FISCAL MEMORANDUM**

HB 1192 - SB 1248

April 17, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Changes, from August 1 to July 1, the deadline by which the State Board of Education (SBE) must submit to members of the General Assembly an annual report related to civic education as outlined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-1028.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006731): Deletes all language after the enacting clause and rewrites the bill to: (1) require the Department of Education (DOE) and each public school to educate students in grades K-12 about the ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution and Tennessee's role in guaranteeing all women the right to vote, and on the events of the year immediately preceding August 18, 1920, beginning in the 2019-20 school year; (2) requires the Department of Education (DOE) in collaboration with the State Library and Archives and the Secretary of State to promote and post information on their websites about the centennial of women's suffrage; (3) requires DOE to provide each local education agency and public charter school with internet resources and materials to aid educators and curriculum coordinators in providing instruction on women's suffrage; (4) requires public schools to provide instruction on women's suffrage once per month; and (5) repeals the provisions of the legislation on July 1, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

On April 9, 2019, a fiscal memorandum was issued with the following fiscal impact:

Increase State Expenditures – \$52,000/One-Time

*Increase Local Expenditures – \$970,000/One-Time**

HB 1192 - SB 1248 (CORRECTED)

Based on additional information from the Department of Education and further analysis, this impact was determined to be in error. The corrected fiscal impact is estimated as follows:



- DOE and public schools will be able to comply with proposed legislation within existing resources without a significant increase in expenditures.
- DOE and public schools will be able to amend their policies in accordance with the provisions of this legislation during the normal course of business; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- No significant impact to state or local operations.
