FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 1232 - SB 1231

March 26, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Decreases, from 30 to 21 days, the amount of time a lobbyist or an employer of a lobbyist has to electronically report to the Tennessee Ethics Commission the total aggregate cost paid for an in-state event to which all General Assembly members were invited.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006450): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Increases, from seven to fourteen days, the time period prior to an event featuring entertainment, food, refreshments, meals, beverages, or health screenings, by which the hosting employer or lobbyist must provide invitation to the each member of the General Assembly and the Ethics Commission.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- This legislation will have no significant impact on current law governing events held by employers and lobbyists for the benefit of members of the General Assembly.
