FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 75 - HB 129

March 21, 2019

**SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL:** Requires custodians to make appropriate quantities of healthcare products available in housing units and medical areas to all incarcerated women in a correctional facility at no cost to inmates.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (005760):** Deletes and replaces all language after the enacting clause such that the only substantive change is to limit the proposed legislation to custodians of state correctional facilities.

**FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:**

**Unchanged from the original fiscal note.**

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- The proposed legislation defines a custodian as a warden of a state correctional facility.
- The proposed legislation defines healthcare products as feminine hygiene products, non-lye base moisturizing soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and any other healthcare product a custodian deems appropriate.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Correction, any impact resulting from the proposed legislation is estimated to be not significant.
