181

March 9, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Requires a county or municipality to publish its certified highway map on the county or municipality's website, which must be accessible to the public no less than 30 days prior to the date of a public hearing.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (005147): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Removes the provision of law that states photo identification licenses issued to persons 65 years or older shall not expire and instead authorizes such persons to elect to receive a photo identification license that does not expire.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- The total number of persons 65 and older with unexpired state identification licenses is 65,358.
- The provisions of this legislation are not expected to impact the total number of persons that would qualify and apply for a non-expiring photo identification license, as it does not change the fee or fee structure.
- It is expected that the few eligible persons that would forego a non-expiring license for one that does expire is not significant.
- Therefore, authorizing a non-expiring photo identification license for persons over 65 years, rather than requiring it, will not result in a significant impact to state revenue or expenditures.
