FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HJR 133

April 16, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Urges federal government to vigorously enforce federal obscenity laws against internet purveyors of commercialized obscenity, and Congress to readdress the crisis problem of children being exposed to and purposefully accessing internet pornography.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (008191): Deletes and replaces the final three preamble clauses of the resolution. Urges parents and adults to utilize the most effective and affordable tools and resources now available from internet service providers to block access to inappropriate content by children.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- Any increase in state expenditures to prepare and transmit copies of this resolution to the U.S. Attorney General, the Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives, the Majority Leader of the U.S. Senate, and each member of the Tennessee Congressional Delegation will be not significant.
