FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 592 - SB 591

April 10, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Changes, from October 1 to September 1, the date by which the Office of Coordinated School Health in the Department of Education (DOE) must provide an annual report to the Education Committees of the House of Representatives and the Education Committee of the Senate. Requires, rather than authorizes, a local education agency (LEA) to implement a coordinated school health program developed by the Commissioner of DOE and in consultation with the Department of Health (DOH).

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (007379): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Requires health and lifetime wellness or other academic standards adopted by the State Board of Education (SBE), in subjects that provide instruction on positive relationships, appropriate refusal skills, healthy dating, sexual activity, or sexuality, to comply with certain requirements. Prohibits the SBE from adopting such standards unless certain student requirements are met. Requires SBE to revise health and wellness and other academic standards relevant to this section to ensure compliance with the requirements of this act.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- SBE and LEAs will be able to comply with the proposed legislation using existing resources without a significant increase in expenditures.
- SBE and LEAs will be able to amend their policies in accordance with the provisions of this legislation during the normal course of business; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- No significant impact to state or local operations.
- No impact to the BEP funding formula.
