FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 516 - SB 862

March 21, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Imposes a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$2,500 for a violation of an order of protection or restraining order. Directs that such fine revenue be transferred to the State Treasurer to be credited to the General Fund and distributed annually to the Isaiah 117 House or the Tennessee Court Appointed Special Advocates Association.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006246): Deletes and replaces all language after the enacting clause. Imposes a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$2,500 for a violation of an order of protection or restraining order.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- Based on the Fiscal Review Committee's 2008 study and the Administrative Office of the Courts' 2012 study on collection of court costs, fees, and fines, collection in criminal cases is insignificant. The proposed legislation will not significantly increase local revenue.
