FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 637 - HB 1462

March 22, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Increases, from 10 days to 10 business days, the time period in which an applicant for a nonresidential substitution-based treatment center for opiate addiction must notify certain individuals if the facility involves a healthcare facility in which a county or municipality is the lessor of the facility or real property on which it sits.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006444): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Exempts a licensed hospital under Title 33 from obtaining a certificate of need (CON) prior to operating a nonresidential substitution-based treatment center for opiate addiction if the program is the located on the same campus as the operating hospital and the hospital operates more than 100 or more psychiatric beds.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services can accommodate the proposed legislation within existing resources without an increased appropriation or reduced reversion.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Health, the Department can accommodate the proposed legislation within existing resources without an increased appropriation or reduced reversion.
- Based on information provided by the Health Services and Development Agency, the proposed legislation will not have a significant fiscal impact on the agency.
